THE EU HAS FUNDED HUNDREDS OF PROJECTS IN LONDON INCLUDING:

- ⊕ London Green Fund for schemes that cut carbon emissions, including the Tate Art Gallery retrofitting, £60million
- ⊕ Gangs prevention and support for disadvantaged young people in London, £2.5million
- ⊕ HIV vaccine research at Imperial College, £16million
- ⊕ Breast cancer research at University College London, £4.6million, part of £292million funding
- ⊕ Research funding, London School of Economics, £33million
