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Local Housing Statistics

England and Wales

1. **Local Housing Statistics** is prepared by the Department of the Environment and the Welsh Office to provide figures for individual local authority areas in a quarterly publication.

The tables relating to the provision of new permanent housing and, from the beginning of 1972, renovation grants, appear regularly in each issue. They show annual cumulative figures. Before 1972 annual totals for renovation grants were published in supplementary tables.

Tables on right to buy and sales of council dwellings, showing cumulative figures on a financial year basis, appear regularly from 1981/82 (see note 8). Previously sales were included in supplementary tables (until 1979 on a calendar year basis).

Supplementary tables on various other housing matters are included as data become available.

Supplementary tables so far published are listed on page iv.

2. **Definitions.** It may be noted that:

Dwellings include all permanent houses and flats.

Housing progress by local authorities and new towns includes dwellings intended for sale or lease and dwellings for renting.

Local authorities include local housing authorities and new town authorities.

Other public sector includes Government departments, county councils and housing associations.

Regions are the standard regions for statistical purposes, revised following local government reorganisation on 1 April 1974.

Counties are the areas specified in the London Government Act 1963 and the Local Government Act 1972; the Isles of Scilly are included with Cornwall for statistical purposes.

3. **Local authority areas.** Local housing authorities may provide housing either within or outside their own areas. The figures shown in table 4 against the name of the authority include dwellings situated outside its area, for which particulars of starts and completions are given separately in table 5. Table 6 shows the distribution within and outside Greater London of dwellings started and completed by the Greater London Council, or by housing associations assisted by the Greater London Council. Authorities shown in tables 5 and 6 are indicated in table 4 by the following footnotes:

² An authority which started or completed dwellings in the area of another authority during the period.

³ An authority in whose area another authority started or completed dwellings during the period.

Other public sector and private sector dwellings are shown against the name of the authority in whose area they are situated.

4. **New Towns.** Dwellings built for development corporations or for the Commission for the New Towns are shown in table 4 against the new town. In Wales, and in England up to the 2nd quarter 1980, private sector dwellings built in a new town are shown against the local authority in whose area it is situated and separately against the name of the new town. From the 3rd quarter of 1980, private sector dwellings built in English new towns on land owned by the development corporation or the Commission for the New towns are shown only against the new town.

5. **Housing progress tables.** Table 4a provides statistics for quarter 1 1982. Tables 4b and 4c are a summary of amendments and late received statistical returns for 1980 and 1981 respectively.

6. **Adjustments to earlier returns** may occasionally result in a negative figure for an individual authority, when, for example, dwellings reported as started are subsequently withdrawn or there is a transfer from one sector to another.

7. **Slum clearance** Two tables on slum clearance are now being published. Firstly the annual supplementary table on houses in clearance areas and compulsory purchase orders confirmed for 1981 appears as table 9. This has been a regular supplementary table and the figures for 1980 were published in issue No. 57. Secondly a new annual supplementary table on dwellings demolished or closed during the year ending 31 March 1981 appears as table 10. This series was previously published as quarterly figures in the last two columns of the housing progress table (no. 4 or 5 depending on the issue). The last quarterly figures were those for the first half of 1980 given in table 5 of issue No. 55. The information has been expanded in the new supplementary table to show more details of the dwellings demolished. The distribution of the Greater London Council demolitions, which was previously published as a separate quarterly table (e.g. table 7 of issue 55) is now given as a footnote to table 10 issue No. 61.

8. **Sales of dwellings owned by local authorities and new towns.** Tables 8 and 9 provide a full presentation of the sales of dwellings according to type of sale. The Housing Act 1980 extended the provisions under which local authorities and new towns dispose of dwellings, particularly through the 'right to buy' established in Part I of the Act which came into force on 3 October 1980. Progress, during financial years, of sales to tenants exercising their right to buy is summarised in tables 8(a) and 9(a), which show numbers of tenants from whom claims to this right had been received on form RTB1 (no adjustment is made for claims subsequently withdrawn), numbers whose right to buy had been accepted by the authorities on form RTB2, and numbers of completed sales.

9. **Population.** These figures are the latest available estimates of the home population published by the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys.

10. **Renovation grants.** Table 7 shows the number of local authority and county council dwellings renovated for which government assistance in the form of subsidy or contribution will be given, the number of dwellings approved for housing association grant by the Secretary of State for the Environment or the Secretary of State for Wales, and the number of other dwellings for which grants were paid by local authorities during the period. In the case of conversions the number of dwellings is the total available after completion of the work; no account is taken of the number before work began.

11. **Housing action areas.** Introduced in Part IV of the Housing Act 1974, consist mainly of areas of housing accommodation where the local authority consider housing and social conditions are unsatisfactory and arrangements can be made within a period of five years to improve dwellings and the well-being of persons and to secure the proper and effective management of housing accommodation within the area.

Numbers of dwellings shown as converted, improved or repaired with government assistance in the form of subsidy or grant are also included with the renovation figures appearing in table 7.

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12. **General improvement areas.** Part II of the Housing Act 1969 as amended by the Housing Act 1974 confers powers on local authorities in England and Wales to deal with the improvement of living conditions in predominantly residential areas by declaring general improvement areas and improving the amenities of such areas, or dwellings therein, or both. Numbers of dwellings shown as converted, improved or repaired with government assistance in the form of subsidy or grant are also included with the renovation figures appearing in table 7.

13. **Homeless Households.** Since the implementation of the Housing (Homeless Persons) Act in December 1977, 'Acceptances' covers those households for whom local authorities assume the responsibility of securing accommodation (either temporary or permanent) under the provisions of the Act. This includes households found to be homeless (or threatened with homelessness within four weeks) and in one of the seven designated 'Priority Need' categories for whom local authorities have a duty to secure accommodation, it also includes any homeless households not in priority need for whom they have nevertheless undertaken to secure accommodation. From the fourth quarter of 1980 a new statistical system was introduced for non-metropolitan authorities. Because of changes in recording practices associated with the new system, and definitional problems, results for non-metropolitan authorities, are not strictly comparable with those for earlier periods.

14. **Index of local authority districts, London boroughs and new towns: England and Wales.** (H.M.S.O. 1974. 50p net) lists alphabetically all local authorities and new towns and shows the county and statistical region in which each is situated; sub-divisions of regions are the counties with certain exceptions in Wales, which are described in the foreword to the index. Maps showing district, county and regional boundaries are included.

A comprehensive description of the new system of local government, including the relationship between the old and new authorities, is given in *Local Government in England and Wales: A guide to the new system* (H.M.S.O., 1974, £4.00 NET).
