Housing Return for England and Wales as at 31st March, 1947

This return is the fifteenth of a series of monthly progress statements on housing in England and Wales. The figures in the present return show the position up to 31st March, 1947, and relate from 1st April, 1945. The return includes an Appendix A giving general tables relating to England and Wales as a whole and to various subdivisions by types of authority and by geographical distribution.

The *first issue included general explanatory notes which have not been repeated in this return.

A detailed statement for each of the 1,469 housing authorities will shortly be published as a separate document (Appendix B.).

HOUSING PROGRAMME FOR 1947

In the published Housing Programme for 1947 (Cmd. 7021) it was pointed out that production during 1947 was dependent on many uncertain factors and special reference was made to the supply of fuel for production and transport and to the dependence of the programme on adequate supplies of timber. Despite the improvement in supplies which the Government have secured, the timber situation is still acute. Until further supplies are obtained as a result of the intensified action which will continue to be taken, timber must continue to be a main limiting factor in the total number of houses which can be built. Moreover, in planning the best use of the national resources housing is not the only priority service which calls for scarce materials. The basic industries and electricity and transport are substantial users not only of fuel but also of the same materials as housing, and a fair balance has to be struck. Last and most important are the effects of a phenomenal winter which have already manifested themselves in time lost on the site and even more seriously in the production of building materials. The effect upon the supply of materials must continue to be felt for some months to come.

Because of this continuing loss of production it is not possible to assess precisely the total effect upon the housing programme, but it is undoubtedly very serious indeed. The Government, therefore, after reviewing the position, think it right to let Parliament and the country know at once that there seems now to be no possibility of securing during this year the 240,000 completed houses which was a reasonable estimate when the housing programme for 1947 was published.

The Government also desire to indicate what steps they propose to take in regard to the execution of the housing programme. The full national housing needs will be met as fast as resources available will allow them to be met, and the Government will press on with the policy announced in the published White Paper of securing the greatest number of completed houses as quickly as possible and of ensuring a balanced programme for the future.

In the published Housing Programme for 1947 it was postulated that for the continuous and ordered development of the programme during 1947 the number of houses in tenders approved and licences issued by the end of 1947 should reach a total of approximately 600,000 in the post-war programme for Great Britain. Of this total it was estimated that approximately 300,000 should have been completed, 200,000 would be under construction and 100,000 would be in tenders approved or licences issued but not yet under construction. It was considered that any larger numbers than 200,000 and 100,000 would represent a lack of balance in the country's building operations and the figures at these two stages still stand as the Government's objective.

At the end of March, 1947, there were 218,783 houses under construction and 130,520 houses approved but not yet under construction. These figures of houses approved and under construction are evidence of the success in getting the programme under way. The margin by which they exceed the December objective is appropriate in the earlier months of the year during which it is usual for more houses to be started than finished. To maintain a balanced programme as the year proceeds, however, the number of houses completed month by month must first be brought up to and then beyond the number of new approvals given and new houses started. This number of new approvals given month by month must, therefore, be carefully related to the building progress which is made. Because the hold up in the first three months of the year has been greater than could reasonably have been anticipated, the rate at which new tenders can be approved during the rest of the year must therefore be reduced to the extent necessary to maintain a balanced building programme and so avoid the dissipation of labour and materials over too many houses.

Zonal conferences were held in all parts of the country in February and March in accordance with the procedure described in the Housing Programme for 1947. These conferences considered the number of houses likely to be completed by the individual local authorities by the end of 1947 together with the number of additional houses which might be put in contract by the authorities during the course of the year. There is no intention of disturbing the allocations of houses thus made to local authorities. There is no question of preventing any local authorities from building houses which they can in fact build. In order, however, to assist them to build as many houses as possible this year the entry into new contracts which would hamper the speedy completion of houses already under contract must be avoided. The Principal Housing Officers have been instructed to deal with this question in consultation with the individual local authorities with due regard to their individual building achievements from month to month on schemes which are already in hand.

Estimates of the number of houses to be completed by each local authority in 1947 were made at the Conferences held during February and March. These were based on the national total of 240,000 which was given in the published housing programme. Detailed estimates of the number of houses to be completed by each local authority in England and Wales are being published in Appendix B of this Return. For the reasons given above the national total cannot now be achieved. Some local authorities may be able to achieve their local figures, but it is only fair to local authorities in general to make it clear that because of the disastrous effects of the winter the majority of them cannot be expected to do so.

The Government consider that it would be undesirable to attempt at this stage an alternative estimate of the number of houses likely to be completed before the end of the year either in total or for the individual districts. The object must be to complete this year as many as possible of the 218,783 houses already under construction. The Government are sure they can rely on the fullest co-operation of the building industry and the building materials industry to do their utmost with the resources available to them and to make this total as large as possible. Full information as to the progress which is actually made will continue to be given in the published returns.

Besides the total provision of additional accommodation as set out above, 698,000 dwellings which were damaged during the war but not so severely as to be unfit for occupation were repaired during the twenty-four months ending 31st March, 1947.

PERMANENT NON-TRADITIONAL HOUSES

With the object of accelerating the rate at which houses can be erected a number of methods of house construction have been evolved which, for ease of reference, are known as "non-traditional". Included in this category are types that have been referred to as "permanent prefabricated". In Appendix A, Table II, a list of the main types is given together with details regarding the numbers of each type for which tenders have been approved and the numbers completed. Information regarding the development of sites and the preparation of housing schemes for non-traditional houses is included in the figures shown in Appendix A, Tables I, 2, 8 and 9, and is shown in detail in Table 2(b).

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REBUILDING OF WAR DESTROYED HOUSES

The rebuilding of war destroyed houses by private builders to private contract can be undertaken only under licence. Rebuilding by Local Authorities can be begun with the approval of the Ministry of Health and War Damage Commission. The figures for March take into account information regarding houses approved and on licences issued and houses completed in earlier months which was not previously available. Information in respect of some Local Authorities is still incomplete and the figures quoted are subject to adjustment. USE OF EXISTING PREMISES

Apart from new building additional accommodation for family units has also been provided by Local Authorities and by private builders under licence by the repair or adaptation of existing premises.

Information in regard to such provision made by Local Authorities has been published in earlier housing returns. Corresponding information relating to the provision made by private builders under licence was available for the first time in April, 1946. The data available may be summarised as follows:—

It is anticipated that revision will be necessary in respect of figures for the repair of unoccupied war damaged dwellings. The existing figures should therefore be regarded as provisional.

OTHER HOUSING ACCOMMODATION

A total of 30,636 flats and houses of less than 12 rooms was released from occupation by the Services and Government Departments over the period 1st May, 1945, to 28th February, 1947. Some of the dwellings on release were taken over by the Local Authorities.

The total number of requisitioned dwellings held by the Local Authorities for residential purposes was 95,891 at the end of March; of these 60,277 were situated in the London region.

Of the total of 95,891 requisitioned dwellings held by the Local Authorities, 69,275 were held at 31st March, 1945. From that date to 28th February, 1947, there was a net increase in unoccupied houses requisitioned by Local Authorities for residential purposes of 26,179 and a further 437 were requisitioned in March, 1947, making a net increase of 26,616 houses in the 24 months to 31st March, 1947.

SERVICE CAMPS—TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION

In addition to accommodation referred to above, there were at 31st March, 1947, 14,473 families occupying accommodation in 1,050 camps that were redundant to the needs of the Services or Government Departments, which had been offered to Local Authorities for housing purposes and were considered suitable for those purposes. In the main these camps had been taken over by Local Authorities as part of their pool of housing accommodation or were being managed by them on behalf of the Ministry of Health.

Accommodation for a further 1,416 families was occupied in 213 camps which are still required for Government purposes, or are unsuitable for housing, or are still subject to decision as to their future use.

PROGRESS OF INDIVIDUAL HOUSING AUTHORITIES

Of the total of 1,469 Authorities there were at the 31st March, 1947, 10 Authorities, excluding L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs, who had as yet no sites of which possession had been obtained. Of these Authorities 6 were urban areas (mainly small urban districts) and 4 rural districts; the population in these areas represents $\mathbf{o} \cdot \mathbf{I} \mathbf{I}$ per cent. of the total population of England and Wales. There were 9 Authorities, excluding L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs, who had not obtained authority to go to tender on a specific scheme. The population in the area of these Authorities represents $\mathbf{o} \cdot \mathbf{I} \mathbf{I}$ per cent. of the total population of England and Wales.

HOUSING LABOUR FORCE

A new system of return of the number of employees in the Building and Civil Engineering Industries has recently been instituted by the Ministry of Works. The return relating to the month of March is not yet complete, but it is hoped to publish figures in future Housing Returns.

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BUILDING MATERIALS AND COMPONENTS

Details of production of the more important building materials and components are included in Appendix A. The information relates to Great Britain as a whole; separate details in respect of England and Wales are not available. It should be noted that the production of the items listed is utilised not only for the construction of and installation in new dwellings but also for repairs, replacements and building work other than house building.

In general the production in any given month is not known until towards the end of the following month. It is not therefore always possible for the complete data relating to the month under review to be available in time for inclusion in the Return.

APPENDIX A-NOTES

The material contained in this return is derived from a census of the housing position at 31st December, 1945, and the reports of subsequent progress completed by the Local Authorities. Certain information is obtained from Government Departments. Where this is the case the items concerned have been annotated. At the 17th April, 1947, reports of progress had not been received from I Authority for the months December–March, from 2 Authorities for the months January–March, from 10 Authorities for the months February and March, and from 46 Authorities for the month of March. Reports of progress in March were due to be received by the 5th April, 1947. Reports received after 17th April arrived too late to be included in the figures shown in this report relating to progress in March. By 17th April, 1947, 1,410 reports had been received.

Classification of Urban and Rural Authorities

The classification of Urban Authorities other than the L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs into Large Towns and Cities, Medium Towns and Cities and Small Towns has been made in terms of population. The classification has been made as follows based on the estimated population at mid-1939 as returned by the Registrar General.

Large Towns and Cities ... over 75,000

Medium Towns and Cities ... over 25,000 and up to 75,000

Small Towns 25,000 and under

The Rural Authorities comprise all Rural District Councils.

Regions

Certain changes in the composition of the Northern, North Midlands and North Western Regions were made as from 1st April, 1946. As from the same date the "North Eastern Region" is to be known as "East and West Ridings". The Description and composition of the Regions are now as follows—

Northern ... Cumberland, Durham, Northumberland, Westmorland and the North Riding of Yorkshire.

East and West The East and West Ridings of Yorkshire.

Ridings.

North Midlands ... Derbyshire (except the High Peak District), Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire (including the Soke of Peterborough), Nottinghamshire and Rutland.

Eastern ... Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire (including the Isle of Ely), Essex, Hertfordshire, Huntingdonshire, Norfolk and Suffolk, except such parts of Essex and Hertfordshire as are within the London Region.

London ... London (Administrative County), Middlesex and parts of Kent, Essex, Hertfordshire and Surrey.

Southern ... Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Dorset, Hampshire (including the Isle of Wight) and Oxfordshire.

South Western ... Cornwall, Devon, Gloucestershire, Somerset and Wiltshire.

Wales ... The whole of Wales and Monmouthshire.

Midlands ... Herefordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire and Worcestershire.

North Western ... Cheshire, Lancashire and the High Peak District of Derbyshire.

South Eastern ... Sussex, Kent and Surrey except such parts of Kent and Surrey as are within the London Region.

Table 8 shows the numbers of sites at different stages from the initial stage of selection to the stage when the site is available for construction.

Between the selection of the site and the completion of houses ready for occupation there is a long chain of events equivalent to the "pipeline" of materials and components of mass production in the engineering industry.

In general the use of the site for housing requires consideration from the point of view of regional and town planning, local transport facilities and so on. Sites have then to be acquired, a layout agreed, and roads, sewers and other services provided generally in advance of beginning the actual erection of houses. The actual construction of the houses themselves is the final process in the chain of production, which also, of course, comprises the fabrication of building materials and components ready for use.

During the early stages of expanding the volume of house building, the number of house sites under development and the number of houses under construction and so on will continue to rise in advance of a corresponding increase in the number of houses completed. As the production of houses by Local Authorities evolves into a smooth and continuous cycle of operations, the number of houses or house sites at the various stages in the chain of production will tend to be roughly equal.

Table 9 shows the number of houses at different stages towards completion beginning with the preparation of house plans.

Many of the initial stages in the erection of houses such as the preparation of house plans, bills of quantities and the chain of events leading to the acceptance of a tender are, in many cases, undertaken concurrently with the work of developing the corresponding sites.

Softwood timber is required for use in the repair and construction of ships, the repair and construction of railway passenger and goods vehicles, furniture, agricultural equipment, packing cases, etc. An allocation between the various uses of the supplies available each quarter is agreed inter-departmentally and implemented through the timber licensing machinery.

There is a marked variation during the course of the year in the monthly flow of imports into this country, due both to the logging seasons in the country of origin and to the freezing of the ports in the Baltic Sea and in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Normally the bulk of imports arrive in this country in the latter part of the calendar year.


PERMANENT HOUSES CONSTRUCTION COMPLETED





2. The data shown in this Appendix has been based on Appendix B to the Housing Return for England and Wales for the 31st January, 1946, and includes additions and alterations notified in monthly Progress Reports up to and including March, 1947, received from Local Authorities. In cases where entries in the Progress Reports were incomplete or inconsistent the information contained in this Appendix has been compiled in the light of evidence contained in the Census Return and in the Progress Reports as a whole. The tabular statement shows the position as at the 31st March. In certain instances Progress Reports have not been received in time for inclusion. Those local authorities in respect of whom Progress Reports for January, February and March, 1947, have not been received are marked with §, † and * respectively. The data in respect of permanent housing shown for such authorities relates to the position as at the 31st December, 1946, 31st January and 28th Fèbruary, 1947, respectively.

3. In certain cases temporary houses have been handed over to Local Authorities for occupation before all internal fitments have been installed. Where this has been done the number of temporary houses shown as completed (Column (13)) has been marked ø and the name of the Local Authority and the number of houses included in the figure shown in Column 13 which are not complete with all fitments is stated at the foot of the page.

4. The erection of some temporary houses has been completed but their connection to electric and other services has not been effected. Where this is the case the number of temporary houses shown as completed (column (13)) has been marked ‡ and the name of the Local Authority and the number of houses completed but not ready for occupation is stated at the foot of the page. Such houses are not included in the number shown as completed in column (13).

5. Housing Programme for 1947. The figures shown in Column (19) represent estimates of the numbers of permanent houses to be completed in 1947. These estimates were made on the basis explained in the White Paper (Cmd. 7021) on the Housing Programme for 1947, which was published in January, 1947. They should also be read in conjunction with the statement on pages 2 and 3 of the Housing Return for March (Cmd.).

6. The term "under construction" in Columns (4), (6), (15) and (17), means that the contractor has actually begun work on the construction of the dwellings. In some instances work has begun on all dwellings in a particular contract; in a few cases it would appear that all the dwellings in a particular scheme have been shown as "under construction" on the Progress Report although work has not necessarily started on all of them.

7. In certain instances the Ministry of Works are undertaking the erection of groups of experimental permanent non-traditional houses on sites provided by housing authorities. These houses have been included in the data shown for the authorities concerned.

8. Where Tenders (or Estimates in the case of Direct Labour) for site development (Roads and Sewers) have been approved by the Ministry of Health but where work on the site has not begun, the sites have not been shown as under development (Col. (2)).

9. In the few instances where sites developed before the war by private enterprise are being taken over by the local authority but possession has not yet been obtained, the relevant figures have been entered in Column (2).

10. Permanent Houses. The figures in all columns except Columns (4) and (5) are not included in any other column. "Houses under construction" (Column (4)) and "Houses completed" (Column (5)) are included in "Houses on Tenders Approved" quoted in Column (3).

11. It should be noted that the greater part of the housing provision for the County of London is made by the London County Council. It is not, therefore, possible to relate the data shown in this Appendix for each Metropolitan Borough to the housing needs of the population of the Borough.

The bulk of the preliminary work in connection with the provision of permanent houses made by certain housing associations in the County of London area is undertaken by the Metropolitan Boroughs. The information is included in Columns (14), (15) and (16).

Certain data on temporary houses in respect of the London County Council and the Metropolitan Boroughs have been consolidated.

12. The total number of dwellings on licences issued (Column 14) includes licences issued both in regard to new dwellings and to the rebuilding of war destroyed dwellings. An analysis of the respective numbers falling into these two categories is shown in Tables 4a, 4b and 5a of Appendix A to the Housing Return.

The total number of licences shown in Column 14 also takes into account information received from local authorities in respect of any licences that may have lapsed. The data received in respect of licences may not in all cases be complete and may, therefore, be subject to correction.

13. The numbers of houses on licences issued, under construction and completed by Housing Associations is included in Columns (14), (15) and (16).
