Review of Housing Programme

1. In the Housing Return for England and Wales, 31st March 1947, the Government indicated the lines on which housing work would proceed. Details of the progress made have been published monthly. The position was discussed in the White Paper on Capital Investment in 1948 (Cmd. 7268).

2. In that Paper it was stated that the housing programme would be reviewed in the summer of 1948 when it had been got into balance, and it was pointed out that the chief limiting factor was the amount of soft-wood that could be imported. The possibilities of such imports have been and are being closely examined. Definite conclusions have not yet been reached and a further statement on the scale of operations likely to be feasible during 1949 will be made as soon as the amount of timber that may become available can be more accurately estimated.

Provisional Level of Construction

3. In the meantime, local authorities in England and Wales are being told to go ahead on the basis that the present level of houses under construction—approximately 180,000—can be maintained. As more houses are now being finished than are being started, the letting of new contracts has recently been accelerated. How long this level of construction can be kept will depend on how much of our national resources we can afford to devote to housing, having regard to the many other calls upon them.

4. The effort to keep at this level is justified on economic as well as on social grounds. The economic recovery of the country will be retarded unless people can live under satisfactory conditions and housing facilities allow of mobility of labour.

Scale and Character of Programme

5. Since the end of the war, effort has been centred on providing accommodation for families without a separate home—estimated in 1945 as numbering 750,000. By this autumn, this objective should be reached—by new building, by conversion of existing premises and by repairs of unoccupied war-damaged houses. The total at the end of May was 674,912.

6. In some districts, these families will all be housed more quickly than in others. The outstanding demand can only be assessed by examining the local situation and finding out how many families still have no home of their own, the number and make-up of the families who are waiting for houses and the number who have applied to more than one local authority.

7. The present waiting lists of local authorities are likely to be swollen in a number of ways. It is intended towards the end of the year to ask local authorities to sift their waiting lists and report the results to the Ministry of Health.

8. The long-term programme must include new housing not only for those without a separate home but also for those who are now living in unfit houses that ought to be demolished. It must, moreover, provide for the maintenance and improvement of other existing houses. It can be executed only in stages as and when building resources permit.

9. For the timing of operations in particular districts it will be necessary in due course to survey the local conditions and to ascertain the needs in respect of slums and overcrowding.

Types of Housing

10. While the scale of the future programme is governed largely by supplies of materials and its character by the nature of local needs, the types of housing to be provided must accord with the needs disclosed by the study of local conditions. Since the end of the war, the new houses built have been mainly two-bedroom temporary houses and three-bedroom permanent houses. These types have been generally well suited to immediate requirements. In the continuing development of the housing programme, however, a greater variety of types will be required to meet the needs of the community at large—bigger houses for some families, smaller houses for others, and accommodation suitable for single and aged persons.

11. Each local authority will also be able to judge how far a contribution can be made by a better use of such of their existing housing as is not fully occupied. There may be advantage in transferring or exchanging tenancies. The Minister of Health has asked his Central Housing Advisory Committee to consider what advice he can offer to local authorities to assist them in exercising their statutory functions in the management of their property.

12. A revised Housing Manual is being prepared covering the varied forms of accommodation likely to be required in the future. It is hoped to issue the Manual by the end of the year.

Local Authority Allocations and Licences for Private Building

13. The numbers of houses that can be built in particular districts will be notified from time to time to the local authorities by the Principal Housing Officers of the Ministry of Health. These numbers will be determined by the amount of labour and materials estimated to be available and will comprise all the houses to be built in the district by or with the approval of the local authority.

14. In order to ensure that the new houses continue to go to those in most need the bulk of the houses must continue to be built by the local authorities. Provision will, however, continue to be made for the erection of houses under licence for miners, agricultural workers and key workers in the development areas and for the replacement of war-destroyed houses. It has been decided also to authorise local authorities when they think fit to issue some licences to private persons who desire to build houses for their own occupation. These houses will form part of the approved programme for the area, will be limited to a proportion of that programme, and will be subject to conditions as to size and sale price. The detailed arrangements have been set out in a Circular to local authorities.

Repairs and Reconditioning: Relaxation of Licensing

15. The building of new houses must continue to be the main part of the housing programme. But as most families must remain in the older houses many of which are unsatisfactory and deficient in modern amenities, the repair and maintenance and, where practicable, the improvement of these houses must be tackled.

16. The Government have already announced their intention to introduce legislation to facilitate the improvement of existing houses. They have also been reviewing the arrangements for the issue of licences for small works of repair and maintenance. The Minister of Works announced in the House of Commons on 21st June that the Government had decided now to free the smaller jobs from control by extending the limit of £10 in six months plus £2 in one month to £100 over the year. There is much urgent work to be done

to make or keep houses fit for habitation. While the continuing shortage of timber and steel makes it impossible to introduce any relaxation in the control over the use of these materials, there is a better supply of a number of building materials and components and it is believed that much work which is urgently required on grounds of health and safety can be carried out with the use only of materials that are readily obtainable. The raising of the licensing figure will make it easier for owners to carry out these works. If experience shows that the relaxation is used for non-essential purposes and that the progress of essential work is thereby impeded, the Government will feel obliged to review the position.

Quarterly Housing Returns

17. Since January 1946, Monthly Returns have been issued showing the progress in the country as a whole and also in the area of each individual local authority. The rate of building is now well established. The Government have come to the conclusion that in these circumstances it is no longer necessary to incur the expense and labour involved in publishing the comprehensive returns so frequently as once a month. After the next issue of the Housing Return the full Return and the Appendix B which sets out the progress of the individual local authorities will be published only once each quarter, i.e., showing the position at the end of September, December, March and June. For the other two months of each quarter it is proposed to publish jointly with Scotland a single Summary Table in the same form as on the first page of the existing Return. This will mean that information as to the total number of completed houses will continue to be issued once a month; whilst information on more detailed aspects of the programme and as to the progress of individual Local Authorities will be published once a quarter.

Housing Return for England and Wales as at 31st May, 1948

PERMANENT NON-TRADITIONAL HOUSES— LOCAL AUTHORITIES (except Permanent Aluminium Houses)

With the object of accelerating the rate at which houses can be erected a number of methods of house construction have been evolved which, for ease of reference, are known as "non-traditional". In Appendix A, Table 11, a list of the main types is given together with details regarding the numbers of each type for which tenders have been approved and the numbers completed. Information regarding the development of sites and the preparation of housing schemes for non-traditional houses is included in the figures shown in Appendix A, Tables 1, 2, 8 and 9, and is shown in detail in Table 2b.

USE OF EXISTING PREMISES

Apart from new building, additional accommodation for family units has also been provided by Local Authorities and by private builders under licence by the repair or adaptation of existing premises.

Information relating to accommodation provided by private builders under licence became available for the first time in April, 1946. That in respect of the repair of unoccupied war damaged dwellings may be incomplete for a few Local Authorities and the figures quoted are subject to adjustment. OTHER HOUSING ACCOMMODATION

A total of 31,678 flats and houses of less than 12 rooms was released from occupation by the Services and Government Departments over the period 1st May, 1945, to 30th April, 1948. Some of the dwellings on release were taken over by the Local Authorities.

The total number of requisitioned dwellings held by the Local Authorities for residential purposes was 96,778 at the end of May; of these 61,135 were situated in the London region.

Of the total of 96,778 requisitioned dwellings held by the Local Authorities, 69,275 were held at 31st March, 1945. From that date to 30th April, 1948, there was a net increase in unoccupied houses requisitioned by Local Authorities for residential purposes of 27,520 and 17 were released in May, 1948, making a net increase of 27,503 houses in the 38 months to 31st May, 1948.

SERVICE CAMPS—TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION

In addition to accommodation referred to above, there were at 31st May, 1948, 20,809 families occupying accommodation in 1,374 camps redundant to the needs of the Services or Government Departments, which had been offered to Local Authorities for housing purposes and were considered suitable for those purposes. In the main these camps had been taken over by Local Authorities as part of their pool of housing accommodation or were being managed by them on behalf of the Ministry of Health.

Those family units of accommodation included in the number quoted above that are shown in the Summary on page 7, are at least up to the standard of the temporary accommodation already included in the Summary.

Accommodation for a further 913 families was occupied in 115 camps which are still required for Government purposes, or are unsuitable for housing, or are still subject to decision as to their future use.

Accommodation in camps remaining under the control of Service Departments has been provided for 225 families of men still serving in the Forces.

PROGRESS OF INDIVIDUAL HOUSING AUTHORITIES

Of the total of 1,470 Authorities there were at the 31st May, 1948, 8 Authorities excluding L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs who had as yet no sites of which possession had been obtained. Of these Authorities 5 were urban areas (mainly small urban districts) and 3 rural districts; the population in these areas represents 0.062 per cent. of the total population of England and Wales. There were 8 Authorities excluding L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs who had not obtained authority to go to tender on a specific scheme. The population in the area of these Authorities represents 0.065 per cent. of the total population of England and Wales.

HOUSING LABOUR FORCE

Returns of the number of operatives aged 16 and over employed on the construction of new houses are now based on a new system of collecting the data recently instituted by the Ministry of Works. The estimate of 217,300 so employed in England and Wales at the end of May may still be incomplete and, therefore, subject to adjustment. It should be noted that this estimate relates to operatives engaged both on the construction of permanent houses and on the preparation of housing sites. The number employed on war damage repairs decreased from 80,300 at the end of April, 1948, to 78,300 at the end of May.

BUILDING MATERIALS AND COMPONENTS

Details of production of the more important building materials and components are included in Appendix A. The information relates to Great Britain as a whole; separate details in respect of England and Wales are not available. It should be noted that the production of the items listed is utilised not only for the construction of and installation in new dwellings but also for repairs and replacements and building work other than house building.

In general the production in any given month is not known until towards the end of the following month. It is not therefore always possible for the complete data relating to the month under review to be available in time for inclusion in the Return.

APPENDIX A—NOTES

The material contained in this Return is derived from a census of the housing position at 31st December, 1945, and the reports of subsequent progress completed by the Local Authorities. Certain information is obtained from Government Departments. Where this is the case the items concerned have been annotated. At the 10th June, 1948, reports of progress had not been received from 2 Authorities for the months of April and May and from 54 Authorities for the month of May. Reports of progress in May were due to be received by the 5th June, 1948. Reports received after 10th June arrived too late to be included in the figures shown in this report relating to progress in May. By 10th June, 1948, 1,414 reports had been received.

Classification of Urban and Rural Authorities

The classification of Urban Authorities other than the L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs into Large Towns and Cities, Medium Towns and Cities and Small Towns has been made in terms of population. The classification has been made as follows based on the estimated population at mid-1939 as returned by the Registrar General.

Regions

Certain changes in the composition of the Northern, North Midlands and North Western Region were made as from 1st April, 1946. As from that date the "North Eastern Region" became known as "East and West Ridings Region". The Description and composition of the Regions are now as follows:—

Northern	Cumberland, Durham, Northumberland, Westmorland and the North Riding of Yorkshire.
East and West Ridings	The East and West Ridings of Yorkshire.

Table 8 shows the numbers of sites at different stages from the initial stage of selection to the stage when the site is available for construction.

Between the selection of the site and the completion of houses ready for occupation there is a long chain of events equivalent to the "pipeline" of materials and components of mass production in the engineering industry.

In general the use of the site for housing requires consideration from the point of view of regional and town planning, local transport facilities and so on. Sites have then to be acquired, a layout agreed, and roads, sewers and other services provided generally in advance of beginning the actual erection of houses. The actual construction of the houses themselves is the final process in the chain of production, which also, of course, comprises the fabrication of building materials and components ready for use.

Table 9 shows the number of houses at different stages towards completion beginning with the preparation of house plans.

Many of the initial stages in the erection of houses such as the preparation of house plans, bills of quantities and the chain of events leading to the acceptance of a tender are, in many cases, undertaken concurrently with the work of developing the corresponding sites.

There is a marked variation during the course of the year in the monthly flow of imports into this country, due both to the logging seasons in the country of origin and to the freezing of the ports in the Baltic Sea and in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Normally the bulk of imports arrive in this country in the latter part of the calendar year.

NOTES

1. An alphabetical index of Regions and Counties is shown on page 78.
2. The data shown in this Appendix has been based on Appendix B to the Housing Return for England and Wales for the 31st January, 1946, and includes additions and alterations notified in monthly Progress Reports up to and including May, 1948, received from Local Authorities. In cases where entries in the Progress Reports were incomplete or inconsistent the information contained in this Appendix has been compiled in the light of evidence contained in the Census Return and in the Progress Reports as a whole. The tabular statement shows the position as at the 31st May, 1948. In certain instances Progress Reports have not been received in time for inclusion. Those local authorities in respect of whom Progress Reports for April and May, 1948, have not been received are marked with * and † respectively. The data in respect of permanent housing shown for such authorities relates to the position as at the 31st March and 30th April, 1948, respectively.
3. The term "under construction" in Columns (4), (7), (9), (16) and (18), means that the contractor has actually begun work on the construction of the dwellings. In some instances work has begun on all dwellings in a particular contract; in a few cases it would appear that all the dwellings in a particular scheme have been shown as "under construction" on the Progress Report although work has not necessarily started on all of them.
4. In certain instances the Ministry of Works are undertaking the erection of groups of experimental permanent non-traditional houses on sites provided by housing authorities. These houses have been included in the data shown for the authorities concerned.
5. Where Tenders (or Estimates in the case of Direct Labour) for site development (Roads and Sewers) have been approved by the Ministry of Health but where work on the site has not begun, the sites have not been shown as under development (Col (2)).
6. In the few instances where sites developed before the war by private enterprise are being taken over by the local authority but possession has not yet been obtained, the relevant figures have been entered in Column (2).
7. Permanent Houses. Permanent Aluminium houses are shown separately from other types in Columns (6), (7) and (8). "Houses under construction" (Columns (4) and (7)) and "Houses completed" (Columns (5) and (8)) are included on "Houses in tenders approved" (Columns (3) and (6)) otherwise, figures in each column are not included in any other column.
8. It should be noted that the greater part of the housing provision for the County of London is made by the London County Council. It is not, therefore, possible to relate the data shown in this Appendix for each Metropolitan Borough to the housing needs of the population of the Borough.
The bulk of the preliminary work in connection with the provision of permanent houses made by certain housing associations in the County of London area is undertaken by the Metropolitan Boroughs. The information is included in Columns (3), (4) and (5).
Certain data on temporary houses in respect of the London County Council and the Metropolitan Boroughs have been consolidated.
9. The erection of some temporary houses has been completed but their connection to electric and other services has not been effected. Where this is the case the number of temporary houses shown as completed (Column (14)) has been marked ‡ and the name of the Local Authority and the number of houses completed but not ready for occupation are stated at the foot of the page. Such houses are not included in the number shown as completed in Column (14).
10. The total number of dwellings on licences and approvals issued (Column (15)) includes licences and approvals issued both in regard to new dwellings and to the rebuilding of war destroyed dwellings. An analysis of the respective numbers falling into these two categories is shown in Tables 4A and 5A of Appendix A to the Housing Return. Approvals for the erection of new dwellings include those built under Housing (Financial Provisions) Act, 1938, Section 3, and houses on which the work is done without valuable consideration that were approved before 1st February, 1947.
The total number of licences and approvals shown in Column (15) takes into account information received from local authorities in respect of licences that may have lapsed.
11. The numbers of houses on licences issued or approved under Section 94 of the Housing Act, 1936 (as amended by Section 8 of the Housing (Financial Provisions) Act, 1938), under construction and completed by Housing Associations are included in Columns (3), (4) and (5) respectively. In Returns prior to that for 31st July, 1947, this information was included in the columns relating to private builders. The numbers of such houses included in Columns (3), (4) and (5) are shown at the foot of each page for each Local Authority concerned.
12. The estimated population shown in Column (11) relates to 31st March, 1948, and excludes members of the Armed Forces and Merchantile Marine.
