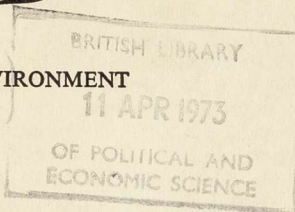

A service of statistical information and advice is provided to the Government by specialist staffs employed in the statistics divisions of individual Departments. Statistics are made generally available through their publications and further information and advice on them can be obtained from the Departments concerned.

Local Housing Statistics

England and Wales

1. **Local Housing Statistics** is prepared by the Department of the Environment and the Welsh Office to provide figures for individual local authority areas in a quarterly publication.

The tables relating to the provision of new permanent housing, slum clearance and, from the beginning of 1972, improvement grants, appear regularly in each issue. They show annual cumulative figures. Before 1972 annual totals for improvement grants were published in supplementary tables.

Supplementary tables on various other housing matters are included as data become available.

Supplementary tables so far published are listed on Page iv.

2. **Definitions.** Detailed definitions of the terms used are to be found in the Notes and Definitions Supplement to "Housing and Construction Statistics". It may be noted that:

"Dwellings" include all permanent houses and flats.

"Houses" in relation to slum clearance action has the meaning attributed to it for the purposes of Part II and Part III of the Housing Act 1957 (see para. 6).

"Local authorities" include local housing authorities and new town authorities.

"Other public authorities" include Government departments and housing associations.

"Regions" are the economic planning regions adopted in 1965. These only differ from the Standard Statistical Regions by including Poole Borough in the South West rather than the South East.

"Counties" are primarily the areas for which Lieutenants are appointed. Greater London as a whole is dealt with as a county. Stockport is dealt with as wholly in Chester. The part of Derbyshire in the North West region is shown as

"Derbyshire (High Peak District)". The county borough of York is included with Yorkshire, West Riding (until the end of 1968 it was included with Yorkshire, East Riding).

3. **Local authority areas.** Local housing authorities may provide housing either within or outside their own areas. The figures shown in Table 5 against the name of the authority include dwellings situated outside its area, for which particulars of completions are given separately in Table 6. Table 7 shows the distribution within and outside Greater London of dwellings completed by the Greater London Council, or by housing associations assisted by the Greater London Council. Authorities shown in Tables 6 and 7 are indicated in Table 5 by the following symbols:

§ An authority which completed dwellings in the area of another authority during the period.

|| An authority in whose area another authority completed dwellings during the period.

Other public sector and private sector dwellings are shown against the name of the authority in whose area they are situated.

4. **New towns.** Against the name of each new town in Table 5 are shown the dwellings built for the development corporation or for the Commission for the New Towns. These are all situated within the new town area and are not included in the figures for any other local authority. Private sector building on land made available by the new town is included against the name of the authority or authorities in whose area it is situated, but is also shown separately in italics against the name of the new town and included in the new town total.

5. **Adjustments to earlier returns** may occasionally result in a negative figure for an individual authority, when, for example, dwellings reported as started are subsequently withdrawn or there is a transfer from one sector to another.

6. **Unfit houses.** The figures in Table 5 show the number of houses (whether or not unfit) demolished in or adjoining clearance areas under Part III of the Housing Act 1957, and the number of unfit houses demolished or closed elsewhere under Part II of the Act or certain other powers. Houses reported as closed in an earlier period which have subsequently been demolished under slum clearance action are excluded from the latter total; this may result in a negative figure for an individual authority. In Table 3 they are excluded from houses "closed". (Up to issue No. 8 the adjustment was made to "Houses not in clearance areas: demolished".) The London Borough distribution of houses demolished by the Greater London Council is shown in Table 8.

7. **Population.** The figures are the latest available estimates of the home population prepared by the Registrar General.

8. **Improvement grants.** Table 9 shows the number of local authority, county council and new town dwellings for which Exchequer assistance was approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment or the Secretary of State for Wales, and the number of other dwellings for which grants were approved by local authorities during the period. The figures do not include special grants. Most housing associations receive assistance from local authorities on the same terms as private owners and their figures have therefore been merged. A few housing associations choose to receive assistance from the Exchequer similar to that given to local authorities. These discretionary grants, approved under the Housing Act 1969 (Section 21) are included with the figures for local authorities. Distribution of these grants is shown in Table 10 (Page 82).

9. **Development and intermediate areas.** By the end of the period shown the following local authorities were included in development and intermediate areas, where the higher rate of assistance for improvements was available:—

- Northern region: all.
 Yorkshire and Humberside: all except Market Rasen U.D. and Welton R.D.
 North West: all except Alsager U.D.
 East Midlands: Derbyshire—Alfreton, Heanor, Ripley U.D.s; Bakewell, Belper, Blackwell, Chesterfield, Clowne R.D.s;

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 November 1972

Nottinghamshire—Worksop B.; Eastwood, Kirkby in Ashfield, Sutton in Ashfield U.D.s; Basford, East Retford, Worksop R.D.s.

West Midlands: Salop—Atcham, North Shropshire, Oswestry R.D.s.

South West: Cornwall—all: Devon—Plymouth C.B.; Barnstaple, Bideford, Great Torrington, Okehampton B.s; Ilfracombe, Lynton, Northam U.D.s; Barnstaple, Bideford, Crediton, Holsworthy, Okehampton, Plympton St. Mary, South Molton, Tavistock, Tiverton, Torrington, Totnes R.D.s; Somerset—Dulverton R.D.

Wales: all.

Local authorities where the higher rate of assistance has only been available since 22 March 1972 are indicated by ‡ in Tables 9 and 10. Counties where all authorities not so indicated were included in development and intermediate areas throughout the period shown are indicated † in Table 9. Elsewhere † is shown for individual local authorities included in development and intermediate areas throughout the period.

County councils qualified for the higher rate of assistance if the dwellings concerned were located within an area which was a development or intermediate area at the time of the approval of the grant.

10. **Index.** An alphabetical list of all local authorities and new towns in England and Wales is published separately. In addition to page references this shows the type of each authority and the region and regional sub-division in which it is situated. A map of the regional sub-divisions is included.

In Local Housing Statistics and in the Index certain boroughs are listed for convenience by a name in common use which differs from their correct title. They are:

- Dartmouth . . . properly Clifton Dartmouth Hardness
 Durham . . . properly Durham and Framwelgate
 Launceston . . . properly Dunheved, otherwise Launceston
 Salisbury
 (New Sarum) . . . properly New Sarum
