SIR,—I do myself the honour to transmit for the information of Parliament the Annual Report on the administration of the Department of Public Education.

2. The stir in school-life, the awakening of public interest in the cause of popular education, and the growing sense of the importance of the measures for its diffusion and improvement, are largely due to the inquiries of the Synod of the Dutch Reformed Church into the educational wants of its adherents; and the various suggestions and resolutions emanating from that body have commanded general attention.

3. It seems therefore desirable to write a clear record of what the system of Public Education now is.

SCHOOL SYSTEM: WHAT IT IS.

4. The colonial population, if the less important features of racial distinctions are left out, comprises two groups—(1) the colonists of European descent, (2) the coloured races.

5. The instruction of the children of the former group is provided for by a graded series of Undenominational Public Schools under local managers, District Boarding Schools among the agricultural and pastoral population and private farm schools are subsidiary to the Public Schools; and Circuit or itinerating teachers are employed to instruct the children of the poorer farmers in the thinly-peopled districts, at centres where a reasonable number of children can be got together for a time.

6. The cope-stone of the system is the University of the Cape of Good Hope with the Colleges aided by grants under the Higher Education Act.

7. By the course of instruction as laid down in Parliamentary regulations for the Public Schools, and by the requirements of the University for Matriculation and for Degrees in Arts, a fair standard of attainments is set up.

Such a standard of instruction is of course in its range and character beyond the needs of the coloured races. For this populous group with its subdivisions of (a) people of mixed races, and (b) aborigines, other provision is made. Elementary instruction is provided through the agency of schools connected with Missionary Societies. The training of Native girls in domestic industries, and of Native boys in the workshop are adjuncts to the school-instruction.

8. The Education Department thus tries to co-operate with the various sections of the community in providing the kind and degree of instruction sought by each.

9. The objects for which grants are made from the Public Treasury are :—
- (1) The University; for general expenses and bursaries.
 - (2) The Colleges which offer facilities to students reading for Degrees; for part salaries of Professors and Lecturers.
 - (3) The half salaries of Principals and Assistants in the Public Schools and District Boarding Schools.
 - (4) Capitation allowances on attendance and on attainments of pupils in Private Farm Schools; and also for indigent boarders.
 - (5) Trade-classes connected with schools.
 - (6) Mission Schools; for part salaries of teachers.
 - (7) Aborigines' Institutions and Day Schools; for part salaries of teachers; also of trade-schoolmasters and sewing mistresses; and capitation allowances for natives resident in Institutions and learning trades.
 - (8) In aid of the equipment of Colleges and of schools generally with scientific apparatus, furniture, maps, books, and sewing materials.
 - (9) In aid of buildings for Undenominational Public Schools.
 - (10) Normal Colleges and practising schools; and day-school training of elementary teachers.
 - (11) Art-Schools.
 - (12) Good service allowances to teachers of five years' standing and upwards, whose schools are thoroughly efficient as regards the tone, discipline, and standard of attainments.

STATE EXPENDITURE.

10. The State expenditure for the financial year which ended on 30th June, 1890, was £129,351 8s. 9d.

10A. The expenditure as compiled from Returns furnished by the Managers amounted to £116,288 10s. 3d.

NUMBER OF SCHOOLS AND ENROLMENT.

11. The schools and institutions in actual operation during some portion of the year numbered 1,595; of these 237 were new schools; 117 schools were closed for part of the year.

12. The annual enrolment of scholars to 30th June was 99,523; the highest quarterly enrolment was 74,132; and the average daily attendance was 53,978. The daily attendance had risen to 57,852 during the quarter ended 30th September.

INSPECTION OF PRIVATE FARM SCHOOLS AND CIRCUIT SCHOOLS.

15. I am much indebted to the teachers of public schools who undertake the inspection of the private farm schools situated within their districts. The public schoolmaster is thus brought into contact with the farmers and tutors or governesses; and his advice is eagerly sought as to the supply of suitable school materials, maps, &c.

In many of these schools the standards of attainments and accommodation

are very satisfactory; in others, the appliances are as rude as the accommodation, and the instruction is poor.

20. COST OF EDUCATION.

Omitting expenses of general administration and inspection and special grants for buildings, the average cost of each scholar in daily attendance for the year was £3 16s. 5½d., of which amount the Government paid £1 13s. 4½d., and local managers and parents £2 3s. 1d. in salaries, fees, and maintenance.

INSPECTORATE.

21. The Government has lost a very able and trustworthy officer by the death of Mr. John Samuel, one of the Deputy-Inspectors of Schools; his place will be filled from January, 1891, by the Rev. D. D. Fraser, who has been Headmaster of the First Class Public School at Bedford for the last seventeen years.

22. It has so often been repeated in Parliament and elsewhere that the Inspectors of Schools are not qualified to examine in the Dutch language that I put here on record that four of the staff are thoroughly qualified in Dutch, viz., Messrs. Rowan, Ely, C. Murray and Nixon; and other inspectors have a grammatical knowledge of the language.

23. In the Eastern districts and the Native Territories, the knowledge of Kafir and ability to examine scholars in that language are required of the inspectors there employed.

24. The vast extent of territory to be traversed, the heavy floods at certain seasons and unavoidable detentions from other causes, render it difficult to overtake the annual inspection of every school.

25. The full staff consists of eight inspectors, of whom two are chiefly employed in the Transkei, Tembuland and East Griqualand.

26. The trying nature of the duties, constant travelling, exposure to extremes of heat and cold, and the detentions from heavy summer rains in some regions, render it necessary to have an additional inspector to meet cases of emergency; otherwise many schools must be left unvisited.

RACE AND COLOUR.

27. From the returns furnished by the teachers it appears that 38,294 are children of European parentage, and 58,814 are of African parentage, being either Aborigines (Kafirs, Fingoes, &c.), or of mixed races; 2,415 are not classified in regard to race.

28. It appears that 10,184 white or European children attend the Mission Schools; these are mostly the children of the poorer class of white people living in the more populous towns and villages.

29. The Fourth Class Public Schools are proposed so as to withdraw these children from the Mission Schools, which were intended for the children of coloured races. It is very undesirable that the white children, especially girls, should be brought daily into close relations with the ordinary type of the coloured street boy.

COLLEGES—STATISTICS.

30. The return of Professorships and Lectureships in the four State-aided Colleges under Act 24 of 1874, with the operations of each department of study is given in accordance with the provisions of the Act. The State expenditure for the year amounted to £5,112 10s.

COLLEGES UNDER THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACT.

31. The Trustees of the Gill College, Somerset East, have renewed their application to have the College recognized again as a State-aided institution in connection with the University course in Arts.

32. The endowment, which is the bequest of the late Dr. Gill, produces about £1,000 per annum, which is to be appropriated to the maintenance of an Institution conducted, as far as possible, on the lines of the Glasgow College. For some years the Trustees have worked with this Department in establishing and maintaining an Undenominational Public School of the First Class; out of this has been gradually evolved a Department of Arts.

33. It is proposed now to divide the Institution into College and Public School, so that the Gill Endowment may be utilized as originally intended.

34. So long as an efficient Public School is maintained, the wants of the immediate district will be met; and, apart from the advantages of the specific endowment, Somerset is an eligible centre which may become the *rendezvous* of Midland students for advanced education.

35. The University will be best served by the maintenance of a Faculty of Arts at a few approved centres throughout the Colony. I am not at present anxious to extend the number of these Faculties; but the claims of the Gill College, from its position and the provisions of the Gill Endowment, are great enough to overrule general objections.

SCHOOL OF MINES.

36. For some time students have been preparing themselves in the preliminary subjects in Mathematics and Analytical Chemistry so as to enter on the course of Mining Engineering, as soon as the School of Mines is opened. There are twelve now ready for this course; two have entered the School of Mines in London.

37. Since 1887, the Chemistry of Metallurgy and of Assaying has been practically taught at the Laboratory of the South African College; during the last year 22 students attended this course. A sketch of the curriculum in the proposed South African School of Mines has been furnished by Professor P. D. Hahn, M.A. and Ph. Doct.; and Mr. Gustav Duft, M.E. This will be found in the Appendix.

MEDICAL STUDIES.

38. If a Bill to regulate the admission of medical practitioners is introduced at the next Session of Parliament, it would be the right time to provide for a wider and severer examination of candidates who apply for the licence to practice as Chemists and Druggists. The profession now numbers 256 practitioners.

39. Dr. Marloth, Professor of Chemistry in the Victoria College, himself an experienced dispenser, has had for the last two years a class in which the necessary subjects for a certificate of qualification in Pharmacy are taught. The class meets at a convenient hour, in Cape Town; but the attendance at present is only 5.

A TEACHING UNIVERSITY.

40. The frequent reference to the need of a Teaching University calls for some remark.

41. The University of the Cape of Good Hope was incorporated by Act 16 of 1873, and enjoys a Royal Charter under the Queen's Letters Patent, dated 8th August, 1877, whereby the Degrees of the University are recognized throughout the Empire as fully as if they had been conferred by any University of the United Kingdom.

42. The Higher Education Act, No. 24 of 1874, empowered the Government to make grants in aid of salaries of Professors and Lecturers in such Colleges as afford facilities to students to qualify themselves for the examinations prescribed by the University for degrees in certain faculties.

43. The four Colleges thus recognized and aided in connection with the University are :—

The South African College, Cape Town,
The Victoria College, Stellenbosch,
The Diocesan College, Rondebosch,
and The St. Andrew's College, Graham's Town.

44. In this respect the University of the Cape of Good Hope corresponds to the idea of such Modern Universities, as the Victoria University, which embraces three "teaching" colleges, viz., Owens College, Manchester; University College, Liverpool; and the Yorkshire College, Leeds; and as the Catholic University of Ireland which, since the re-organization of 1882, consists of eight "teaching" Institutions, viz., St. Patrick's College, *Maynooth*; St. Patrick's College, *Carlow*; University College and Medical School, *Dublin*; French College, *Blackrock*; Holycross College, *Clonliffe*; College, *Kilkenny*; College, *Terenure*.

45. The ancient Universities of Oxford and Cambridge consist each of a commonwealth of Colleges and Halls, in number 26 and 21 respectively. The bulk of the teaching is done by the College tutors. The University regulates the course of examinations and gives degrees. The difference between these and the modern Universities is that, in the latter, colleges situated in various towns are recognized as constituents of the commonwealth. In both, the University and its Colleges are the complement, the one of the other.

46. The Scotch Universities combine teaching and examining functions under what is known as the professorial system, and thus distinguished from the collegiate or tutorial system of Oxford and Cambridge.

47. It must be admitted that although Faculties of Arts may be advantageously maintained in this country at a few of the principal centres of population, the machinery for the full development of schools for medicine and surgery, engineering, mining, and other practical applications of science to the industrial arts is so costly that the appliances of such schools cannot be provided in more than one place in the Colony. There must therefore be one University College, *par excellence*, fully equipped with all the appliances for theoretical and practical teaching, in direct connection with the University; and this Institution should also comprise a residential College for students.

WANT OF TEACHERS.

48. The supply of elementary teachers is altogether inadequate to meet the demand, as previously reported; the deficiency is largely due to the withdrawal of Cape certificated teachers for employment in the neighbouring States. It may be complimentary to this Department to have the value of the Cape certificates thus recognised; it is a very practical but inconvenient illustration of the Virgilian complaint :—*Sic vos non vobis mellificatis apes.*

49. I have discouraged the extension of the expensive system of residential colleges for training teachers; about 30 young men reside in the Normal College, Cape Town, for training; and there is a department at Wellington connected with the Girls' Public School, known as the Huguenot Seminary, for training young women as teachers; but the Colony depends mainly for its supply on the day-school training of pupil-teachers, which is both inexpensive and fairly efficient. There is, however, no more than a moral obligation at present on the trained candidates to become teachers; but, as a rule, the majority take up the business of teaching for a reasonable period.

50. The system of day-school training must be at once enlarged. I have used the discretionary powers entrusted to me in attaching a small staff of pupil-teachers to each of the following schools, viz.:—

Rhenish Institute for Girls, Stellenbosch.
All Saints Girls' School, Wynberg.

St. Cyprian's Girls' School, Cape Town.

These Institutions have exceptional facilities for training, and only by the extension of this plan to all first-class schools for boys and girls, that offer such facilities, can I hope to keep up a fair supply to fill vacancies, as governesses in Private Farm Schools, and assistants for the Undenominational Schools of various grades.

It is gratifying to find that daughters of the higher class of colonial families are induced to devote themselves to the work of education.

52. It is understood that pupil-teachers are not employed in superior schools as assistants: the school must have a full staff of qualified assistants before pupil-teachers can be attached to it.

53. In the various parts of the Colony the requirements vary. In the Western, Midland, and Northern districts generally, teachers competent to give instruction both in English and Dutch are usually wanted; in the Eastern districts hitherto there has been no great demand for instruction in the Dutch language: teachers amongst the aborigines are expected to be qualified to give instruction in Kafir.

In some schools among the Germans, the qualification of speaking and writing the German language is indispensable to success in teaching.

54. It is quite clear that the Colony cannot keep up a sufficient supply of schoolmasters; young men are disinclined to devote themselves to the business of teaching, and the Department must introduce qualified schoolmasters, at all events for the higher posts, from Europe. The supply of school-mistresses may be rendered fairly adequate to the ordinary demand; but trained school-mistresses from Europe are required for the more responsible posts of Principals and Method-mistresses.

55. The authorities of the Dutch Reformed Church have signified their readiness to co-operate in the extension of day-school training of elementary teachers throughout the Colony, at suitable centres to be chosen by the Department; and where a staff of 15 pupil-teachers is trained in connection with an approved day-school, a Method-master for boys, and a Method-mistress for girls, as the case may be, will be attached to the school.

56. Grants in aid of the passage expenses of teachers specially introduced from Europe have been authorized during the year, viz.:—

STUDY OF THE DUTCH LANGUAGE.

57. In regard to the Dutch language it has always been my practice to encourage the simultaneous study of Dutch and English by translation and re-translation, and by oral explanations to children in their own language.

NOTE.—Mr. W. A. Russell, M.A., Principal of the South African College School; Miss E. Morton, Principal of the Girls' Public School (Good Hope Seminary), and Miss Lewis, B.A., first Assistant in the Girls' Public School (Riebeek College), have arrived since the closing of this Report.

The daily programme of schools among the Dutch-speaking population is usually arranged thus:—

Bible instruction and religious exercises, in the Dutch language.
 Arithmetic
 Geography } in English, with oral explanation in Dutch, where
 History, &c. } necessary.
 English reading, and translation into Dutch.
 Dutch reading, and translation into English.

58. There was, and perhaps is still a tendency among parents to object to their children's time being given up to the study of Dutch, on the ground that the children hear Dutch spoken at home, and have a practical knowledge of the language; but without a proper study of Dutch in the school-room it is plain that many Dutch-speaking children would acquire no real knowledge of any one language.

59. The study of the two languages together, colloquial and written, is the only effectual way; and the fact that more than 20,000 children do thus learn the Dutch language is sufficient evidence that the encouragement given to that study by this Department is now fully appreciated.

60. On my first visit to an established Government school in the year 1859, I was confronted at the entrance by a notice, "It is forbidden to speak Dutch." I need not say that such prohibition has not been enforced since that date.

61. My experience is that questions of this nature are best left to the local managers and to the parents whose interests they represent. Any attempt to define by law how far English or how far Dutch is to be the medium of instruction must fail; and as the schools are managed by those who voluntarily come forward because of their interest and zeal in the cause, I am disposed to leave the matter in their hands. If at any time school-rates should be levied, and the managers have to be elected by the ratepayers, an element will be introduced into the system which may make the interests of the ratepayer, not of the children, paramount; and legislation on this and many other points of detail may then become necessary.

62. The whole subject of instruction in the Dutch language has been thoroughly discussed both by the Taal Congress and by the Synod of the Dutch Reformed Church, and the resolutions of the respective bodies have been submitted to this Department and to the University Council.

63. A special Commission of Inquiry into this vexed question of the medium of instruction in elementary schools is to be appointed by the Government.

64. The movers in this matter appear to have been entirely ignorant of the arrangements made in schools for the instruction of the children, and the large number of scholars actually learning both Dutch and English is no doubt to them incredible, but the figures are given by the teachers in their ordinary official returns of attendance, and are trustworthy.

65. The following remarks extracted from Mr. Rowan's special report on the study of the Dutch language (October 14th, 1890), are here given:—

* * * * *

"For the sake of comparison I would first of all draw attention to the remarks which I had occasion to make on the same subject in my Special Reports for 1882, 1885, 1888.

"I. Extract from Special Report for 1882 under the head of Modern Languages:—

"Three thousand nine hundred and four pupils were presented for examination in Dutch at last inspection, fifty-two in French, and fifty-one in German. Of late Dutch has received more attention than before, and a better class of text-books has been introduced. In the country parts there is a growing desire to have teachers who understand both Dutch and English. Unfortunately, the supply is not equal to the demand."

"My circuit then embraced the Cape, Stellenbosch, Paarl, Malmesbury, Piquetberg, Tulbagh, and Worcester divisions. The number present at inspection was 10,740. About 36 per cent., therefore, would be learning Dutch.

"II. Extract from Special Report for 1885, under the heading of Dutch Language:—'Dutch is extensively taught in my district, and few, if any, difficulties arising from the two languages (Dutch and English) have, as far as I know, been experienced. In a few schools, such as the South African College School, Normal College, Stellenbosch Boys', Stellenbosch Girls', Paarl Girls', Huguenot Seminary, Worcester Girls', and Worcester Boys', special Dutch teachers have been employed, but in all the others instruction in Dutch is given by the head teachers, or their assistants, or by both. The only difficulty is when Dutch is taken up by a limited number of pupils from several classes. In such cases the teachers are often at a loss how to classify the pupils for Dutch, and at the same time to find employment for those who do not take up that language, without unduly interfering with the general course of instruction. During the year 104 schools presented pupils for examination in Dutch. In all the Undenominational Schools (excepting 6 in the Cape Division) provision has been made for teaching Dutch. Of the Denominational Schools those in connection with the Roman Catholic and English Churches (with six exceptions in the case of the latter) do not teach Dutch; in all the others Dutch is taught along with English. The reading, spelling, dictation, grammar, and translation in most of them are very creditable. Dutch composition is taken up by several schools, and with fair results.'

"The divisions then included in my circuit were Cape, Simon's Town, Stellenbosch, Paarl, Malmesbury, Tulbagh, Worcester, Robertson, Piquetberg, Clanwilliam, and Namaqualand. The number of schools inspected was 166.

"III. Extract from Special Report for 1888 under the heading of Dutch Language:—'In my district the Dutch element is very strong, and there are few schools in which the study of the Dutch language does not form an integral part of the school curriculum. The subjects usually taught are reading, with explanation of the subject matter, dictation, grammar, translation, and composition. Of late an increased attention has been paid to Dutch in schools where formerly it had been all but neglected. In most of the schools the usual English reading lesson is translated into Dutch and *vice versa*. When a pupil cannot give the meaning of a word occurring in his English reading lesson he is allowed to explain it in Dutch, and if he does so successfully there is fair ground for supposing that he understands what he is reading about. The Civil Service Examination, in which Dutch is now one of the compulsory subjects, has afforded an additional stimulus to the study of that language in schools where hitherto it has been left out. The Dutch language has now a fair and open field, and although real idiomatic Dutch will not, as a rule, be correctly spoken in the Colony, a compromise will be effected, and it is not improbable that in the course of a few generations a language may arise less inflectional and more musical than the language of Holland.'

66. As the Special Reports are triennial, the above remarks may be said to cover a period of nine years. Most, if not all, of them are still applicable, but in a greater degree. The increased demand for instruction in Dutch has been met by increased facilities for acquiring a knowledge of that language. The managers of the Undenominational Schools have made great sacrifices, often out of their own limited means, to obtain teachers competent to give instruction in both languages, and the Education Department has always been ready to second their efforts in a generous manner. In my district there is not a single Undenominational School in which Dutch is not taught side by side with English. The classification for Dutch and English runs

parallel, as nearly as possible, in the majority of the schools. In several of them the religious instruction is given in Dutch, and the devotions at the opening and close of the school are in the same language.

67. My present district embraces Stellenbosch, Paarl, Malmesbury, Piquetberg, and a few schools in the Cape and Tulbagh divisions, and during the year 1889 I inspected 132 schools of all classes. There were present at inspection 7,431 pupils, and of these 4,989, or about 67 per cent. were learning Dutch. In the six months ending June 30, 1890, I inspected 57 schools with 3,979 pupils present at inspection, of whom 2,619 or 66 per cent., were receiving instruction in Dutch. In most of the Infant schools English reading books are first used, as teachers are of opinion that unless children begin English when very young they never acquire a correct pronunciation of that language. But even in infant schools Dutch is very frequently used to explain the oral and other lessons. If the infants are also counted, the percentage of those learning Dutch will be considerably augmented.

* * *

ABORIGINES.

68. There has been no great extension of native schools, but the attendance has increased, and the accommodation, furniture, and standard of work are decidedly improved.

69. Whatever increase of expenditure has been incurred is due to the provision for more frequent and efficient inspection, for school materials, and for aid to the Undenominational Public Schools among the white people in the territories beyond the Kei, which now amounts to £1,000 per annum. The scholars are the children of traders and immigrant Dutch-speaking farmers, especially in the Cala district.

70. No little difficulty has been experienced lately by the Missionary Superintendents of Aborigines' Schools in getting the headmen to pay the local contribution of £10 per annum, agreed upon as the basis of Government aid towards a teacher's salary. The agreement in future must be a public one, and should be made at a general meeting of the men of a location; and a written document should set forth the amount of local contribution; and the headman and others should be called upon, in the presence of competent witnesses, to sign the deed of agreement.

SCHOOL VERSUS LABOUR-MARKET.

71. It was stated in a Parliamentary document (Report of Select Committee on the Labour Question, August, 1890), during last session that detention at school kept many coloured lads from harvest work; it was evidently not known to the compilers that it has been for many years past the practice of the missionary bodies at Genadendaal, Berea, Elim, Mamre, Wittewater, Goedverwacht, Saron, and other large centres of the coloured population, to close their schools at the beginning of harvest, usually in October, throughout the Western districts, and, with the consent of this Department, not to resume school-work until after the completion of the wheat harvest.

72. The withdrawal from school of the sons of farmers as well as of the coloured lads at the ploughing season is also pretty general; but as the ploughing is naturally dependent on the rain-fall, no fixed time can be agreed upon for closing schools. Therefore the recommendation of the Select Committee that the Government should exercise whatever power it may have over the authorities of the mission schools to arrange periods of vacation corresponding with the seasons when the labour of the boys is urgently required, seems unnecessary; but it is thought advisable to notify to the missionary

superintendents that every facility should be given to the elder boys to undertake field labour at such times as the main industry, whatever it may be, of each district may require.

DEFECTS.

73. Some educational authorities will always condemn the colonial system because it is not an imitation of a British or German or other old-country code; but the circumstances of South Africa admit of no slavish adherence to the lines of European plans of education. South Africa is unique as regards the varieties of race, European and aboriginal, the habits, religious traditions, and idiosyncrasies of the respective constituencies.

74. No rigid code will promote the education of the children of the South African boer; the regulations must be elastic, the hand and voice of the administrator must lead, not command; by judicious tact children may be won for schooling; by arbitrary official rules parents will be deterred and the children will suffer.

75. With this conviction the private farm schools, the circuit schools, and the boarding schools, with capitation allowances in aid of indigent boarders, have been promoted, and it is gratifying to find that the farmers generally are anxious to co-operate with the Department.

76. Of course, in many districts little or no progress could be made without the sympathy and personal interest of the ministers of the Dutch Reformed Church.

77. To a minister of that church I am indebted for the suggestion of a plan to get the children of bijwoners to attend school, by the offer to the managers of a farm or Third-class School of a capitation fee of £1 per annum for every such child admitted as a free scholar beyond the number in daily attendance required as a condition of the Government grant. The total number thus admitted must of course be kept within the capacity of the teacher and the school accommodation.

78. It has been a defect in the agencies hitherto employed that no provision was made for the children of those nomad farmers who move hither and thither with their families and their flocks to more favoured spots, according to the rainfall and the season. It is proposed to give an outfit for an itinerant teacher who will accompany the farmers as they trek; he will be furnished with two tents, one to live in, the other to be the school room; a few planks put on trestles will be the school furniture; the outfit, including books &c., is estimated at £25. The teacher will be employed in the Achterveld, in the northern parts of the district of Calvinia, under the supervision of the Rev. J. C. Truter.

79. It is generally calculated that school accommodation should be provided for one-sixth of the total population; what is the exact number of each section of the population—European, mixed and Aborigines, may possibly be arrived at by the Census of 1891. The approximate estimate of the white or European population is 350,000; and it may be inferred that about 58,000 children ought to be at school.

80. There are nearly 40,000 children of European (white) race attending the schools connected with the Department of Public Education; and if account be taken of the High Schools for Girls, Convent Schools, Church Grammar Schools and the many private adventure schools, especially in the larger towns, it must be estimated that at least 10,000 attend these unaided schools.

81. There is then a residuum of some 8,000 white children of school-going age not accounted for.

82. The next census, April, 1891, will probably settle definitely the number of white children not attending any school.

TEACHERS' CERTIFICATES.

83. The examination of candidates for certificates of qualification for employment as elementary teachers began in April, 1873, when 9 candidates were approved; the annual number of candidates now reaches about 400, and it is gratifying to notice the excellent papers in School Management, Object Lessons and School Drill, furnished by the young women trained in the First Class Public Schools for Girls; practical skill is tested by giving instruction to classes in the presence of the Inspectors of Schools.

84. The work done by the young men is inferior to that of the women in composition, spelling, and style; and it is plain that the elementary education of the colonial youth will have to be largely entrusted to women.

85. Even in the schools among the aborigines, young native women are qualifying themselves for posts as elementary teachers as well as for sewing-mistresses. The Girls' Industrial Schools at Lovedale, Shawbury, Butterworth, &c., are helping on this movement, which is likely to solve the difficulty now arising from the restlessness and fickleness of native school-masters.

86. A wholesome competition may deter schoolmasters, to some extent, from quarrelling with their means of earning a decent living. As native schools are kept usually four hours daily, 9 to 1, the duties are certainly not laborious. School-mistresses take the ordinary classes in the morning and the sewing class in the afternoon.

87. It will be noticed in the lists of those who have won certificates as elementary teachers that many candidates are sent from private schools. The examination is open unreservedly to all who comply with the conditions as to training, age, and general attainments.

88. The examination of candidates for the Middle-Class Teachers' Certificates was held in Cape Town in June. 21 candidates appeared; of these 17 obtained certificates of competency, 3 certificates with honours.

89. The examination for Third-Class Teachers' Certificates was held at 37 centres on 30th September and two following days. Of 398 who were registered, 377 appeared for examination; the results were as follows:—

3	" honours, English and Kafir.
45	" competency "
6	English and Sesuto.

71 candidates who had previously obtained the Public Schools Certificate, or had passed the School Higher Examination, qualified themselves in the supplementary subjects for the Teachers' Examination and obtained certificates.

90. 25 candidates obtained provisional certificates (English and Kafir or Sesuto), which hold good for two years, at the expiration of which the holders are required to present themselves for a further test of their qualifications.

TRUSTS.

91. The conditions of the trusts of the Civil Service Bursary Fund and of the Levy Gift Fund were given at length in my report for 1888.

92. The capital sum of the two funds, £200 and £105 respectively, was lodged in the Cape of Good Hope Bank as a fixed deposit at £4 per cent. at the time of its failure. Some diminution of capital is inevitable.

ART CERTIFICATES.

93. The initiation of the proposed examination of candidates for certificates of qualification as teachers of free-hand drawing has been necessarily postponed, until free-hand drawing has been recognized by Parliamentary rules as part of the ordinary course in the Fourth Class Public Schools in towns.

COMPLAINTS AND SUGGESTIONS.

94. Many complaints and suggestions have reached me during the latter part of the year which require special notice.

95. One complaint is that the Department does not pay the half expenses of Public Schools, except so far as regards salaries of principals and assistants. The managers are required by law to provide accommodation for the school and a residence for the principal without Government aid.

96. My reply is that the Government has been liberal in making special grants to reduce the debts on school buildings and to provide accommodation for boarders and teachers; and further, good service allowances are made to teachers, and prospective pensions are provided for without any demand on the local managers of schools.

97. Trade classes are at present attached only to District Boarding Schools and Undenominational Public Schools with which Boarding Departments are connected. It is requested that the privilege should be extended to all Public Day Schools. The grant is £50 per annum for a trade-class, which in boys' schools generally means a carpenter's shop, frequented three hours weekly by the senior boys; in girls' schools a professional dressmaker is employed to train the senior girls in cutting out and other practical work.

98. I have hitherto had little encouragement to extend this important adjunct to the Public School, but if there is a genuine demand it ought to be met.

99. The list of trade classes, with the number of pupils, is as follows:—

REMARKS ON TEACHING.

100. The classification of the scholars under standards is necessary for the purposes of inspection and of comparison; the salaries of the teachers are not differentiated from year to year by the greater or less success of the inspector's test, and the examination is not confined to the Elementary Standard subjects, but extends to other and advanced branches of instruction, viz., vocal music, drill, free-hand drawing, as well as the lessons in natural science, elementary mathematics and languages.

101. There are several features of a good school which at once strike the attention of an experienced inspector, and his report is specially invited on the general efficiency of the school, the discipline, tone, manners and appearance of the scholars; and teachers understand that a good report on this aspect of a school covers many shortcomings in the mechanical results of the ordinary examination.

102. As much freedom as possible is given to the teacher within the limits of the course of instruction as prescribed by the Parliamentary regulations for each class of school.

103. More attention in elementary schools should be given to Object Lessons; to clear enunciation by frequent recital of choice and simple passages in prose and verse; to handwriting suited for commercial purposes, clear, bold, and not spoilt by flourishes and thick down strokes. The sing-song tone of the reading lessons in Mission Schools should be discouraged.

104. Learning by rote the stereotyped rules of grammar has long been discountenanced, but columns of spelling still survive in some places where the teachers have not realized that spelling is taught by the eye not by the ear. Experienced teachers rely on the careful transcription of passages from the reading-book.

105. The composition of a letter both for general and for business correspondence ought to be more generally practised; the usual form of beginning and closing a letter, and the full postal address are often neglected even by those who are official correspondents with this Department. Many a reply is delayed by the writer giving only Rietfontein, Rietvlei, Spitzkop, Welgelegen, &c., without the addition of the Post Office, or the name of the district. The scholars might also with advantage prepare concise messages as for telegraphic use.

106. These are details which to some teachers may appear superfluous; but the success of a school depends much on the observance of details, and the real teacher of to-day only fulfils the duty of his profession when he keeps himself abreast of the best methods for the prevention and cure of faults and for cultivating powers of observation. The intelligence of the scholars reflects the intelligence of the teacher.

107. Teachers are by no means encouraged to experimentalize on their scholars by adopting every ingenious theory put forth in the countless treatises on education.

108. Pedagogy, in its various branches, is a subject that the teacher cannot ignore; but common sense and a thorough knowledge of child-nature combined, with an honest conviction of what is his duty to the children and to the State, will keep him from going wrong.

109. What we expect from the elementary teachers is that they will make their scholars acquainted with the more prominent facts and laws of nature; and, besides training the children to read, write, and cipher, will cultivate their intelligence. Beyond the direction of mere realistic studies teachers may do much to secure habits of order, accuracy and truthfulness among the pupils, to awaken and cherish the love of home and country; and all this they may do so as to lead up to virtue and godliness—the higher life—where the functions of the teacher of religion come in.

110. The great evil of our time is the multiplicity of subjects introduced into the ordinary course of schools; pupils learn a little of everything and nothing thoroughly. Reform must come by the way of simplicity in the course, in the methods, and in the aims of Education.

111. During the session of the Synod, inquiry was made as to the legitimate place of Bible history in schools. I consider that study as part of the historical course, and not to be confused with instruction in religion.

112. It is desirable that the outlines of General History should be taught in all the superior schools; and whilst some attention must needs be directed to what is usually known as Sacred History, I should like to see

the poetical and philosophical aspects of the Bible itself rendered more familiar to the scholars. There are probably no more beautiful *morceaux* of poetry to be found than in the Book of Psalms; or of poetical imagery in prose than in selected passages of the Hebrew prophets; and there is no more terse compendium of moral duty than in the Sermon on the Mount and the Parables of the New Testament.

113. In this country, the Bible as a great factor in education is generally recognized, yet I doubt if the scholars realize the beauty and grandeur of its language, and feel the efficacy of its teaching, in the way which Mr. Matthew Arnold in his special report in 1868 appeared to aim at. Writing of what he saw in Germany, he says:—"Even in the lowest classes the children in a German Protestant School begin learning verses of the Psalms by heart; and by the time a scholar reaches the top of the school he knows by heart a number of the finest passages from the Psalms and from the prophetic and historical books of the Old Testament, and nearly all the principal Gospel discourses and parables of the New. These have become a part of the stock of his mind, and he has them for life."

SYNOD AND TAAL CONGRESS.

114. To the *suggestions of the Taal Congress and of the Synod of the Dutch Reformed Church the following reply was sent:—

- (a). As regards the language in which the younger children should receive instruction this Department does not interfere; the matter rests with the managers and the people whose interests they represent.
At present schools are conducted through the medium of
(a) English; (b) English and Dutch; (c) Dutch only; (d) German and English; (e) English and Kafir; (f) Kafir only.
- (b). There is no objection to accept qualifications of teachers in English or Dutch, or in both languages.
- (c). As early as possible, the requirements of Standards V and VI will be assimilated as regards the Dutch language.
- (d). Of the staff of inspectors, four are thoroughly competent to examine in both English and Dutch, and two others have a scholarly acquaintance with Dutch.
- (e). Papers in the Dutch language may be written in Dutch, if it is found by experience that candidates are not thus discouraged from presenting themselves for examination in that language. The Department has found it necessary to bring the Dutch papers within the average capacity of candidates, and to avoid technical and linguistic questions.
- (f). As to the alteration of the Education Act, by the removal of certain words in the regulations for Mission Schools, "through the medium of the English language as far as possible," I think the clause is elastic enough, and since 1841, when the original minute was issued, no difficulty has arisen.

MANAGEMENT OF UNDENOMINATIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

115. The engagement between the managers and the Department is by law restricted to a period of three years. There is no provision for the continuous management of the schools, and the appointment of a new committee and the renewal of arrangements for aid every three years place the teachers in some difficulty and uncertainty. It is desirable to alter this and to provide for the security of the school property.

116. School committees should be incorporated by law, and have perpetual succession, with power to hold property, movable and immovable, and to sell, transfer, lease, or otherwise dispose of such property, provided that it shall not be lawful to dispose of any immovable property without the consent of the Governor.

117. This would be a convenient time to provide the machinery for meeting the *bona fide* deficiencies which are sometimes inevitable in the local management of Undenominational Public Schools.

NEW SCHOOL REGULATIONS.

118. In a special Report to Parliament last session I pointed out that as the children who attend many of the so-called Mission Schools are now largely drawn from the families of the poorer classes of the white population, especially in the principal towns, the name of "Mission" is not appropriate as applied to that section of Mission Schools, because the parents are not adherents of a missionary congregation; and it would be convenient to consider these schools as supplementary to the graded system of Undenominational Public Schools, and simply regard them as Fourth Class Schools. The ordinary Mission Schools in connection with missionary congregations of coloured people would remain as they are, as regards both the management and the rate of Government aid. It is proposed to submit to Parliament certain regulations for these Fourth Class Undenominational Public Schools, and also an addition to the conditions of aid to Private Farm Schools as under:—

School Regulations—Private Farm Schools.

Proposed addition requiring the assent of Parliament by a Resolution of each House.

Teachers of Private Farm Schools shall be entitled to be put on the Good Service List and to draw Good Service Allowances under the same rules and on the same scale as apply to Third-class Undenominational Public Schools, viz.:—

£10 p.a. after 5 years' service.

£15 p.a. " 10 "

£20 p.a. " 15 "

120. *Additional School Regulations* requiring the assent of Parliament by a Resolution of each House.

UNDENOMINATIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS, CLASS IV.

I. Aid shall be granted to Fourth Class Undenominational Public Schools in eligible districts and localities, approved by the Governor, in towns and villages where there is a considerable population of the poorer classes, unable of themselves to found and maintain public schools for the instruction of their children.

II. The rates of aid shall be as follows:—

- (a). In a school where the actual daily attendance of scholars ranges from 40 to 50, a grant not exceeding £50 per annum in aid of the salary of the teacher.
- (b). In a school where the actual daily attendance ranges from 50 to 80, an additional grant not exceeding £30 per annum for the assistant and sewing mistress.
- (c). In a school where the actual daily attendance ranges from 80 to 100, an additional grant of £20 for an additional assistant.
- (d). In a school where the actual daily attendance of scholars is 120, a grant not exceeding £60 per annum in aid of the salary of the principal teacher; a grant not exceeding £40 per annum in aid of the salary of the infant school teacher; a grant not exceeding £30 per annum for the assistant and sewing mistress; and a grant not exceeding £20 per annum for each additional assistant,

on the basis of one assistant for 30 scholars above 120 in actual daily attendance.

III. The course of instruction shall include reading, writing, arithmetic, outlines of geography and history, lessons on natural objects, free-hand drawing, vocal music, and plain needlework for girls.

IV. The hours of instruction shall be at least five daily (Saturdays excepted). The managers may provide for the instruction of the scholars in religion during the ordinary hours of instruction; but no scholars shall be compelled to attend for such instruction without the consent of their parents or guardians.

V. (1) The names of the managers shall in every case be submitted to the Government for approval before any grant is made; and the Government shall satisfy itself with the arrangements proposed for the management and maintenance of the school. The names and credentials of the teachers nominated by the managers, the rates of school fee, and all further regulations, shall be subject to the approval of the Government.

(2) The managers shall provide and keep in repair the necessary accommodation for the school, with suitable offices and furniture, and shall further provide such local contributions to the salaries of teachers and assistants as in the opinion of the Government will secure the efficiency of the school.

(3) The school shall be under the management of the local managers, but shall be subject to inspection by the Superintendent-General of Education, or his deputy duly appointed by the Governor, who shall have the right of entering the school at any time during school hours, of examining into the state of the buildings and the school furniture, of ascertaining the progress of the children under instruction, and of inquiring generally into the efficiency of the school in regard to the locality in which it is placed, and of calling for such returns as he may require, in order to obtain satisfactory information on these subjects.

VI. The managers shall provide free instruction for children whose parents are unable to pay the school fees, in the proportion of one free scholar for every two pounds (£2) received from the Government grant.

VII. Principal teachers and teachers of approved Infant Departments in Fourth Class Undenominational Public Schools shall be entitled to Good Service Allowances on the following scale:—

£10 per annum, after 5 years' service.

£15 " " 10 "

£20 " " 15 "

RAILWAY STATION SCHOOLS.

121. The following arrangements have been made for the elementary instruction of the children whose parents are employed in the Railway Service, and preliminary steps have been taken by the Railway authorities to give effect to the scheme.

REGULATIONS FOR STATION SCHOOLS.

(*Third Class, Lower Grade.*)

The Education Department will grant thirty pounds (£30) per annum in aid of the teacher's salary, and aid in outfit of books, &c., on the following conditions:—

- 1. A daily attendance of at least ten scholars.
- 2. A local committee of three managers to guarantee free board and

- lodging for the teacher, and a local cash payment of ten pounds (£10) per annum.
3. Managers to be selected with the consent of the Railway Department.
 4. Managers and teachers to be approved by the Education Department.
 5. Railway Department to provide accommodation and furniture for school.
 6. School fees to be fixed by agreement between the Education Department and managers.
 7. School fees to be applied to the cash payment of ten pounds (£10) per annum to teacher, purchase of books, &c., and petty expenses of management.

TRUANCY.

122. The draft of a School Attendance* Act was submitted to the Government last year, and I think such a measure would be useful in Cape Town, and could be extended to other populous towns, as circumstances permit.

123. From a special inquiry made early in the year by one of the Inspectors of Schools it appears that in March, 1890, there were 6,848 scholars on the school rolls of Cape Town, whilst the daily average attendance was only 4,901; and that the number for whom accommodation is provided within the Municipal limits exceeds 7,000.

124. In many schools the accommodation is not well distributed; the Infant Departments being overcrowded, while the Juvenile Departments are scantily attended.

125. If the new Act has the effect of raising the daily attendance in Cape Town to 7,000, a re-adjustment of accommodation will have to be made.

126. The usual tabulated statements are appended to this Report.

APPENDIX B.

BILL

TO

Enforce the Regular Attendance of Children at Schools in certain Towns
and Villages.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the Cape of Good Hope, by and with the advice
and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly thereof, as
follows:—

1. This Act shall be put in force in any town or village of the Colony by
proclamation of the Governor.

2. So soon as the Act has been put in force in any town or village the Governor
shall appoint one or more school-attendance officers, who shall be under the direction
and control of the Superintendent-General of Education.

3. The parents or guardians of such children of school-going age as are found
playing or loitering in the streets or in any public place in any proclaimed town or village
during the ordinary school hours, may be summoned by the school-attendance officer to
appear before the nearest Resident Magistrate to give account of the cause of the
children's absence from school; and in case of default, either of attendance of the
parents or guardians or of any satisfactory cause being shown for the children's absence
from school, the magistrate shall inflict a fine not exceeding 10s. for each such offence,
or one week's imprisonment.

4. It shall also be the duty of the school-attendance officer to inquire into all
cases where there is reason to believe that children of school-going age do not attend
any school; and to warn parents or guardians to see that the children are regularly
sent to school; and if, after warning, the parents or guardians neglect to send their
children to school, then such parents or guardians may be summoned to appear before
the nearest Resident Magistrate, and unless satisfactory cause is shown for the absence
of the children from school, the magistrate shall inflict a fine not exceeding 10s. for
each offence, or one week's imprisonment.

5. All fines thus inflicted shall be paid in to the Colonial Treasury.

6. For the purposes of this Act, the school-going age shall be reckoned from seven
to thirteen years, and the ordinary school hours from 9 to 12 a.m. and from 1 to 3
p.m., public holidays, Saturdays, and the school vacations notified by the Governor
excepted.

7. The periods of vacation in undenominational public schools, Classes I, II and
III, boarding schools, farm and circuit schools, and in training and industrial institu-
tions, shall not extend beyond five weeks in the summer, three weeks in the winter, ten
days at Easter, and ten days at Michaelmas. The periods of vacation in undenomina-
tional public schools, Class IV, and in ordinary mission and aborigines' day schools shall
not extend beyond three weeks in the summer, two weeks in the winter, ten days at
Easter, and ten days at Michaelmas. The dates on which vacations begin and end shall
be publicly notified from time to time by the Governor.

8. No parent or guardian shall incur any penalty in respect to any child of school-
going age who shall have reached a satisfactory standard of attainments in elementary
subjects of instruction, to wit, reading, writing, and arithmetic, and shall hold a
certificate to that effect from the Department of Public Education.

9. The expenses of maintaining the school-attendance officers required under this Act, shall be a charge on the Department of Public Education.
 10. This Act may be cited as the "School Attendance Act."

APPENDIX C.

The following are the resolutions of the Synod of the Dutch Reformed Church :—

- (a). That the Dutch Language should be added to the subjects now prescribed for the School Elementary Examination; in such manner however that no Candidate shall be compelled to take that subject, but that any Candidate taking it shall thereby be entitled to obtain higher marks.
- (b). That in the School Higher Examination equal values should be assigned to the Dutch and English papers: and that these values should exceed those assigned to other languages.
- (c). That in the Matriculation Examination the Dutch and English papers should have equal values, instead of the present arrangement—by which the same values are assigned to the Dutch, French and German papers, and to each of these a lower value than to the English paper.
- (d). That in the School Elementary Examination Candidates should have the opportunity of being examined in Dutch in those subjects which they have learned through the medium of the Dutch Language.
- (e). That in all Examinations questions on the Dutch Language should be put in Dutch, leaving it to the option of the Candidate to answer in English.

The following are the Resolutions passed by the Taal Congress, held in Cape Town on the 31st October and 1st November, 1890 :—

1. (a). This Congress is of opinion that the time has arrived, especially with a view to those who prepare for the Civil Service Examination, that the Dutch language should be added as a compulsory subject to the Elementary School Examination: but if, owing to the present arrangement of our schools, insurmountable difficulties should present themselves, the marks shall be dealt with as those given for Greek at the Matriculation Examination, that is to say, that, although Dutch at the said examination be not made compulsory, the candidate who shall not submit to an examination in Dutch exposes himself to the risk of seeing his name so much the lower on the list of passed candidates.
- (b). The examination in Dutch shall include an easy dictation, a simple piece for translation from Dutch into English, and *vice versa*; some questions on ordinary declensions and conjugations.
2. This Congress is of opinion that in order to arouse more patriotism in the rising generation in all schools, the History of Geography of South Africa, as well as general geography, shall be taught either in Dutch or in English, and that the University Council be requested to examine in these subjects in both languages.
3. This Congress is of opinion in the Matriculation Examination Dutch should not be placed on the same footing with foreign languages, but that it should receive an equal number of marks with the principal subjects, provided, however, that the examination in Dutch shall be somewhat more thorough than it has hitherto been.
4. This Congress is of opinion that in all the lower schools elementary instruction should be given in and by means of the language of the majority of the local population, to which instruction in the second language may soon be added. Where it is deemed advisable, in farmers' schools, to give instruction only in and by means of Dutch, these schools should have the same claim to Government aid as the schools in which English is exclusively taught.
5. This Congress is of opinion, that the teaching, in this Colony, of the history of the country and the people, as also of humanity in general, is inadequate, and instructs the "Hoofdbestuur" to devise a plan for remedying this evil as soon as possible, and lay such before the Department of Education and the University Council.
6. This Congress is of opinion that in all examinations the papers on Dutch should be written and answered in that language.

APPENDIX D.

SIR LANGHAM DALE, K.C.M.G., LL.D.,

Superintendent-General of Education.

SIR.—We beg to submit to you the following sketch of the curriculum of the proposed South African School of Mines in connection with the South African College and the Kimberley Mines.

Admission.—Students who wish to qualify themselves for the profession of Mining Engineers are admitted to the full course of the School of Mines on having passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of the Cape of Good Hope. Students who have not passed this examination may be admitted to the several courses of lectures and the laboratories, but cannot enter as candidates for the preliminary and final examinations of the School of Mines unless they have passed an entrance examination in Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, and Chemistry of the same standard as the Matriculation Examination.

Courses of study.—The full course of study consists of—

- a. The preliminary course;
- b. The practical course;
- c. The special course.

a. *The Preliminary Course.*—The subjects of study in the Preliminary Course are :— Mathematics, Physics, Mechanics, Mechanical Drawing, Chemistry and Mineralogy.

The students have to attend these courses in the South African College and Laboratory and in the School of Mines.

Mathematics.—Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, and Spherical Trigonometry.

Physics.—Light, Heat, Electricity, and Magnetism.

Mechanics.—Elements of Mechanics.

Chemistry.—Inorganic Chemistry, Qualitative and Quantitative Analysis.

Mineralogy.—Mineralogy and Petrography.

b. *The Practical Course.*—Suitable arrangements for boarding establishments, &c., will have to be made for residence to enable students to work practically in the Kimberley Mines, in order to get a practical acquaintance with the tools and machinery used in mining. This course is a half-yearly course, and during this time the students should be under the supervision and tuition of a competent Mining Engineer. The students have also to devote one day of the week to the repetition of the subjects of the Preliminary Course.

c. *The Special Course.*—For the study of the subjects of the Special Course the students who have gone through the practical course have to attend the classes, lectures and laboratories at the School of Mines and the South African College Laboratory. The subjects are :—

Geology.—Geology in all its branches and Ore Deposits.

Mining.—Mining in all its branches.

Dressing of Ores.—Coal mining. Underground surveying.

Mechanics.—Applied and constructive Mechanics, Advanced Mechanical and Geometrical Drawing.

Metallurgy.—The extraction of metals from ores. Special attention given to processes for treatment of gold, silver, copper, lead and iron ores.

Assaying.—Assaying and blow-pipe analysis of ores containing useful metals, of fuel, and by products obtained in metallurgical operations; Electro-technical operations.

Chemistry.—Volumetric analysis applied to analysis of metals, alloys, and ores.

Chemical Technology.—During the long vacations the mining students will visit under the guidance of the Professors the several mining areas of the Colony and adjacent countries.

The Special Course comprises two years, after which the students have to enter the Final Mining Examination for the degree of Mining Engineer.

In order to secure efficient instruction in the subjects it will be necessary to establish for the present in the School of Mines three lectureships with assistantships, viz.:—

Lectureship for Mining, including Geology and Mineralogy.

Lectureship for Metallurgy and Assaying, including Electro-technical operations

Lectureship for Mechanics, including applied Mathematics, Mechanics, and Constructive Mechanics.

Instead of increasing the present staff in the Mathematical Department of the South African College it will no doubt be better to have at once a chair for Mechanics. The Professor of Mathematics in the South African College, who has now the teaching of this subject, would thus be relieved from having to teach a subject such as Mechanics only theoretically, whereas it should be taught experimentally, even in the Elements of Mechanics.

Following the example of the best Schools of Mines and Mining Academies, the practical course has been arranged so as to precede the special course since the Mining Students must possess a practical knowledge of the working in the mines and the mining machinery in order to follow the lectures on Mining and Constructive Mechanics with advantage.

We shall be glad to furnish a detailed syllabus of the several subjects as soon as the establishment of the School of Mines, which will prove of immense value to the rising generation throughout South Africa, will have assumed a more definite form.
