#### The UK and the Terror Threat

The recent statement from the UK's new Independent Reviewer of Terrorism Legislation that the terrorist threat to the country is at its highest level since the 1970s raises at least three crucial questions that this briefing seeks to answer. Why is the threat apparent so high, and apparently rising, after 15 years of high-intensity 'war' against international terrorist groups? Why is the specific threat from Islamic State (IS) so substantial at present? Finally, and most overlooked, why is there such a disconnect between the intense war in Iraq and Syria and the perception of threat in the UK? <u>Read more >></u>

#### The UK, Russia and NATO Revisited

Turbulence in trans-Atlantic relations look set to be the defining security issue of 2017. Since the onset of conflict in Ukraine in 2014, ORG has worked to understand what drives the greatest tensions in European security for a generation, not least Russia's own perception of its place and interests in Europe and the wider world. On 2 March the UK House of Commons Foreign Affairs Committee finally published its report on its 2016 inquiry *The United Kingdom's relations with Russia*, citing at length written evidence from ORG. <u>Read more >></u>



#### Forthcoming Briefings on Security in the Sahel-Sahara

ORG's British Sahel-Sahara Forum will publish two new briefings this spring. The first will explore the dramatic evolution of Libya's proxy war in the context of 'illiberal geopolitics': the rise of Russia as a Mediterranean security actor, the Trump administration's counter-IS campaign, Arab states' suppression of democratic Islamism, and the EU's imperative to suppress illicit migration. The second will analyse the dynamics of Boko Haram's presence in northern Cameroon and the multinational campaign against it.


