PLASTIC GOODS AND FANCY ARTICLES TRADE THIS REPORT on the Plastic Goods and Fancy Articles Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in
the manufacture of electrical and mechanical components from plastic materials, hard haberdashery (except metal), smokers requisites, lampshades (except glass), toilet requisites and other fancy articles (except leather). The manufacture of complete accessories and fittings wholly or partly of plasti matectrical Engineering, Radio and Telecommunication, Scienti fic, Surgical and Photographic Instruments and Watch and Clock Trades is, so far as has been found practicable, excluded. Establishments specialising in the manufacture of lampshades other than of glass were not covered by the 1937 Inquiry: Table I gives as well as full totals for 1935, figures for the 1937 Inquiry.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 199(1) and part of 199(3) in the Standard Industrial Classiffication.

Any establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948. Owing to the risk of disclosure of information relating to individual firms, separate particulars of the very small output in Northern Ireland were not published for
1935.
