The Honourable the Colonial Secretary, &c.

SIR,—I have the honour to furnish the Government with the annual report on my administration of the Department of Public Education.

2. The numerical and financial statements are made up to 30th June, 1884, so as to correspond with the ordinary financial year recognised by the Government; but all topics that appeared to demand special notice up to 31st December have been treated in the general Report.

SCHOOLS.—ENROLMENT AND ATTENDANCE.

3. The number of schools in operation during some part of the year was 1,049; the annual enrolment of scholars was 78,037; the highest quarterly enrolment was 56,296; the highest daily attendance was 45,590; and the ordinary daily attendance was 39,102. Forty-five schools in Basutoland received aid for the half-year ended 31st December, 1883.

INSPECTION OF SCHOOLS.

4. Of these schools, 181 were closed from various causes, during some portion of the year; 864 schools were inspected; on the books of these schools at the date of inspection were the names of 52,763 children; of these 39,771 were actually present at inspection, and were examined and classified by the Deputy-Inspectors as follows:—

5. The fifth standard was introduced in January, so that the actual classification under it had been made during five months, when the foregoing list was closed. This is the highest of the standards of elementary instruction, and includes those who have passed with excellence in (1) reading any ordinary narrative; (2) writing freely to dictation; (3) working examples in practice, proportion, and vulgar fractions; (4) geography and (5) grammar; and have further satisfied the inspectors in two at least of the following subjects:—(a) Elements of natural science, or one of these specific subjects: chemistry, geology, mineralogy, botany, animal physiology, principles of agriculture; (b) physical geography; (c) outlines of history of England and the Cape Colony. In girls' schools, the laws of health and domestic economy may be substituted for one of the specific subjects.

6. The fact that 21,662 are reported as "Infants and others below any standard" indicates the unsatisfactory condition of many elementary schools frequented by the children of mixed races or of the aborigines. Teachers complain of the irregular attendance and of the difficulties arising from the variety of spoken languages, and of the impossibility of developing mental activity among children who are often in want of food; this, during the prevailing drought and general distress, has no doubt been a serious hindrance to progress. A larger number of aborigines' scholars than usual came under inspection during the year, and swelled the ranks of those below standard.

7. The following comparative statements indicate, after all, some little advance:—

RACE AND AGE.

9. From the returns it is estimated that 34 per cent. of the children attending school are of European or white race, and 66 per cent. are of coloured or African race. Twenty per cent. of the children attending school are infants, *i.e.*, under seven years of age.

CHILDREN UNDER INSTRUCTION ON FARMS.

10. During the last session of Parliament, the Legislature sanctioned the regulations which I had brought to the notice of the Government in my two last annual reports, for examining children under private instruction by tutors and governesses, and for making grants of money in proportion to the number of pupils under regular instruction and the standards of their attainments.

11. The reiterated complaints about the inability of many of the farmers both in the agricultural and the pastoral districts to avail themselves of the ordinary public schools in towns, and even of the district boarding schools, appeared to call for special legislation, and perhaps the limited number of

applications for aid under the new rules is not to be interpreted to mean that those complaints were exaggerated, but rather indicates the slowness of the residents in the back districts to apprehend and use the privilege offered to them.

12. The number of applications for aid has been 44; of these 10 have been dealt with, and the sum of £137 5s. has been paid as capitation allowances for 83 pupils found to have been under instruction for the past twelve months on the following farms:—

13. Most of the applicants had overlooked the condition that the allowances can be claimed only for children who have been under instruction for full twelve months. Hence the payment in these cases is delayed.

14. As the examination of the children by a qualified person is necessary, I have used the services of the teachers of the nearest public schools. By thus visiting the farms and examining the scholars, the public teachers will become intimately acquainted with the wants of their districts, and a link will be made between the public school of the town and these embryo schools in outlying localities. The teacher can do much by advice and encouragement in his capacity as sub-inspector; and I hope that the farmers will be led to regard the public school as the institution to which, if possible, they must send their children to complete their schooling.

HIGHER EDUCATION ACT.

15. In the five colleges and institutions for higher and professional education, aided by grants under the provisions of the Act No. 24 of 1874, there have been 315 students: of these, 244 were studying in the matriculation course, 52 were preparing for the B.A. examinations, and 19 were candidates for the survey certificate.

STAFF OF PROFESSORS AND TEACHERS.

17. The number of professors and lecturers in the colleges was 21; in undenominational public schools and district boarding schools there were 266 male and 202 female teachers; in ordinary mission schools, 288 male and 466 female teachers; in schools among the aborigines there were 248 male and 136 female teachers. In the native industrial schools and departments 16 trade teachers (male) and 63 sewing mistresses were employed.

ANNUAL EXPENDITURE.

19. It will be seen from the Table I. (appended), prepared by the Accounting Officer, that the Government Expenditure (including that in Basutoland for six months), was £99,918; and from the returns furnished by the local managers of the various schools, the local expenditure for the year was £101,644. The total annual expenditure was £201,562.

20. The Government expenditure embraces ten chief items, and as some misapprehension exists as to the proportionate distribution of the Government Grants, I have calculated the percentage which each item represents of the whole. The agencies which are supported for the education of the white population absorb 39 per cent.; those for children of mixed races about 19 per cent.; and those for the general and industrial instruction of the aborigines both

within the Colony proper and also in the Transkeian Territories, 21 per cent. The complete analysis is as follows:—

COST OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

23. The annual cost to Government of each student in Colleges aided under the Higher Education Act, calculated according to the ordinary attendance was £13 14s. 7d.

24. The further equipment of Chemical Laboratories will necessarily lead to some additional cost; and proper experimental-fields should be worked in connection with the laboratories, both in Cape Town and Stellenbosch.

25. At Stellenbosch a laboratory assistant has been employed since July, and experiments on vegetation may now fitly be included in the course.

26. In the South African College the following work was done during the year:—

Junior Students.—The work comprised the preparation of chemical compounds from metals and ores, the preparation of metals from ores, and the qualitative analysis of simple compounds.

Advanced Students.—The work comprised: (1) The qualitative and quantitative analysis of grapes, unfermented and fermented grape-juice, wine, vinegar, mineral waters, ores, soils, manures, and colonial tobacco. (2) The synthetical preparation of organic compounds of a more complicated composition, determinations of the vapour density of volatile organic compounds, determinations of molecular weights of organic compounds, and volumetric analysis. (3) A series of experiments referring to the fermentation of grape-juice at different temperatures. These experiments will be continued this year during the pressing season.

TEACHERS' EXAMINATIONS, 1884.

27. The annual examinations of teachers and other candidates for certificates were held in July and September.

28. At the middle class examination there were 13 candidates; 1 gained the certificate with honours; to 7, certificates of competency were awarded; 4 gained provisional certificates; and 1 withdrew on account of ill-health from the examination.

29. The result of the elementary teachers' examination was, as follows:—

Certificates with honours were issued to 35 candidates; and certificates of competency to 98 candidates.

Of those who failed, 226 were weak in all subjects; 3 failed in school management; and 1 in school management and handwriting.

Of the candidates who obtained certificates with honours, 2 were European boys, and 33 were European girls.

Of the candidates who passed, 10 were European boys; 70 were European girls; 14 were native boys; and 4 native girls.

The candidates who failed were:—

37 European boys; 86 European girls.

91 native boys; and 16 native girls.

ART SCHOOLS.

30. In connection with the Cape Town School of Art, an annual competition for certificates of proficiency was instituted in 1883.

31. The second examination took place in May, 1884, and the examiners notified the great improvement that appeared in the exhibits as compared with those of the previous year, and they referred particularly to the architectural drawings, as well as freehand drawing generally.

32. In 1883, certificates were issued to 122 candidates, and in 1884 to 133.

INSPECTION OF SCHOOLS.

33. By the resignation of Mr. T. Lewis in September the staff of inspectors has been reduced; it was not deemed advisable to renew Mr. Brady's acting appointment as Deputy Inspector of Colleges and Schools; the staff will now consist of Mr. A. N. Rowan, Mr. F. Howe Ely, Mr. J. Samuel, and Mr. J. H. Brady, B.A., Deputy Inspectors of Schools for the Colony, and the Rev. H. R. Woodrooffe, M.A., Deputy Inspector for the schools beyond the Kei.

35. As a guide to the Deputy Inspectors in reporting on the various schools, the following percentages are regarded as indicating the lowest satisfactory standards of attainments:—

SCHOOLS FOR THE ABORIGINES.

36. As the native schools have been subjected to severe criticism during the last two years, and the results have been often considered as an inadequate return for the money spent on them, I requested the Rev. Canon Woodroffe, the Deputy Inspector of Schools in the Transkei Territories, to report specially on the subject.

37. In addition to the grants from this Department, the Inspector considers that £20 per annum is spent on an average by the natives on each of their schools; and their contributions are paid more regularly than before.

38. The Inspector has made it his business to try and ascertain how far social life among the Aborigines is affected by the system of education which is maintained for their benefit, and he concludes that the schools are doing honest work in the right direction.

39. On comparing last year's work with previous returns, there is improvement both in schools and teachers.

40. Canon Woodroffe's important letter, dated 5th January, 1885, is given, in full, in the Appendix to this Report.

41. It must be remembered that the objects of the Native Educational system are only (*a*) elementary instruction, and (*b*) industrial training, and the gradual development of the system throughout the native territories is steadily aimed at; here and there an educated native may aspire to University distinctions, but it is more to the interest of the people and of the Government, that the mass should be gradually reached by schools and workshops than that one or two native lads should outstrip their fellows and win Academic degrees. In Fingoland where the Day School system is more developed than in the other Transkei Territories, the Inspector reported that in 1883, the average number of scholars in each school was 48; in 1884, it was 52. 78 per cent. of children on the books were present at inspection last year as against 72 per cent. in 1883. 34 per cent. passed a standard, and 4·9 per cent. passed in standards 3 and 4 as against 31 per cent. and 4·1 per cent. in 1883. This progress is small but definite.

CENSUS OF SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.

42. It is evident that no trustworthy conclusions can be arrived at in regard to the number of children at school throughout the Colony until annual returns of attendance can be obtained from all private teachers. Under the provisions of the *Education Act Amendment Act* of the Colony of

Victoria, all private teachers are required under penalty to furnish to the Government annually returns of the number of children under their instruction, and the importance of having accurate and complete educational statistics would justify the Government here in requiring similar returns; and I am satisfied that few private teachers would begrudge the preparation of so simple but useful a statement.

TRUANCY.

43. In my Report for 1880, I recommended the employment of truant officers in the more populous towns, who should traverse the streets during the ordinary school-hours, and take any children of school-going age who may be found loitering or playing in the streets or other places of public resort during school-hours, to the homes of their parents, and thus ascertain the cause of their neglect to attend school. In most cases, such action regularly followed up, would be a deterrent to truancy: at all events the plan is worth a trial. From the Report of the Minister of Public Instruction in Victoria, I find that such a surveillance has been fairly successful, and the truant officers by their inquiries have repressed truancy, and also detected many children who do not attend school at all.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION.

44. In regard to school organization, the difficulty is to provide against the ill effects of excessive heat, as so many buildings are roofed with iron.

45. The ordinary requirements of at least 80 cubic feet of internal space, and 8 square feet of internal area for each unit of average attendance are probably observed in most schools; but the neglect to provide some non-conductor of heat, e.g., layers of saw dust, or the *brandzolder*, between the ceiling and the roof, causes during the summer season much nervous depression which is fatal to memory lessons and in fact to all successful study. We should probably hear little of over-pressure if the unwholesome conditions, particularly scanty, poor, and irregular diet, under which work has to be done, could be remedied.

46. In the superior schools, and in the departments frequented by the bigger girls and boys, the long length desks and seats are being superseded by the 'dual' with a back-rest.

47. Seats without back-rests are pretty generally condemned by medical authorities, and teachers are becoming more alive to the recognition of the intimate relation between successful study and physical comfort.

48. Pupil-teachers are not regarded as a part of the teaching staff in public schools. Teachers, whether principal or assistant, are expected to be qualified; and where a fully equipped school offers facilities for training candidates for employment as elementary teachers, pupil-teachers are allowed as far as the circumstances permit. Latterly the number has been reduced, as the supply of elementary teachers appeared to be in excess of the demand. The standard of admission to the office of pupil-teacher is gradually being raised, and the qualification for the office of elementary teacher will, of course, be raised proportionally.

CONCLUDING REMARKS.

49. In a year of general depression and universal political agitation, it has been an anxious duty to arrest the decay or threatened collapse of many a school. I am satisfied to feel that although no great extension of elementary schools can be recorded, there has been no serious retrogression. Distress and drought have thinned the attendance, especially in boarding schools; the absolute want of food has told against both the daily attendance and the standard of work in many Missionary schools; the indirect action of political questions, bearing on the differences of race and language, saps the best

interests of several schools. Those who reside in secluded districts, where the wholesome enlightenment of the daily newspaper never breaks through their intellectual dulness, are easily deluded into the belief that the Government School is an enemy to their tongue and their faith; and even here and there a Minister of Religion has taken advantage of the credulity of his own flock to stigmatise the conscience clauses of the Educational Code as an infringement on religious freedom.

50. The fact is that in the majority of schools among the Dutch-speaking population, satisfactory arrangements have been made by the managers, not only with my concurrence, but on my advice, to give regular and adequate instruction in the Dutch language; and as regards the religious instruction, the Department leaves the managers perfectly free to make their own arrangements, provided that no scholars are compelled to receive that instruction without the consent of their parents or guardians. This is surely a most reasonable provision where there are scholars whose parents may be Jews, or Roman Catholics, or adherents of the Dutch Reformed Church, or of the Church of England, or the Wesleyan Society, or other religious communities.

APPENDIX D.—SPECIAL REPORT OF THE DEPUTY-INSPECTOR, TRANSKEI.

Somerset East, 5th January, 1885.
The Superintendent-General of Education, &c., &c.,
Cape Town.

SIR,—During the past year I have begun and completed a tour of inspection of all the schools in the Transkei territories.

In addition to the somewhat bare statements of my monthly reports, it is, as I conceive, my duty to furnish you with fuller information concerning the state and progress of education in those regions, and also to make known to you my own impressions.

I have as a rule not been content with a mere inspection, but whenever opportunity offered I have conversed with both christian and heathen about the schools in order to ascertain how far their social life is affected by the system of education which is being maintained for their benefit.

I have also to thank many European residents for imparting to me the results of their own experience.

Since the utility of this system of education and the expediency of bestowing grants in aid thereof have been questioned, it appeared right that no source of arriving at the whole truth ought to be neglected.

In Fingoland the schools are pretty evenly distributed throughout the whole district; in Tembuland they are more widely scattered; and in Griqualand East, with the exception of the Umzimkulu Magistracy, the distances between the schools are great, ranging sometimes from 30 to 50 miles.

The aided schools in these native territories number rather more than 160; the average number of scholars in each is 52, of whom 80 per cent. were present at inspection.

By this means an important and beneficial educational work is being carried on.

One aspect of its importance and benefit is so little thought of, that I desire to bring it under your special notice.

There are persons who look upon education as the general remedy for all social and political evils; such persons are frequently disappointed, they expect too much.

Education does very little towards diminishing crime; but still less does it increase it. Under the conditions of modern civilization, we are free from peasant insurrections and prolonged civil wars, but we have no lack of offenders against the law, just as fresh forms of disease are continually being produced, though the plague and the black death no longer depopulate whole districts; and education, which is a part of the highest civilization, tends to prevent outbreaks and rebellions and scenes of blood, though it cannot root out crime; magistrates will still be necessary, and convicted prisoners will continue to dally with their hard labour.

If the native territories are to be well governed, surely a system of education will be as conducive to good government in them as everywhere else. And these native schools are doing honest work in the right direction. They might, no doubt, be much improved, but they are steadily contributing towards a more settled order of things. Their tendency is on the side of loyalty and progress; they help those who try to better themselves; and their abolition would be a disastrous blow to the prospects of the country, and would deaden the best aspirations of the higher class of natives. The schools have enemies at their own gates, who would rejoice at their abolition, and who long to see the power of the chiefs regained and the white man's yoke shaken off; the very existence of this hostility proves that a wholesome influence is working with success.

And there is another aspect of this subject upon which I trust I may be permitted to touch. The Transkei Territories have the reputation of being a sadly expensive appanage to the Colony, and on this ground it is possible that the Education Grants may be regarded with disfavour. This expenditure is mainly owing to the large armed force which has been equipped and maintained, its cost being charged to the revenue of the native territories, while it really belongs to the Colony. But along with this, another fact may justly be taken into account. In proportion to its area, Fingoland contributes more largely to the revenue than any part of the Eastern Districts with which I am acquainted. It possesses sixty trading stations, a number which indicates a large amount both of production and of consumption, and in the distribution of public money, this may fairly be made a consideration.

Of the sums expended upon schools in addition to the Government aid, I have not been able to obtain accurate statistics. From all sources, I may safely aver that over £20 a year is spent upon each school on the average. The people's contribution is paid more regularly, and continual efforts are made towards building. The sum of £140 was subscribed at the opening of Xume School, and there is no great difficulty in obtaining £60 or £80 when a new building is required.

As the standard of attainment and the general school work are carefully reported to yourself month by month, little remark is called for under these heads. It will be sufficient to state that the schools are fairly attended and taught, and that inefficient schools are not allowed to continue in receipt of public money.

A considerable number of children of European origin attend these schools whose parents have often expressed to me their satisfaction at the progress made.

Upon a comparison of this year's with last year's inspection, I find an improvement both in schools and in teachers, and there is every reason to expect that year by year the Inspector's Report will show a steady advance.
