A HOUSE OF PRAYER. (Contributed.)

There are times when even the holiest of convents is not what one wants. Nor even an ordinary house of prayer. Physically and mentally, one is tired out. Spiritually one is weary and in need of rest and readjustment. The future, it may be, is no longer clear; or perhaps it is too clear and points in an unwelcome direction. How one longs to get away, alone with God, to face the whole problem. Where shall one go? This convent? or that? For it must be a holy place. Yes, one has found peace and strength there before; but there are so many occasions when one longs for the Presence, and the chapel is closed to visitors! Also rules fidget the weary mind. And convents are cold places!

Come with me and let me conduct you to the haven where you would be.

Cross the Solent and take train to Whitwell, a little village in the south of the Isle of Wight. To you who do not know it Whitwell may sound like any other place. But to those of us who have experienced it, the very name breathes mystery and peace.

The station is on high ground, and as you alight from the train, a fine view of sweeping downs meets the eve, and there is a pleasant tang in the air, suggesting that the open sea is not far off. But as you leave the station and descend the hill leading to the village, mystery meets you. A spiritual mist seems to rise and enfold you, and a joyous glow in your heart tells you that you are on holy ground which welcomes you. In a few minutes you reach the little grey twelfth century church, originally two churches, side by side, dedicated to Our Lady and to St. Rhadegund respectively, and later on made into one church. You enter and discover the source of the mystery and the joy. And as you kneel in the Lady Chapel, where the white light proclaims the abiding Presence of Him vou have come to meet, you know that the spell of Whitwell is the spell

of His Presence. And His Blessed Mother shares in it. There are those who say she still walks in Whitwell and who dare say they are wrong? The beautiful modern statue of Our Lady of Whitwell stands in the chapel, in the place of an ancient one, now, alas, lost, which was for centuries a shrine of pilgrimage.


But you have journeyed far, and you want your tea! So come home to St. Mary's, which is indeed to be your home while your spirit is finding the guidance it needs. Three or four minutes walk, and you are there. The hostess welcomes you at the front door of this long pleasant house, and leads you into a delightful room where a fire is burning, and where an appetising tea awaits you. After tea you see your room, and then the little white oratory, with its great crucifix and its shrine of Our Lady of Light, almost dazzling in its white purity. Here the Offices are said with the loving care and reverence that befits the rendering of the Opus Dei. Here too, you may, when you will, find undisturbed peace. Peace and solitude may also be found in the garden, where a "zone of silence" is set apart for that purpose. At one end of this you find an ancient crucifix from Siena, three hundred years old. Further on is the shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea.

As you move about the house you find that books are everywhere. Is there any theological book of note that the hostess does not possess? And all are at your service. I will close with an extract from the simple rule of the house:—

"Those who come to the house do so less to follow an external observance than to keep tryst with Him who calls them to the house. Silence and prayer are the means—the road to the tryst. Silence can be used in many ways; and prayer may take many forms. Therefore a certain disciplined freedom in method and unity in purpose is the law of the house."
