This Report on the Brushes and Brooms Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing brushes and brooms of all materials, painters' and decorators' brushes and painting rollers, toilet, household, artists' and industrial brushes, household and industrial mops, dressed bristles, hair and fibres.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 493 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production in which it was reported (Part 121).
In this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twentyfive persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
