DRIVING POWER

What is the League of Nations?

It is a machine for regulating the affairs of the world, promoting international co-operation, and keeping peace between the nations.

REMEMBER it is only a machine; it cannot work without driving-power.

What the LEAGUE sets out to do.

- 1.—To keep the peace between nations and protect the world from war.
- 2.-To protect the small and weak nations against powerful and unscrupulous neighbours.
- 3.-To care for uncivilised and partly developed peoples.
- 4.—To promote trade and industry, and thus increase the productivity of the World.
- 5.—To prevent the exploitation of labour for the benefit of capital.
- 6.-To bring down the cost of living.
- 7.-To protect the world against epidemics of disease.
- 8.—To suppress the traffic in arms and in dangerous drugs, and put down the white slave trade.
- 9.—To limit and in time abolish armaments, thus removing an important cause of war, and materially reducing taxation.
- 10.—To set free all the good brains and energies now engaged upon devising horrible war machines, to be used in constructive pursuits.

How can the LEAGUE OF NATIONS do all these things?

Only by the force of public opinion. Only by the active goodwill of the people.

It is a wonderful machine but, remember, it is only a machine. THE PEOPLE must provide the driving-power or it will never work.

There are almost no limits to its power for good if only THE PEOPLE will support it.

What YOU must do to help.

SHOW that you are in earnest about the League. Organise for it. Make your leaders realise that you are in earnest.

DON'T vote for any candidate for Parliament who is not pledged to work for the League with all his strength.

MAKE your voice heard, and so help to win the force of British public opinion for the League of Nations.

YOU have got the machinery to your hand in the L.N.U. There are branches all over the country. Join one and organise for the League. If there is not a branch in your town or village—FORM ONE.

ONE voice—your voice alone—is nothing. Even a thousand voices don't carry far. But a million voices raised together ring out through the whole country. We must be organised in a Union. The League of Nations Union. The Union pledged to the ideals for which we fought the war.
