THE NINETEEN-THIRTY SUMMER SCHOOL

THE NINETEEN-THIRTY SUMMER SCHOOL, arranged by the League of Nations Union, will meet at Trinity College, Cambridge, from Saturday, August 30, until Friday, September 5.

ACCOMMODATION will be provided for men students in College, and for women students in University lodgings. Both men and women students will take lunch and dinner in Hall.

EXCURSIONS will be made to places of interest in and around Cambridge, there will be a visit to Ely Cathedral on Sunday, and the Mayor of Cambridge has invited members of the School to a Garden Party on Monday afternoon.

WEEK-END CONFERENCE FOR TEACHERS

'All children and young people should, before completing their formal education, learn something of the Aims and Work of the League of Nations, the terms of its Covenant and the recent growth of international co-operation.' [From the Teachers' Declaration signed by the principal Associations of Teachers in 1927, and endorsed by the Association of Education Committees, the Association of Municipal Corporations and the County Councils Association in Education and the League of Nations (1929).]

THE NINETEEN-THIRTY SUMMER SCHOOL will be preceded by a WEEK-END CONFERENCE ON EDUCATION AND THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS. There will be Lectures and Discussions on The League of Nations and the Schools, The Teaching of History, The Teaching of Geography, Religious Instruction, Racial Prejudices, International Friendship and World Loyalty, Work in the Schools of Other Lands, Junior Branches of the Union.

Members of the Conference will be expected to be familiar with The Teachers' Declaration (2d.) and Education and the League of Nations (3d.); both may be obtained from the League of Nations Union.

The Conference will commence with dinner on Friday, August 29, and end with a Garden Party given by the Mayor of Cambridge, on Monday, September 1.

Men will live in Trinity College, women in University lodgings: both men and women will take lunch and dinner in Hall.

An inclusive fee is quoted for the Week-End Conference and the Nineteen-Thirty Summer School.

Week-End Conference for Teachers: Fee for lectures and full board and accommodation beginning with dinner on Friday, August 29, until the afternoon of Monday, September 1, $2\frac{1}{2}$ guineas.

The Nineteen-Thirty Summer School: Fee for lectures, board and accommodation beginning with dinner on Saturday, August 30, and ending with lunch on Friday, September 5, $4\frac{1}{2}$ guineas.

Inclusive Fee for the Week-End Conference for Teachers and the Nineteen-Thirty Summer School: £5 7s. 6d.

Fees for Lectures only: For the Nineteen-Thirty Summer School: £1 1s. For the Week-End Conference for Teachers: 5s.

Small extra charges will be made for the excursions out of Cambridge. The board provided does not include afternoon tea.

Members will make their own travelling arrangements to Cambridge. Special labels will be issued.

SOME OTHER SUMMER SCHOOLS AND VISITS The Geneva Institute of International Relations (July 27-August 1), provides an unparalleled opportunity for studying the work of the League and the general trend of world affairs. A conducted party will leave London on the morning of July 26. Accommodation in Geneva, social gatherings and excursions are arranged. Fee for accommodation and second class travel London/ Geneva, return, 11¹/₂ guineas.

In connection with the Institute an additional course of lectures and demonstration lessons has this year been arranged for schoolmasters and schoolmistresses.

Second Junior Summer School (Geneva, August 7-14).—A popular holiday school for parties of boys and girls from the upper forms of Public and Secondary Schools, leaving London, Wednesday, August 6. Fee for accommodation and second class travel London/Geneva, $9\frac{1}{2}$ guineas and 10 guineas.

Visit to Geneva for the Assembly of the League of Nations. -Arrangements have been made for groups of speakers and others interested in the work of the Union to visit Geneva during the Assembly, which opens this year on Wednesday, September 10. Conducted parties will leave London on September 6 and September 13. Fee for six days' accommodation and second class travel London/Geneva, 10¹/₂ guineas.
