This Report on the Explosives, Fireworks and Matches Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing explosives, detonators, fuses (not shell fuses), percussion caps, flares, signal rockets, etc, fireworks, matches and live ammunition, and filling bombs, cartridges, shells etc. Establishments making live military ammunition that also make the cases for it are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 279(3) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Explosives and Fireworks Industry (Part 30) (which included establishments that made live military ammunition and also made the cases for it) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 except that cellulose nitrate and matches were shown in the Reports on General Chemicals (Part 27) and Miscellaneous Manufacturing Industries (Part 125) respectively.

Throughout this Report the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms which provided limited information only has been arbitrary.

## METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

In classifying returns to this industry, the standard procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i) was adapted to exclude any firms whose sales of live military ammunition was the major portion of their output if they also made the metal cases. Such returns were classified to the Ordnance and Small Arms Industry (Part 51).

The classification of returns to the sub-divisions of this industry followed the standard procedure.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
