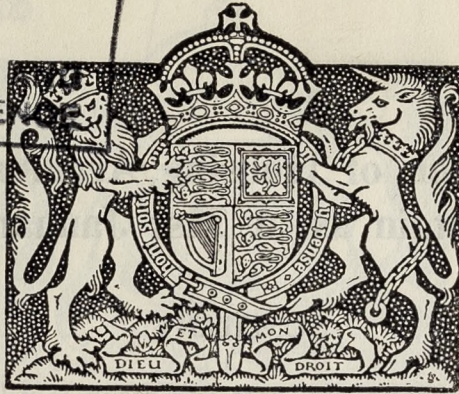

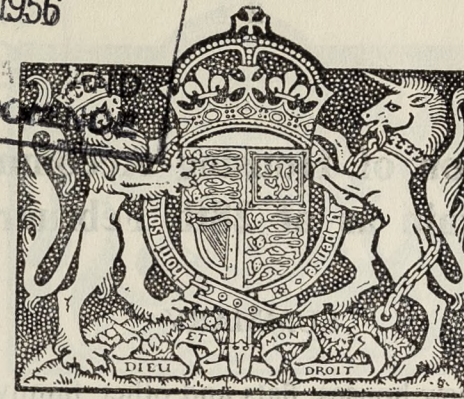

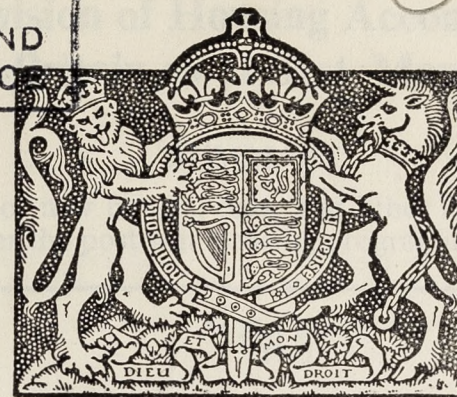

Housing Return for England and Wales as at 31st March, 1955

The figures in this return show the position up to 31st March, 1955, and relate to periods from 1st April, 1945. The return includes an Appendix A giving general tables relating to England and Wales as a whole and to various subdivisions by types of authority and by geographical distribution.

Throughout this return figures relating to Local Authorities include those of New Towns Development Corporations. Separate figures for these Corporations are given on page 7.

A detailed statement of new house-building for each housing authority will shortly be published as a separate document (Appendix B).

USE OF EXISTING PREMISES

Apart from new building, additional family units of accommodation have also been provided by local authorities and private builders by the conversion or repair of existing premises.

Information relating to accommodation provided by private builders became available for the first time in April, 1946. That in respect of the repair of unoccupied severely war-damaged dwellings may be incomplete for a few local authorities and the figures quoted are subject to adjustment. TEMPORARY HOUSES

The total number of temporary houses allocated to local authorities was 124,455 and the programme was completed in December, 1948. In addition, 515 temporary houses were allocated to Government Departments. This programme was completed in January, 1949.

REQUISITIONED PROPERTIES

A total of 33,484 flats and houses of 12 rooms or less was released from occupation by the Services and Government Departments over the period 1st May, 1945, to 31st March, 1955. Some of the dwellings on release were taken over by the local authorities.

The total number of requisitioned dwellings held by local authorities for residential purposes was 59,467 at the end of March; of these, 47,902 were situated in the London Region.

Between 1st January, 1948, and 31st December, 1954, there has been a net decrease in unoccupied houses requisitioned by local authorities for residential purposes of 34,041, and a net decrease in the period January to March, 1955, of 2,195.

APPENDIX A—NOTES

The material contained in this Return is derived from a census of the housing position at 31st December, 1945, and the reports of subsequent progress completed by local authorities and other bodies.

Classification of Urban and Rural Authorities

The classification of Urban Authorities other than the L.C.C. and Metropolitan Boroughs into Large Towns and Cities, Medium Towns and Cities and Small Towns has been made in terms of population. The classification has been made as follows based on the estimated population at mid-1954 as returned by the Registrar General.

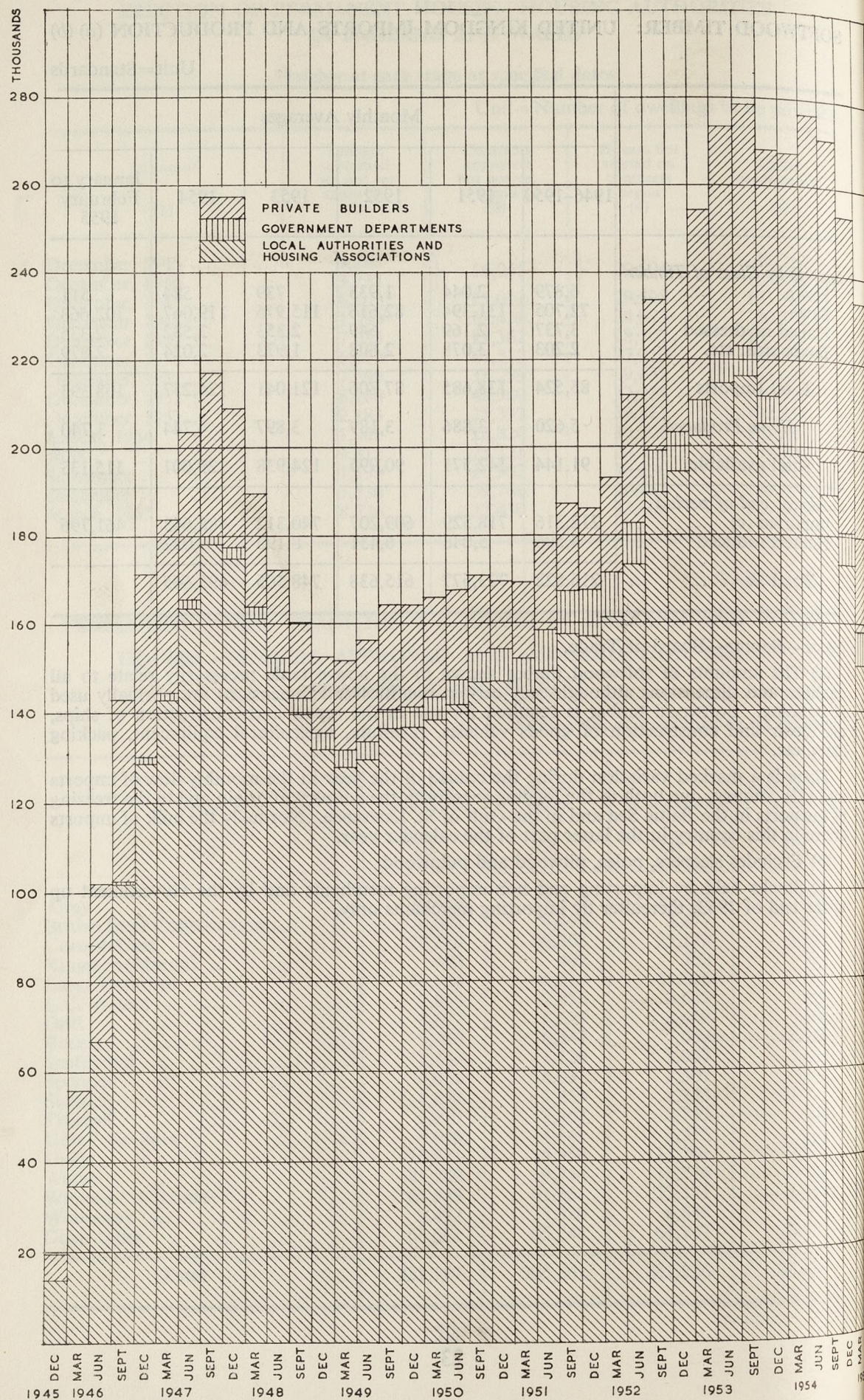

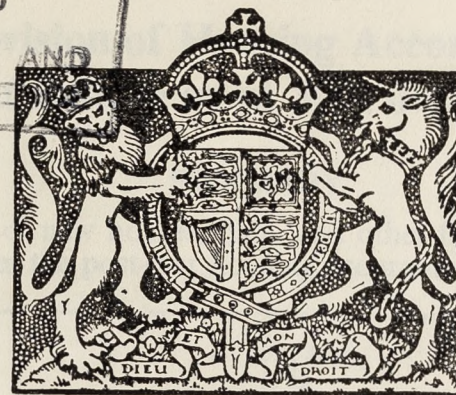

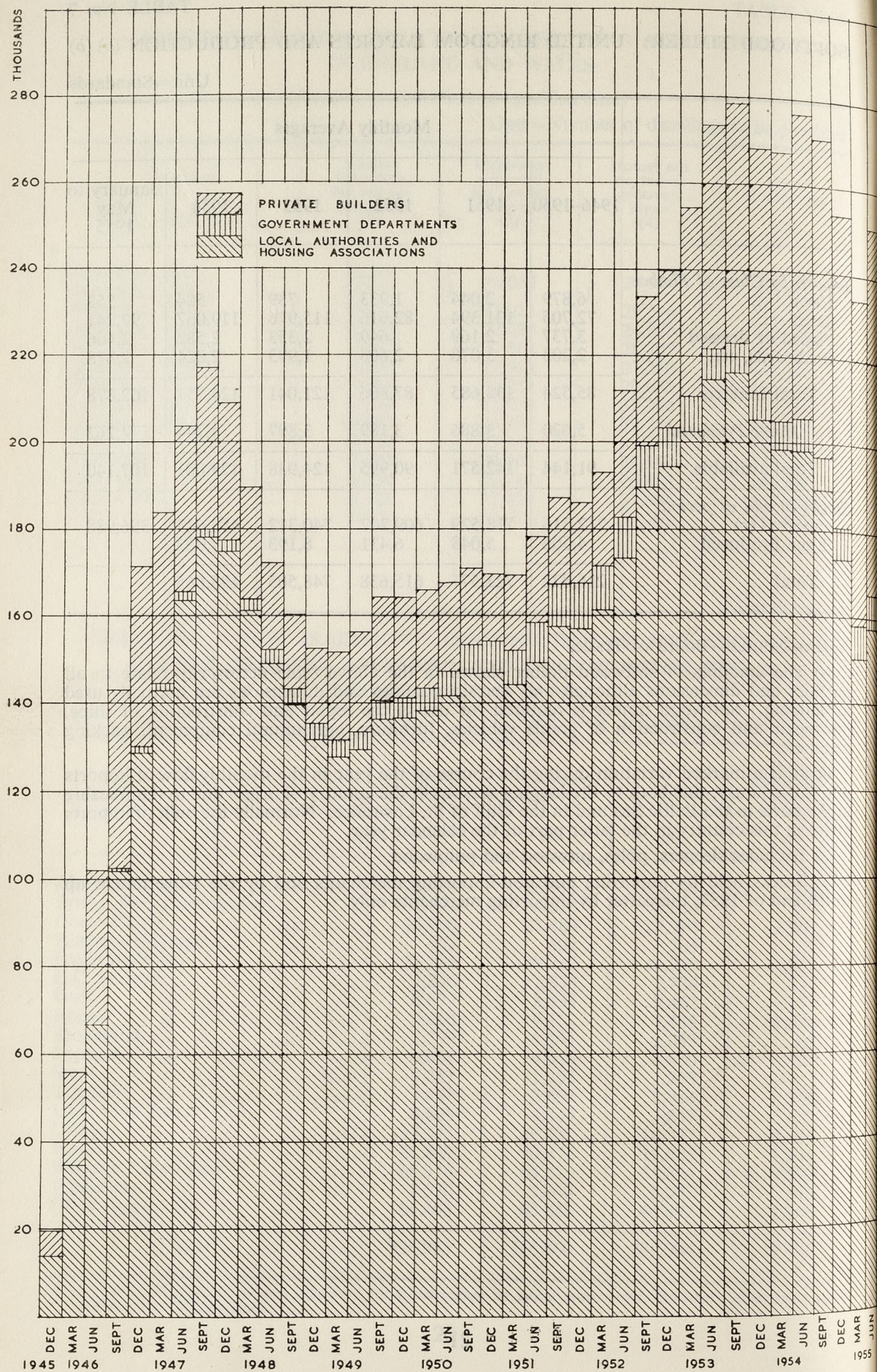

NOTES

1. An alphabetical index of Regions and Counties is shown on page 75.

2. The estimated population shown in Column (1) includes members of the Armed Forces.

3. The figures given in this Appendix relate to the period from 1st April, 1945, and have been based on Progress Reports received from Local Authorities and New Towns Development Corporations up to 30th June, 1955, inclusive. The progress of Development Corporations is recorded under the counties in which they are situated.

4. The data shown for each Metropolitan Borough excludes housing provision made by the London County Council.

5. The figures in Columns (4), (5) and (6) relate to houses provided by Housing Authorities and Housing Associations. Separate figures for Housing Associations are given in a Table at the end of this Return.

6. Houses built for private owners in New Towns on sites in which the Development Corporations have an interest are included in Columns (7) and (8) against the name of the Local Authority or Authorities in whose area the New Town is situated. The numbers of such houses under construction or completed are shown separately, in italics, in Columns (7) and (8) against the name of the New Town.

7. Rebuilt war-destroyed houses are included as appropriate under Housing Authorities or Private Builders.
