## THE WOOLLEN AND WORSTED TRADE

## INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged solely or mainly in the sorting, blending or scouring of wool and fine animal hair (except horse hair), the manufacture of recovered wool and all intermediate processes up to and including the weaving of woollen and worsted fabrics.

In comparing the results of the Censuses of Production for 1935, 1930 and I924 with those of the Import Duties Act Inquiries of 1934 and 1933, allowance should be made for the exclusion from the Inquiries of wool merchants. These firms purchased wool and sorted, blended, cleaned or scoured it for re-sale, or gave it out to be combed on commission, but did not themselves carry out combing or any subsequent manufacturing process. The general particulars recorded by these firms for I935 and I930 are shown in Table IV (group I3); details of their output in these two years are as follows:-

This grouping is based on the principal kinds of output, measured by value, carried on at each establishment. If a firm was engaged in production of different kinds at separate establishments particulars for production of establishment are included in the group appropriate to the business carried on; for example, carpet manufacturers with separate spinning mills are included in both group (3) and group (2).
The values shown for "characteristic products" represent the selling values of the goods denoted in the first column except for the groups which combine weaving with spinning, where they relate only to the output of the woven goods. For the firms engaged only in spinning output of the wovel goods. "characteristic products" (yarn) woollen yarn the selling values of the "characteristic products (yarn) is not an accurate measurement of the proportion of the total which the group covers, as the bulk of the output of woollen yarn was spun by firms that combined spinning with weaving and included the value of the yarn in that of the woven goods. The quantities of woollen yarn produced by firms that spun yarn but did not weave are shown below in relation to the total quantities of woollen yarn spun; the corresponding figures for worsted yarn are added for comparison.

It may be noted that over 90 per cent. of the total output of woollen yarn was used in the Woollen and Worsted Trade itself but only about 4 I per cent. of the output of worsted yarn. Taking the two classes 4 I per cent. recorded consumption fell short of the total quantity availtogether, the recorlo able by $53 \cdot 6$ million lbs. or II per cent. It seems probable that there
were considerable additions in 1935 to stocks of yarns, though sales were considerable additions in 1935 to stocks of yarns, thoug
for domestic purposes (knitting, etc.) are of some importance.

The total quantity of yarn of mohair, alpaca, cashmere and other hair available for consumption in this country in 1935 was 7.5 million lbs., of which 4.7 million lbs. were purchased and used by firms in the Woollen and Worsted Trade.

Quantity of wool used in 1935.-Table XI A shows the following total amount of virgin wool on a clean scoured basis recorded as purchased and used by all firms that made returns on schedules for the Woollen and Worsted Trade for the year 1935. It is probable that uncertainty as to the correct interpretation of the two headings shown may have led to some over-statement of the aggregate recorded as of United Kingdom origin.

Materials such as mohair, alpaca and other hair are not included in the total.
Sales of sheep's and lambs' wool sorted, scoured, carbonised, etc., in I935 by firms in this trade amounted to about 47 million lbs. (Table V C). This wool may have been sold to other firms in the Woollen and Worsted Trade and thus be duplicated in the total purchases or may have been exported. In either case it should not be included in the estimated quantity of wool used for manufacturing purposes in the Woollen and Worsted Trade which may thus be stated for 1935 as approximately 485 million lbs.
The weight of tops (on a dry combed basis) produced from wool in 1935 (i.e. excluding tops of mohair, alpaca, etc.), was about 282 million lbs. Adding the output of noils ( 34 million lbs., after making allowance for the oil content) and the estimated clean weight of waste produced in the combing processes ( 8 million lbs.), the total quantity of clean raw wool required for top making in I935 was about 324 million lbs., leaving about 160 million lbs. for the spinning of carded woollen yarn.
Particulars corresponding to the above are not available for earlier years.

Firms were required to state the quantity and value of their sales of waste but, as large quantities of waste are used in the works in which it is produced, the amount sold falls short of the total production. The goods to which this table relates are those specified in Table V C as principal products of the Woollen and Worsted Trade. The figures shown against the second heading include estimates of the selling value of fabrics made on commission which are assumed to have been made to the order of merchants and thus not duplicated in the total for goods recorded by selling value.

The Woollen and Worsted Trade.-The value of the gross output in I935 of firms making returns on schedules for the Woollen and Worsted Trade was $f_{\mathrm{I}} \mathrm{I} 29,7 \mathrm{I} 6,000$. An estimate of the total output of these firms
free from duplication may be arrived at by using the figures shown against the first and third headings in the previous table, and by adjusting the figure against the second heading to cover only fabrics and other finished products returned on schedules for the Woollen and Worsted Trade (including products not of wool), goods made on commission being valued at the amount received for making them instead of at their estimated selling value. On this basis the total value of the output of the trade free from duplication in 1935 amounted to approximately £94 mill., indicating that inter-sales of goods between firms in the trade amounted in value to roughly $£ 36$ mill. It may be noted that a calculation based on the recorded particulars of semi-manufactured products purchased and used in I035 (see Table XI A) leads to a similar result if an allowance is made for purchases of noils and other relatively minor items for which separate particulars were not recorded.
The value of the output of firms in the Woollen and Worsted Trade, free from duplication, was estimated as about $£ 83$ million for 1930 and as about £I4I million for 1924. For the reason stated in the introductory note (page 6I) comparable totals cannot be estimated for 1933 or 1934.
