# THE AERATED WATERS, CIDER, VINEGAR AND BRITISH WINE TRADES

#### INTRODUCTORY

These trades comprise firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the production of table waters, cider, British wines, vinegar, etc.

Additional information having been obtained in regard to output, etc., in 1930, some of the particulars previously published for that year have been revised.
