

#### CAMPS IN USE FOR HOUSING PURPOSES

As at 31st March, 1966 there were 683 families occupying 48 former camps administered by local authorities under the Housing Acts.

## UNFIT HOUSES IN TEMPORARY USE FOR HOUSING Housing Act, 1957

On the 31st December, 1965, there were 33,883 unfit houses retained for temporary accommodation under Sections 48, 17(2), and 46 of the Act. In addition, 20 unfit houses were licensed for temporary occupation under Sections 34 or 53 of the Act.

#### HOUSING LABOUR FORCE

The number of operatives aged 15 and over employed by building and civil engineering contractors on the construction of new permanent houses and the preparation of housing sites was provisionally estimated at

276,000 (31.7.65) 279,000 (31.10.65) 269,000 (31.1.66)

These figures do not include building and civil engineering workers directly employed by local authorities. In March, 1966, the number of such workers was 14,437.

The number of operatives engaged on the repair and maintenance of houses (including conversions, extensions and alterations) was provisionally estimated at 138,000 in January, 1966.

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

## UNFIT HOUSES IN TEMPORARY USE FOR HOUSING Housing Act, 1957

On the 31st March, 1966, there were 33,188 unfit houses retained for temporary accommodation under Sections 48, 17(2), and 46 of the Act. In addition, 12 unfit houses were licensed for temporary occupation under Sections 34 or 53 of the Act.

#### HOUSING LABOUR FORCE

The number of operatives aged 15 and over employed by building and civil engineering contractors on the construction of new permanent houses and the preparation of housing sites was provisionally estimated at



As at 30th September, 1966 there were 613 families occupying 45 former camps administered by local authorities under the Housing Acts.

## UNFIT HOUSES IN TEMPORARY USE FOR HOUSING Housing Act, 1957

On the 30th June, 1966, there were 31,563 unfit houses retained for temporary accommodation under Sections 48, 17(2), and 46 of the Act. In addition, 198 unfit houses were licensed for temporary occupation under Sections 34 or 53 of the Act.

### HOUSING LABOUR FORCE

The number of operatives aged 15 and over employed by building and civil engineering contractors on the construction of new permanent houses and the preparation of housing sites was provisionally estimated at

269,000 (31.1.66) 270,000 (30.4.66) 274,000 (31.7.66)

These figures do not include building and civil engineering workers directly employed by local authorities. In September, 1966, the number of such workers was 15,219.

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The number of operatives engaged on the repair and maintenance of For P houses (including conversions, extensions and alterations) was provisionally estimated at 138,000 in July, 1966.
