THIS REPORT on the Canvas Goods and Sacks Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in making-up canvas goods and in the manufacture and repair of sacks and bags Particulars engaged in 1937 and did not make separate establishment returns in 1935 . the net output and employment shown for 1935 is deficient on this account by about ten per cent of the total for the trade

The 1937 particulars also exclude establishments engaged solely in the repair and reconditioning of purchased sacks, these establishments being outside the scope of the 1937 Inquiry.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 122 (1) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Particulars available in respect of H.M. prisons are given separately in footnote (b) to Table 1.
