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# CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.

## REPORT of the Superintendent-General of Education for the Year 1886.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by command of His Excellency the Governor.  
1887.

### (I.)—REPORT.

SIR,—I do myself the honour to submit to the Government my Annual Report on the proceedings of the Department of Public Education.

### ENROLMENT.

2. During the year ended 30th June, 1886, there were 1,107 Schools and Institutions in operation; of these, 223 were new Schools. From various causes, 64 Schools were closed during some portion of the year. The annual enrolment of scholars was 75,737; the highest quarterly enrolment was 56,446; and the ordinary daily attendance was 39,231.

### INSPECTION.

3. The number of Schools inspected was 845; 34,491 children were present at inspection and were classified after examination, as follows:—

4. The results of examination show annually a steady progress, and the number of scholars classed in Standard V is satisfactory. The figures for the last three years are:—

5. The Standards include only elementary subjects of instruction, and those scholars who are engaged in the higher subjects and also in subjects of a special character are reported on separately. It is ascertained from the Returns that the number of scholars learning such subjects is as follows:—

#### CHILDREN UNDER INSTRUCTION ON FARMS.

6. The new regulations for aiding private schools on farms appear to be favourably regarded, and the number of schools thus aided, after inspection, amounted to 135 during the year.

The number of scholars was 1,082; of whom 1,060 were present at inspection and were examined; 688 were instructed in English only, 82 in Dutch only; the rest both in English and Dutch.

7. In a few schools, the persons employed as tutors were reported to be incompetent; but as the capitation grant is doubled when a certificated teacher is employed, the inferior class of so-called tutors will soon be superseded. In several Schools, a fair rate of attainments is shown. The inspection itself is useful, not only because it acts as a stimulus to teacher and children, but because it brings to light deficiencies in method and in materials; and the gradual distribution of approved illustrated school-books and other modern appliances will be of great service in awakening the faculty of observation among children brought up in the monotony of a secluded farm life. I am indebted to the masters of the public schools for their valuable assistance in visiting and examining these schools; the work could not be overtaken by the ordinary Deputy-Inspectors of Schools, whose circuits are already too large.

#### EXAMINATIONS OF CANDIDATES FOR TEACHERS' CERTIFICATES.

8. At the June Examination, Certificates with Honours were issued to six candidates for the Middle Class Teacher's Certificate; and Certificates of Competency to 14 Candidates. All the candidates, except one who passed in Honours, had been trained in the Normal College, Cape Town. There were 19 male and one female candidates.

9. The Examination for the 3rd Class Teacher's Certificate was held on 28th September and two following days. 243 candidates were present: of these, 26 obtained the Certificate with Honours; 69 obtained Certificates of Competency; and Provisional Certificates were issued to 32 native candidates.

10. The Dutch language and free hand drawing are no longer regarded as extra subjects, but are included in the general programme, and those candidates who passed in either or both of these subjects thereby improved their position on the list.

11. A full report on the results of the Examination was published in the *Government Gazette*, by Government Notice, No. 936 of 1886.

12. In future, no candidates under 17 years of age will be accepted.

13. Owing to the marked neglect of free-hand drawing, which is an indispensable art for all teachers who make use of the blackboard, I have been discouraged from adding the theory of music to the subjects of Examination.

#### COLLEGES UNDER THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACT.

15. In the four aided Colleges, there have been 266 Students; 180 were preparing for Matriculation in the University; 70 for the Intermediate and B.A. Examinations; 15 for the Survey; and 1 for M.A.

## TEACHING STAFF.

18. The teaching staff was composed of 20 professors and lecturers; 282 male teachers and 225 female teachers in public and district boarding schools; and in the ordinary mission schools 265 male and 393 female teachers.

19. In the Aborigines' Day Schools 179 male and 130 female teachers; in the industrial schools and departments, 16 trade teachers, male, and 74 sewing mistresses.

In special institutions, 8 male and 4 female teachers.

## REMARKS ON FARM SCHOOLS.

20. The growth of the private farm schools is the most noticeable feature of the year.

21. That the children of the poorest class of farmers and *bijwoners* have been yet fairly reached by this new agency, I do not pretend to say: but there is evidence to show that as the plan of aid becomes known and confidence in the Department strengthened, schools will be kept among them, not indeed by superior teachers, for the poverty of many a farmer prevents him

from offering any but a nominal salary, and the local surroundings would be in themselves discouraging to persons accustomed to the comforts of civilized life. Perhaps the solution is already at hand, as I find several farmers employing their elder daughters as governesses, on their return home from the village school; the only salary being the grant earned for attendance and results of the annual examination.

22. Some teachers of public schools have taken alarm at the prospect of children being withdrawn to be instructed at home, especially where the *minimum* number of five cannot be made up by other scholars; and again, it is thought that where there are only five children under instruction on the farm, the farmer will be deterred from sending the eldest one to complete his or her studies at the town public school, because the claim for aid to the farm school would be then disallowed on account of the fewness of children.

23. The cases might be met by allowing the child who attends a public school to count for the capitation grant, as belonging to the farm. It is an advantage for the children to finish their education at the public schools; life for a year in a well-ordered town school is an education in itself to a farmer's boy.

24. That the farmers avail themselves freely of the various agencies promoted by the Educational Department is shown by the returns of the number of farmers' children in actual attendance in the schools.

25. These inquiries were instituted in consequence of a Return of attendance of farmers' children in 3rd Class Schools and Boarding Schools having been called for by the Honourable the Legislative Council.

## EXTENSION OF THE ELEMENTARY STANDARDS.

26. The majority of the scholars in the Public Schools do not present themselves for the examinations conducted by the University; and it is not desirable to encourage them to give special attention to those studies in classical literature and mathematics which are deemed necessary as a preparation for the University course; there is, therefore, a demand for a certificate to be put within their reach for excellence or competency in the usual branches of a modern elementary education, without requiring either Latin or mathematics. At the same time there is a need for increased attention to Natural sciences, and especially to those branches which have a direct bearing on the practical industries of colonial life.

27. To meet these ends, the Standard VI has been added; and from January, 1887, the following revised code will be acted upon.

## STANDARD V.

Scholars presented for Standard V must have previously passed in Standard IV, and must satisfy the Inspector in :—

1. Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.
2. Outlines of History (England and Cape Colony).
3. Physical Geography.
4. Lessons on Natural Objects.

## STANDARD VI. (Highest.)

Scholars presented must have previously passed in Standard V, and must satisfy the Inspector in :—

- either or both } (1.) Reading and Writing English correctly ; and Handwriting.  
 (2.) Reading and Writing Dutch correctly ; and Handwriting.  
 (3.) Commercial Arithmetic. Exercises to test readiness and accuracy.

And in *two* of the following subjects as laid down in the Course of Instruction in Undenominational Public Schools, viz. :—

- (4.) The Elements of Natural Science.
- (5.) Principles of Agriculture (for boys only).
- (6.) Elements of Chemistry.
- (7.) Geology.
- (8.) Mineralogy.
- (9.) Botany.
- (10.) Animal Physiology.
- (11.) Domestic Economy and Laws of Health (for girls only).

To those who pass, a Certificate will be issued, known as the "Public Schools Certificate," and degrees of merit will be noted by the words, *Honours* or *Competency*.

28. The Inspectors report separately on the higher branches of Instruction in schools of the first and second classes and on the object lessons given in the elementary schools ; also on free-hand drawing and plain needlework.

## GOOD SERVICE ALLOWANCES.

29. In 1875, the Government sanctioned my proposal for a system of Good Service Allowances to teachers, after completion of five years' continuous and meritorious service.

30. A sum of money has been voted from year to year by Parliament, and this has been distributed annually on a uniform and fixed scale, except during the current year when owing to the smaller amount voted for this service, a reduction of the rates had to be made.

31. In 1879, I had prepared a scheme for superannuation allowances to teachers, which was set aside pending the inquiries of the Education Commission, then appointed ; the scheme was afterwards submitted with evidence to the Commission and approved in their report, June, 1880.

32. I now propose to define, by an Act of Parliament, the conditions on which teachers shall become entitled to Good Service Allowances, and the rates of Good Service Allowances payable to the respective classes of teachers ; and to provide for the continuance of the Good Service Allowances to teachers who retire from active service, by reason of age or incapacity.

33. The Act should provide, *inter alia*, that (1) no teacher should be entitled to have his name put on the Good Service List until he has completed five years' continuous and meritorious service, and unless the school conducted by him is reported, after inspection, as excellent, and the course of instruction laid down in the Government regulations is carried out with marked efficiency ; that (2) the following be the scale of Good Service Allowances :—

that (3) every teacher who is on the Good Service List shall on his retirement from active service, by reason of his having reached 60 years of age, or of his being incapacitated by ill-health, continue to receive the annual good service allowance for the rest of his life, with an annual addition of 50 per

cent. for a service of 15 years and under 20 years; 75 per cent. for a service of 20 years and under 30 years; and 100 per cent. for a service of 30 years and upwards.

34. The teacher of a Public First Class School would thus draw an allowance of £100 per annum; of the 2nd Class, £60 per annum; of the 3rd Class, £40 per annum, on retiring after the completion of 30 years' good service; and so on through the lower grades of schools.

35. Under the schedule of the Higher Education Act, as amended in 1882, it is provided in Section 6 that when the Government is satisfied that a professor or lecturer, appointed under the Act, has completed five years continuous and meritorious service, a special addition to the ordinary grant not exceeding £100 may be made annually to such professor or lecturer, so long as he performs the duties of his professorship or lectureship to the satisfaction of the Government.

36. It is also proposed that every professor or lecturer who is in receipt of the special merit grant shall on retirement from active service, by reason of his having reached 60 years of age, or his being incapacitated by ill-health, continue to receive the annual grant for the rest of his life, with an annual addition to it of 25 per cent. for a service of fifteen years and under 20 years, and of 50 per cent. for 20 years' service and upwards.

#### NATIVE INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTIONS AND SCHOOLS.

##### COLONIAL.

37. The Industrial Institutions within the Colony include the Kafir College, Graham's Town, the Native Institutions at St. Matthew's, Keiskama Hoek, and St. Luke's, Newlands; the Heald Town Training School, the Free Church Institutions for boys and girls at Lovedale, and a few minor stations.

38. The Kafir College at Zonnebloem has practically ceased to be a Native Institution, being attended by very few native lads. The boarders are chiefly children of European parents whose circumstances are such as to need help. The College is thus usefully filling the place of a District Boarding School for sons of the poorer European families; and its function is quite within the provisions of the Trust Deed.

39. Although the expenditure has been kept within the narrowest limits and did not exceed £8,733 for the year, the reports on the work of these Institutions continue favourable. The fullest details of each will be found in the Appendix A.

#### NATIVE INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTIONS AND SCHOOLS.

##### TRANSKEI.

40. The expenditure in the territories of Transkei, Tembuland, and East Griqualand has been reduced to £9,877 for the year; and owing to the reduced vote for 1886-7, the grants to Native Boarders are now suspended except in a few cases where native scholars are being trained as teachers. The staff of trade-teachers and apprentices is also reduced.

41. Any further retrenchment in the grants for salaries or for workshops will, in effect, break up the whole system of Native Education, just at a time when the natives are most eager to get their children instructed and when it is universally acknowledged that the school and the work-shop are the best securities for peace.

42. Inspector Woodrooffe has furnished a general report which is given, in full, in Appendix B.

#### EUROPEAN SCHOOLS, TRANSKEI.

43. It must be noted that the expenditure for the education of children

of European parentage in these territories is also included in the amount above-named. There are many applications for the extension of Undenominational Public Schools among the people of these districts. Public schools of this class have been already established at Butterworth, Embokotwa (2), Engcobo, Cala, Nthlambe, Springs, and Hopewell.

#### GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURE.

44. The ordinary Educational expenditure for the year amounted to £77,137 14s. 2d.; the various items are:—

46. From the interest on the "Slave Compensation and Bible and School Funds" a sum of £547 10s. was spent on pupil teachers in missionary schools.

47. A complete statement in detail of the expenditure is given by the Accounting Officer in Tables I. and II. appended to this Report; from these it will be seen that, whilst the total State Expenditure for the year was £91,663 18s., the Local Expenditure on the part of the Managers was £112,315 0s. 11d.

The State Expenditure on Aborigines' Schools was met by an equal amount expended by the local Managers.

#### ADMINISTRATION.

48. During the last two years, the reduction of the vote for the purposes of public education has placed the department in a dilemma. It is my function to encourage the growth of schools and to co-operate with the managers in making them efficient; and yet to keep the state expenditure within the prescribed limits, applications for aid have been necessarily declined, and the outfit of elementary schools with approved school requisites has been temporarily suspended.

49. The promoters of new schools as well as managers, who wish to extend and improve existing schools, justly complain if when they have fulfilled, on their part, the conditions of aid as laid down in the regulations approved by both Houses of Parliament, the Administrator on the part of the Government is precluded from entertaining their applications; and as few people understand the working of a public department, the refusal is looked upon as a personal slight, if not as a breach of faith.

50. It is self-evident that if the progress of education is to be uniform and well-sustained, these intermittent periods of stopping the supplies must be avoided.

51. To keep the expenditure down to the amount actually voted, it became necessary to reduce the Good Service Allowance or merit grant to professors and lecturers in colleges and to teachers generally.

52. In the larger schools of the First Class, where the maximum grants were being issued, it was also found necessary to reduce the Grants in aid of salaries, both of Principals and Assistants; in this way and by the lowering of many grants on the representations of the managers of their inability to meet the Government Grant by an equivalent payment, the unavoidable retrenchment has been made.

53. The grants in aid of salaries of teachers of Native schools throughout the Transkeian territories were reduced on a uniform scale of 20 per cent.

54. The revised instructions to the Deputy Inspectors of Schools were published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th January, 1887, for the information of managers and teachers; and at a conference with three of the Deputy Inspectors, Messrs. Rowan, Ely and Brady, the arrangements for the examination of scholars in the new 6th Standard were considered and fixed.

55. It is thought desirable to restrict the examination of scholars in Native Day Schools to Standards I-IV; and in Native Boarding Institutions and Ordinary Mission Schools to Standards I-V. The scholars in the Undenominational Public Schools may be presented for examination in Standards I-VI.

56. I regret that the expenses of education in many of the first-class schools deter parents from sending their children to them; at the same time it is gratifying to notice that in several cases free education has been given, or a portion of the school fees has been remitted. From returns furnished at my request, it appears that the number of free scholars was 449; and the number of scholars paying reduced fees, 96; and that the value of the free education thus given, if estimated by what the scholars would pay at the usual rates of fees, was for the year £2,709 7s. 0d.

#### NATIVE FEES AND GOVERNMENT GRANTS.

In order to remove the erroneous impression that exists in the minds of many people, that in Institutions aided by Government Grants, the natives do little or nothing for themselves, we submit, as in former years, a statement of the fees received from native sources since the system of payment was first adopted at Lovedale. For aided cases about  $7\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. in ordinary years may be deducted, and the remainder may be regarded as strictly Native payments. It will be seen that they amount to the large sum of over Seventeen Thousand Pounds.

#### GIRLS' WORK DEPARTMENT.

The year 1886 has been marked by no special features, the daily routine having gone steadily on.

The girls have had less supervision (especially during the last session), from the absence of the teacher every day from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., when she was otherwise engaged.

This has developed self-reliance in some of the workers; and in very few instances has advantage been taken of it in the way of idleness.

The work has been very varied, comprising the usual washing, ironing, and mending, and the sewing and cutting out of coats, trowsers, shirts, dresses, baby linen, and under-clothing.

#### INDUSTRIAL DEPARTMENTS.

In the Wagon-making Department, the year has been marked by an almost entire absence of orders for wagons. A new transport wagon was built for the Indian and Colonial Exhibition, and some wagons built in previous years have been sold; but the chief work of the year has been repairs, the making of Scotch carts and other articles as stock, and some agricultural implements. We should be glad to supply 40 strongly made wheel-barrows to any one who could dispose of them.

The Blacksmith's Department has been employed also in work connected with the Wagon-making Department, in repairs, and in making up a small quantity of stock.

To the Carpenter's Department the same remarks as above will apply, and a number of articles have been made in the hope of being sold further on.

In the Printing and Bookbinding there has been more activity, and the publication of a Kaffir Grammar, a volume of South African Poems, the two newspapers, and the Lovedale Register, besides occasional work, have occupied the year.

In the Farm Department a rather larger area of land has been under cultivation. The crop of maize was over 1,000 bags; of wheat, not yet

completely reaped, about 300 bags; barley, 100 bags; and potatoes and beans, 100 bags; besides some other crops, such as pumpkins and forage. The chief improvement of the year has been the planting of maize in drills so arranged as to admit of the use of horse-hoes lengthways and across, and so to reduce the cost and labour involved in hand-hoeing.

From the Book Department the report is, that though scholars and individuals are still economising, a fair amount of school material has been disposed of.

#### BOARDING DEPARTMENT.

The Native Boarders, out of school hours, all work two hours daily, and a good deal of necessary and useful work is done by them in the course of a year. The larger number of them are employed at garden, farm, or other outside work.

#### GRAHAM'S TOWN (KAFIR INSTITUTION).

2 Departments. I. School; II. Industrial Department.

I. School.—Principal, Revd. R. J. Mullins; assistants, H. Mtobi and P. Kawa. Registered, 24 boys; present all.

The school accommodation and apparatus are excellent. The dormitory arrangements are simple and quite satisfactory. The money-fee charged is very small, and the boys themselves help towards their support by working two hours every afternoon in the garden.

Class I. 10 boys; reading (Royal Reader V) fair; dictation, 5 good, 3 fair, 2 bad; parsing, 2 good, rest fair; analysis, 2 good, 2 fair, 1 moderate, 5 bad; geography very fair; writing careful and promising; arithmetic (Standard V), 2 good, 4 fair, 2 moderate, 2 bad; history, 2 good, 1 fair, rest poor; physical geography, 3 good, 5 moderate, 2 bad; 2 reached Standard V, 6 Standard IV, 2 Standard III.

Class II. 14 boys; reading (Royal Reader III) fair, explanation weak; dictation, 9 good, 3 fair, 2 bad; parsing (elements) moderate; geography (Africa and Asia) fair; writing careful; arithmetic (various stages up to Standard IV), 11 good, 1 fair, 2 bad; 1 reached Standard IV, 10 Standard III, 3 Standard II.

Apprentices.—The 9 apprentices have 2 hours school work every night; they were at various stages; 1 reached Standard IV, 1 Standard III, 2 Standard II, 3 Standard I, and 1 was below.

As far as I could judge, excellent carpenter's and cabinet-maker's work was being turned out by these boys. The various articles made by them were not only strong and honest looking, but well finished and neat. Their exhibit was awarded a medal at the Port Elizabeth Exhibition. The production, however, I am sorry to hear, exceeds the demand. I was also informed that though industrious, the boys were not quick workers.

I. Boarding Department.—The buildings are in a fair state of order and repair; dormitories spacious and airy. At my visit there were 22 boarders.

II. Industrial Department.—Carpentry and printing still continue to receive attention: shoemaking has been discontinued.

III. Day School.—The schoolrooms (2) are large, well lighted, ventilated, and furnished; boarded floors. Registers made up to date; calendar and time-tables posted.

On the books, 46 boys. Present, 40 boys.

REV. H. R. WOODROOFFE'S REPORT ON THE SCHOOLS IN THE  
TRANSKEIAN TERRITORIES.

Graham's Town,  
30th December, 1886.

SIR,—At the close of another year's inspection of schools, I have the honour to offer some remarks upon the educational condition and circumstances of the Transkei territories.

During the past few years their population has been largely increased; according to the latest returns they now contain 12,000 Europeans and 316,000 natives. That is, they contain between one-third and one-fourth of the entire number of persons who are under our Cape Government. And the European population is still receiving additions by immigration from the Colony.

Among the Europeans no general attempt has hitherto been made to procure the advantages of education for the very large number of young people who are now growing up without them. A few isolated schools have been opened, but their existence is for the most part precarious. An extensive want remains to be supplied; and there is great difficulty in supplying it. Many of the inhabitants are so poor that all they can do is to obtain a bare livelihood; others find that they have bought land at a price which is the opposite of remunerative, and are poorer than when they arrived. Under the Drakensberg range, and where the Europeans are most numerous, scarcely a school is to be found. The allotment holders on the Embokotwa have succeeded in establishing two schools, and deserve praise for the efforts that they are making in spite of their straitened circumstances. But the Slang River Settlement has no school that I am aware of; there is none as yet among the allotment holders in Maxonga's Hoek, or in the wide districts of Kokstad and Maclear. I hope that before long aided schools may be opened in those portions of the country where the less scattered population will enable a sufficient attendance to be maintained. This I have not failed to urge whenever opportunity has occurred.

Many enquiries have been put to me about the Regulations affecting schools for the children of farmers and others. Now that the whole country has been formally annexed to the Colony, I trust that there will be no difficulty in granting the same benefits to these persons as those they would enjoy if they were living to the westward of the Kei.

In fact, taking the population of these territories as a whole, and the amount which it contributes directly and indirectly to the public revenue, it cannot be said to receive an excessive share of the grants issued from the Education Department.

The native schools have regained their numbers, which had fallen off during the period of hunger. In 145 schools inspected, the register of attendance showed an average per school of 53 scholars. In a few cases small-pox has interfered with the school work; but the disease appears now to be dying out; happily, it is not of a virulent type. But impoverished by bad seasons and cattle diseases, as well as by the difficulty of obtaining work, the natives have a hard struggle to maintain their schools. And the withdrawal of a portion of the grant has made it harder. They are, however, using more strenuous efforts than before to augment their contributions towards the salaries of their teachers. And in districts where there is no aided school, private schools are not infrequent; the number of these appear to be increasing. Some of these schools receive half from the Missionary Societies, but many of them are entirely supported by the natives themselves. There is a strong desire for education among them, and they are ready to make sacrifices in order to obtain it. There are many locations in which the school occupies a prominent place in the social life. It is an institution in which general interest is taken. If the grant be withdrawn, it is by no means certain that the school will cease to exist. In most cases the people will make some attempt to continue it. Now the native looks upon the Government not merely as his ruler, but as a power on which he depends for help towards his progress and elevation. And in so important a matter as education it is politic in the highest degree that he should be subject to Government control, and feel that he is under Government influence. Hitherto in the matter of education he has been treated on principles of humanity and justice—principles which are never put in force without producing beneficial results. But supposing that the policy of past years is reversed, and the school grants are withdrawn, the probable consequences will be that the progress of the native territories will be retarded, and the task of governing will become less easy.

The standard of attainments in native schools shows that some advance is being made. More scholars are being presented for Standard IV.,

although as a general rule I have advised teachers to limit their endeavours to presenting as many children as possible for Standard III. But the passes in these two Standards show an increase on the percentages of former years.

The needlework throughout is decidedly improved; in many schools the sewing is as good as can be reasonably desired; but cutting out does not receive so much attention as it ought.

Something has been done in school building; several new rooms have been erected, or are in a fair way towards completion. The actual amount thus expended cannot be ascertained with accuracy, as much work is performed by free labour. But the outlay is not inconsiderable. The school-chapel at the Tora cost at least £300. The material used is stone roughly dressed; the contract was taken by Europeans who thoroughly understood their work, and took pains with it. Other school-rooms lately finished have involved a cash expenditure of more than £100 each. In some, the whole of the work has been performed by native tradesmen.

One experience of my work in these territories appears to be worthy of mention. Wherever the best schools are to be found, there it is found that most pains are taken with road-making. In the Transkei Proper nearly every school has a wagon-road within easy distance. And in the Willowvale District roads have lately been constructed which show remarkable skill in engineering, without the aid of engineers; and the labour has been provided by the people themselves at no cost to the public funds.

During the year I have never met with the slightest incivility, or with any refusal to render assistance when the difficulties of travelling have required that I should ask for help. Of the generous kindness of the Europeans I cannot speak too gratefully.
