This Report on the Bread and Flour Confectionery Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in making bread, cakes, pastries, pies (other than meat pies), puddings (other than meat or canned puddings), etc. Production at small bakehouses (ie bakehouses with fewer than 25 employees) attached to bakers' shops is excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 212 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 8).

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
