General Remarks.

The story of Lambeth in the last 10 years is a story of worsening. The fairly comfortable have left & are leaving. The poor remain & additional poor are coming in. The effect of cheap trams & cheap railway fares is most marked in this area. Brixton & Stockwell have cleaned the mechanic & artisan, while the labourer remains here ~~here~~ his ranks are reinforced by displacements in Westminster across the river. Sgt Sales thought that the increase of poverty was purely natural increase: & is not of opinion that Westminster drifts to Lambeth: Westminster he says goes to Battersea: but proximity, similarity of conditions etc make it more than probable that many ~~would~~ come to Lambeth.

Gas works & poverty.

Poor areas.

Between Lambeth Rd + Lollard St are the remains of ancient old established poverty: newer poverty is found more between Prince's Rd + Upper Kennington Lane.

Here as in other parts of London the worst name is given to Irish cockney. He drinks the mat & is the most difficult to deal with. Here ^{too is} ~~is~~ ~~the~~ ~~same~~ ~~factor~~ ~~is~~ ~~the~~ ~~same~~ ~~baleful~~ influence of gas works. Poverty ^{in Lambeth} hugs the London gas works & those of the South Metropolitan Company. ^{But} whether it is in Fulham or Brompton ^{in W or E, in N or S London} ~~by this coincidence~~ of gas work & poverty always go together.

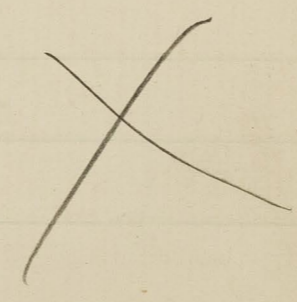
The lowest womens work is in the gut yard in Tinworth St. A great many young women work across the water in the Publico clothing factory.

Serjt Sales spoke of the poor area between Princes Rd & Upper Kennington Lane as a 'Drink & Fried fish district'. He does not see any improvement in drink & says the women are as bad as the men. He wd like to see all children prevented from going to fetch beer, though he has only once in

in 23 yrs seen a child drunk. It might prevent them of the habit of going into public houses. He professed ignorance of the values of licensed houses. but thinks there has been a considerable drop in their value in the last year.

Serjt Sales is a man of 41, 23 yrs service in the police force which he entered at 18. He is a tall man, fair moustache blue eyes with a sad & rather disappointed look. It seems he had expected to be made an inspector two yrs ago but was told his application & expectation was useless on the ground of having seen too much service. They will not make a serjeant of many years standing into an inspector.

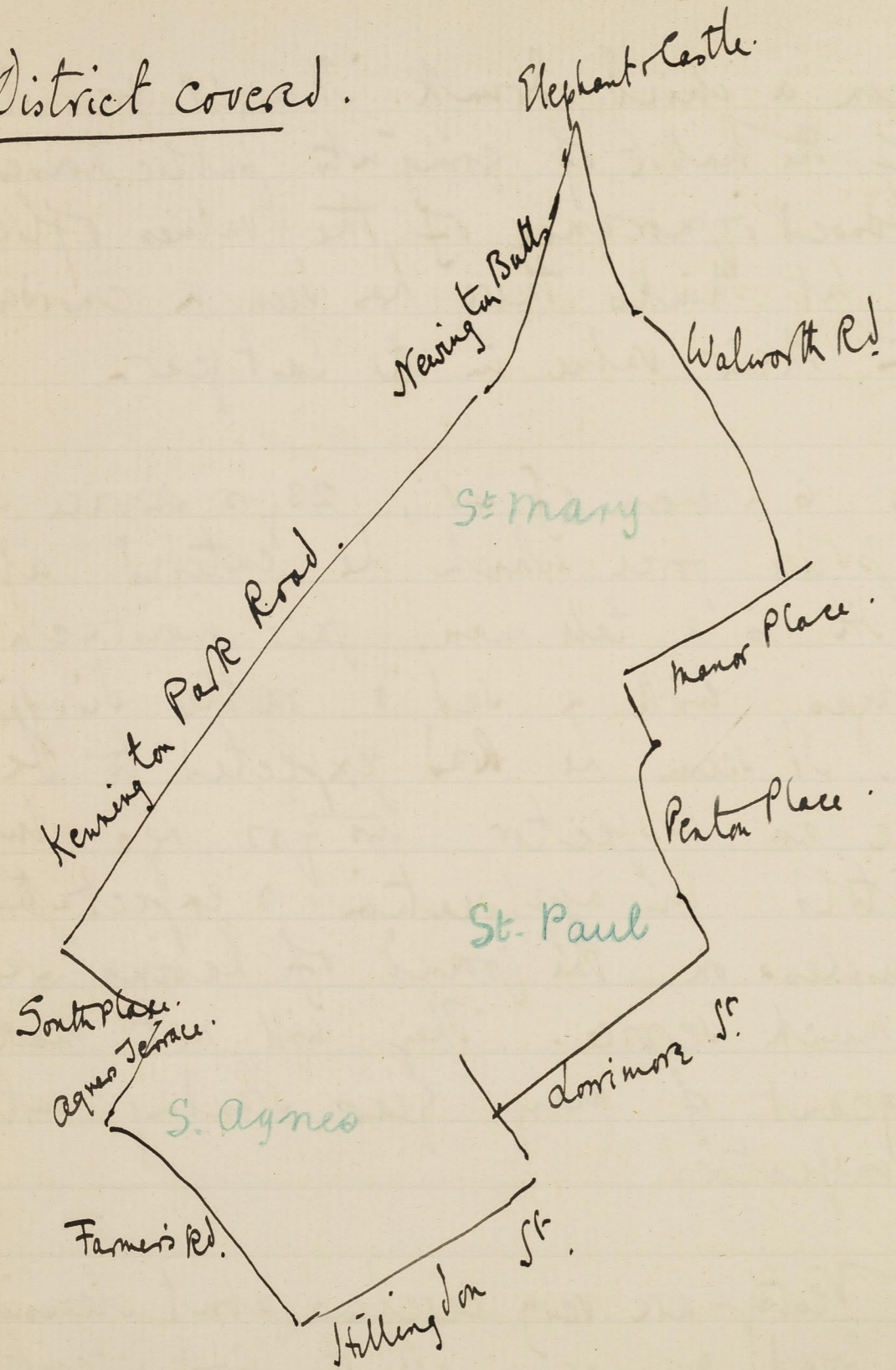

Lambeth Police Division.

Carter St. Subdivision is bounded ^{on} by the East

Speaking of the Subdivision as a whole, the
good streets are less good & the bad streets are
bad. The Sultan Street area shows some inclination
to extend its dark blue the increase here being
balanced by the disappearance of dark blue
from courts at the NE end of Kennington
Park

Park Road.

There are 40 cab yards in this subdivision along in Chapter Rd. Gage St. Amelia St. Penrose St. Ampton St. Newington Crescent, Canterbury new Avenue Rd etc etc. The largest yard has 50 cabs & employs about 70 men. The next largest has 40 cabs. Besides these there are many small men owning & driving their own cabs, as in De Laune St.

The casual men such as washers & stablemen still drink & are poor but the drivers are a steadier class now than before the strike. When the strike was over they petitioned the Commissioners to have stricter enquiries as to fitness made before licenses to drive were granted. In this way they freed themselves of the odium of purging their own ranks & are now a steadier set of men than ever before. Taximeter cabs are not popular in this region though £2 is offered as a regular wage. Spicemaney thinks that the life of a taximeter driver

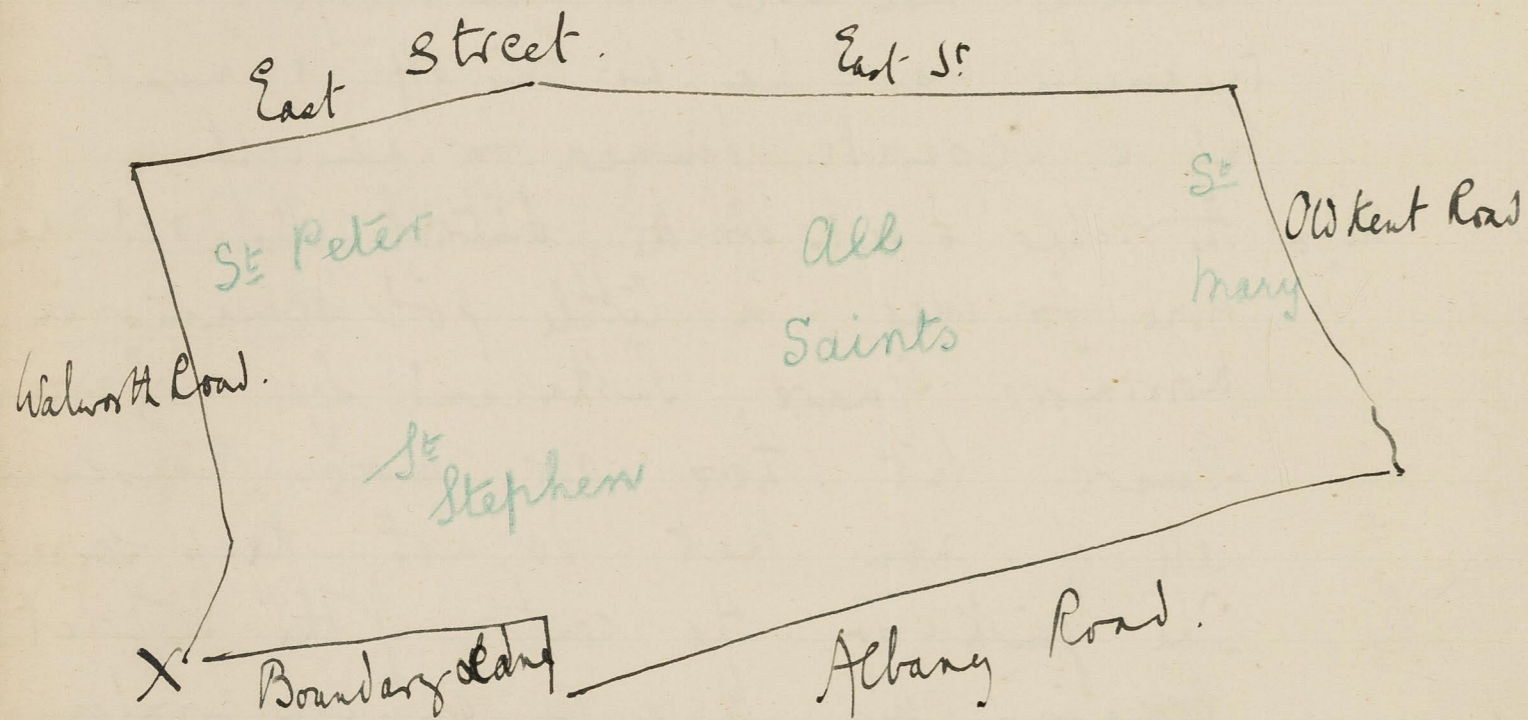

is more costly & less pleasant than that of a cabman

Lorimore Square, Sutherland Sq & Grosvenor

The vestry is not remarkable for the care taken
in street cleaning: The poor streets, especially

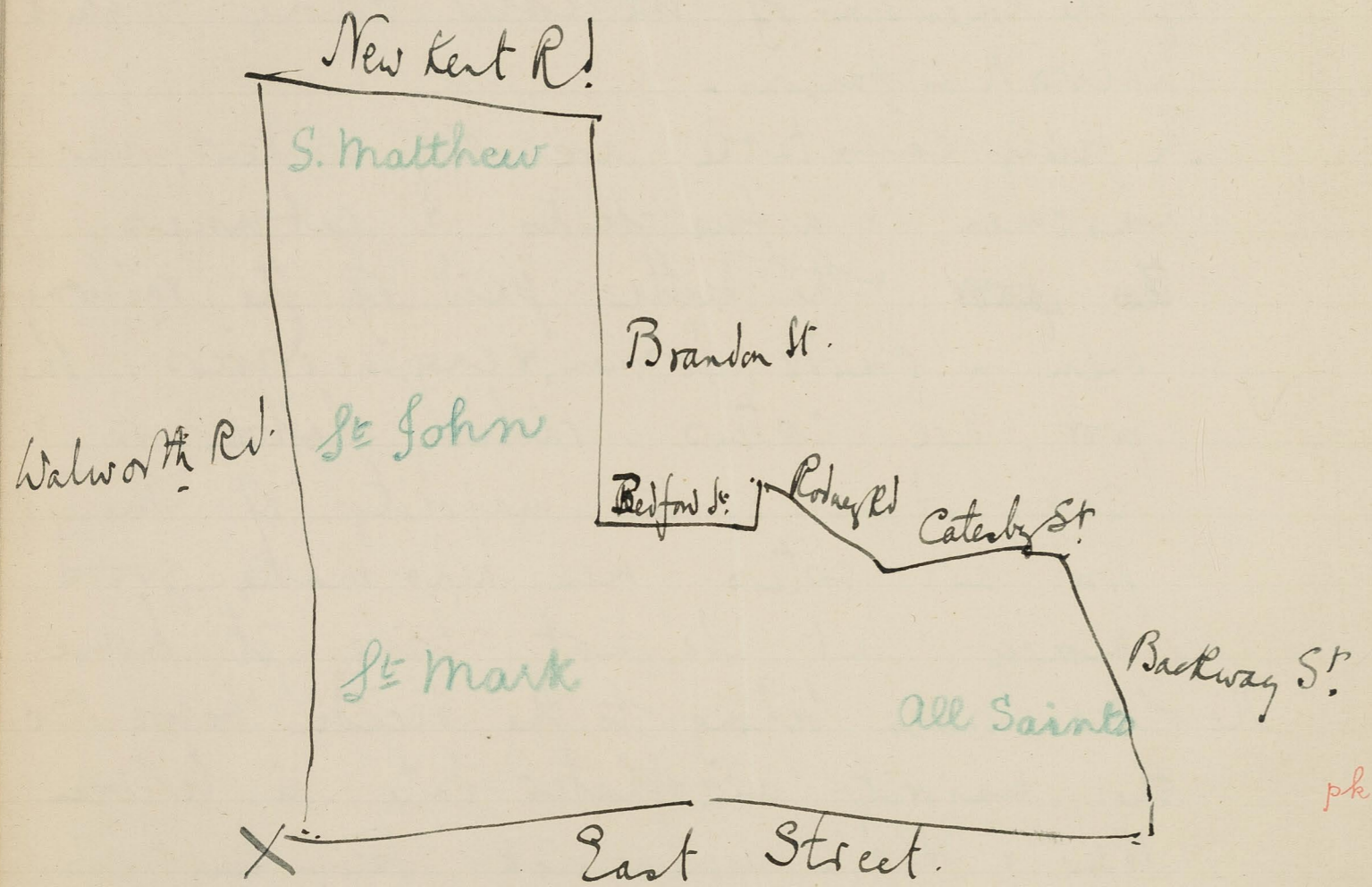

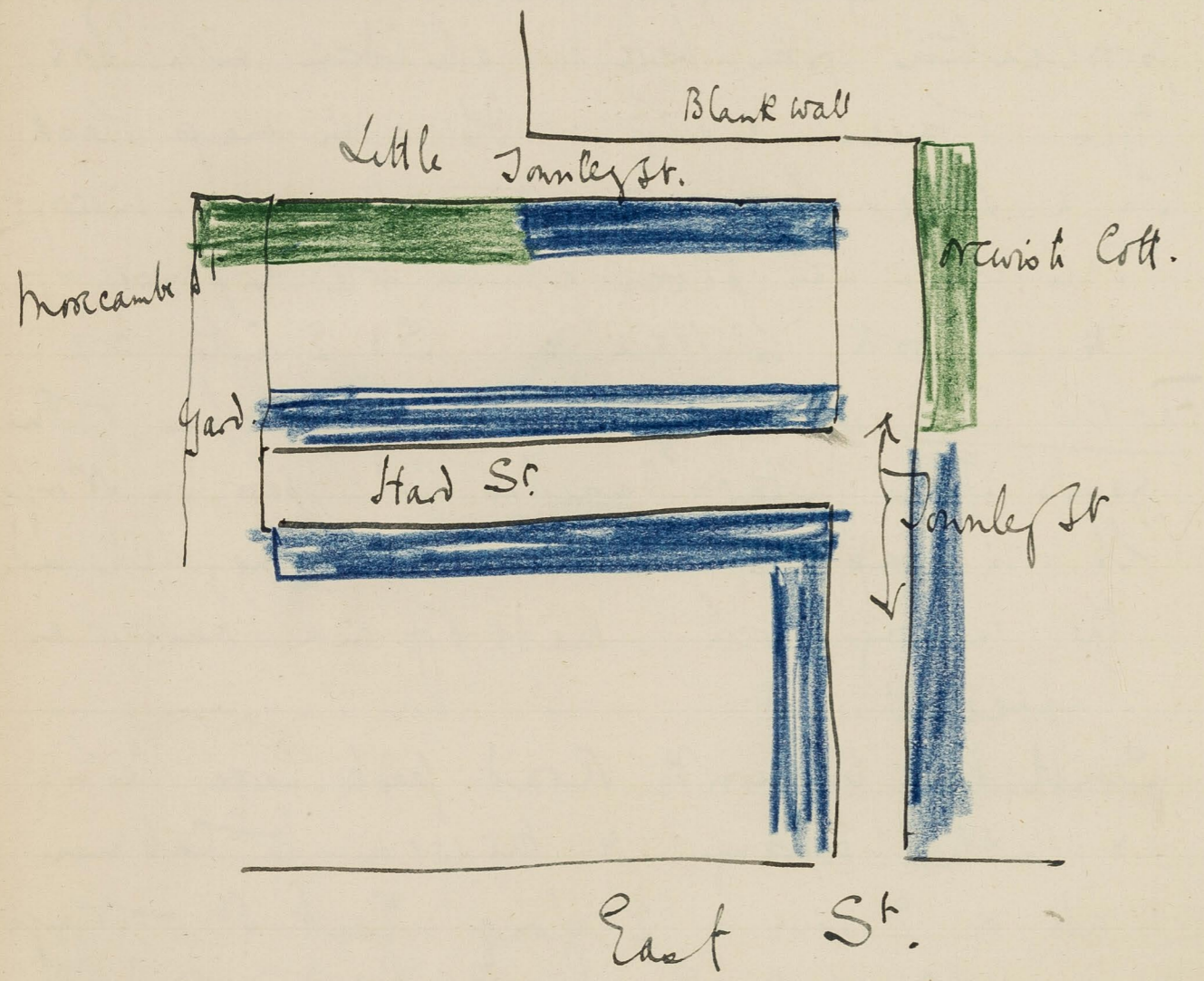

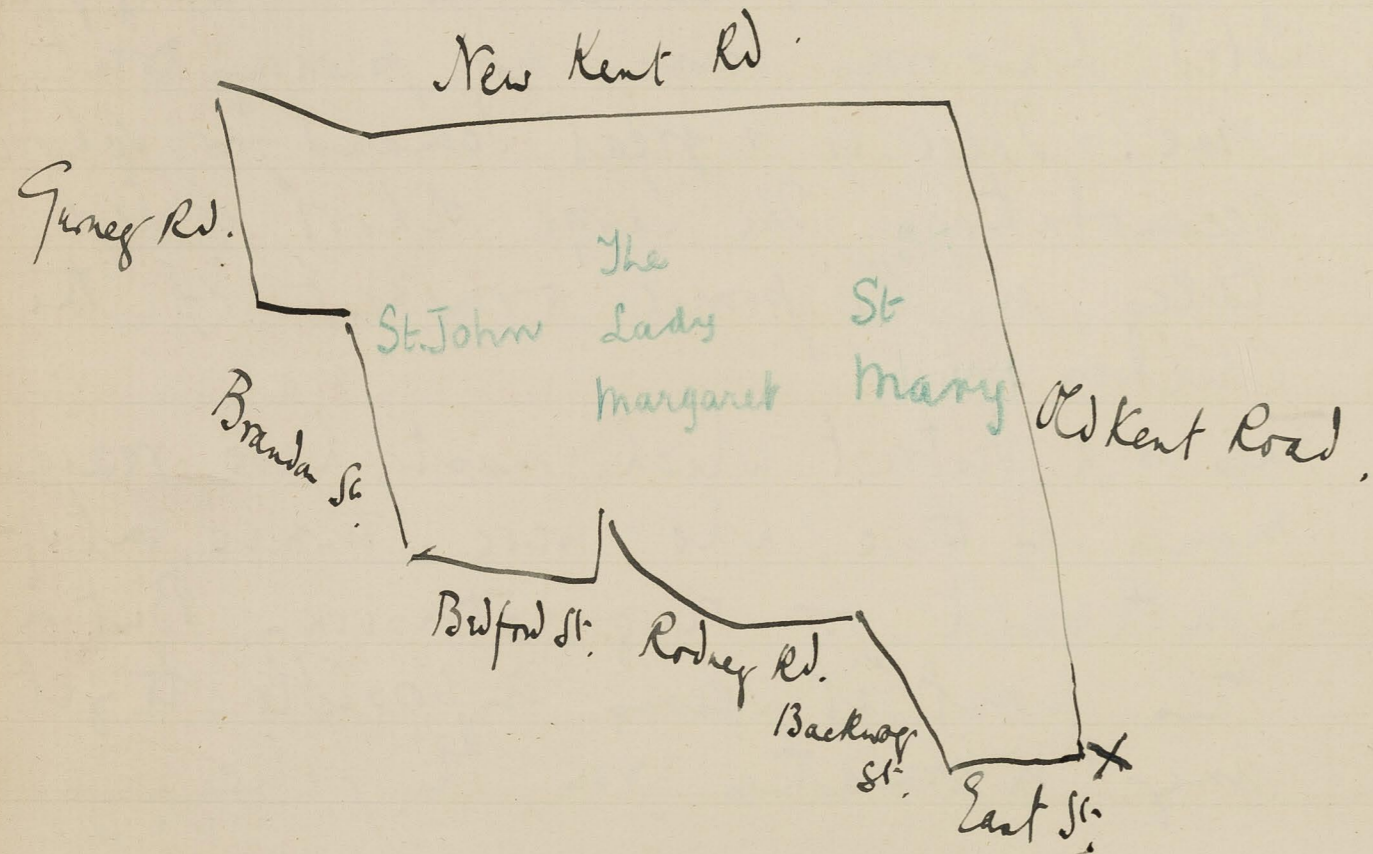
General Remarks.

In this round the Walworth coter is to the fore:
though not poor if his earnings are

General Remarks.

The remarkable part about this road are the number of model Buildings which ^{in height & density} increase as the New Kent road is reached. Houses everywhere increase in height towards the main road & seen from above London wd show a series of ups & downs between the main thoroughfares. This tendency is well illustrated here by the long range of Buildings on the S side of the New Kent road which extend stretch from Sayer St to the Manton Rd.

In character the Bldgs vary very much - Weymouth & Lion Bldgs between Sayer St & Lion are v poor & very rough: Chatteris square & the various Sutton & Dudley Bldgs are neither v good nor very bad: well built but without any regard to light or air or ame.

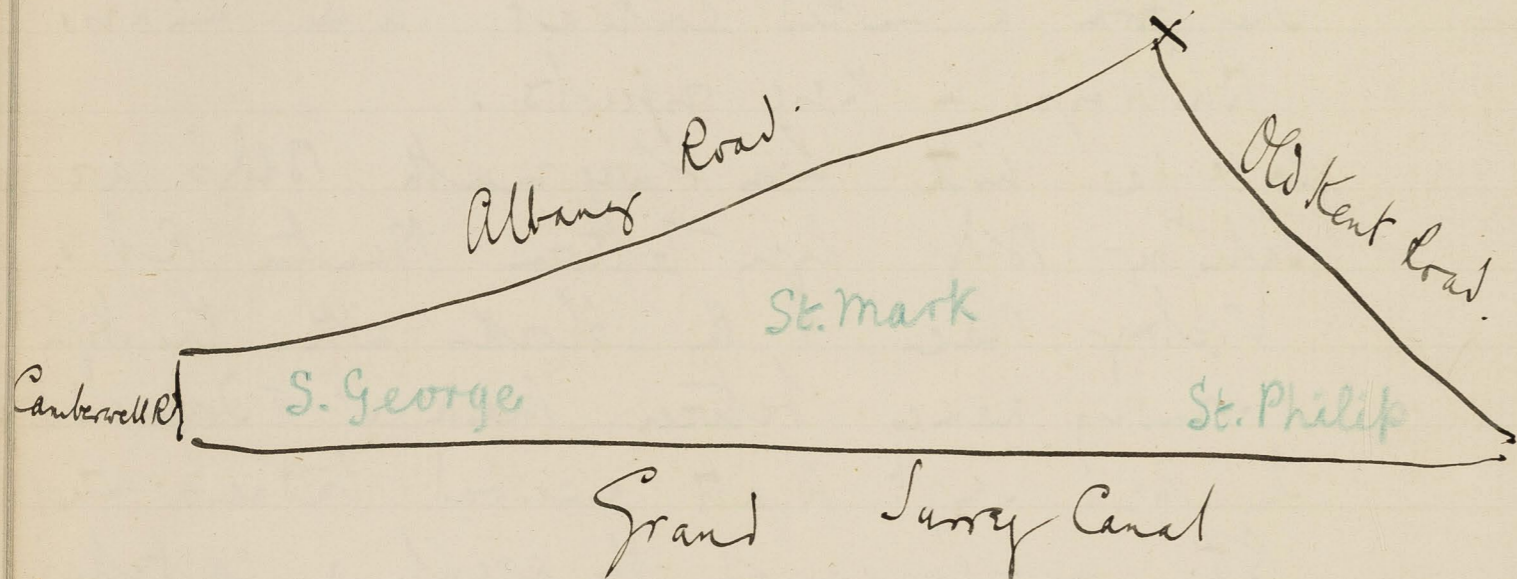

factory in Scarsdale Rd. For artisans there is a large preparation gas meter factory & Chubb's lock & safe works in the Glengall Road. For first-class labour there is tramway work under the LCC. For poorer labour there is canal work & lime kilns & horse tending & for rough skilled labour there is sheepskin dressing in Herring St & Goldie St. & for skilled women's work there is the large collar & cuff works in the Coburg Road.

Small unskilled labour is represented by paper bag makers & wood choppers in Goldie St & Ann's Terrace.

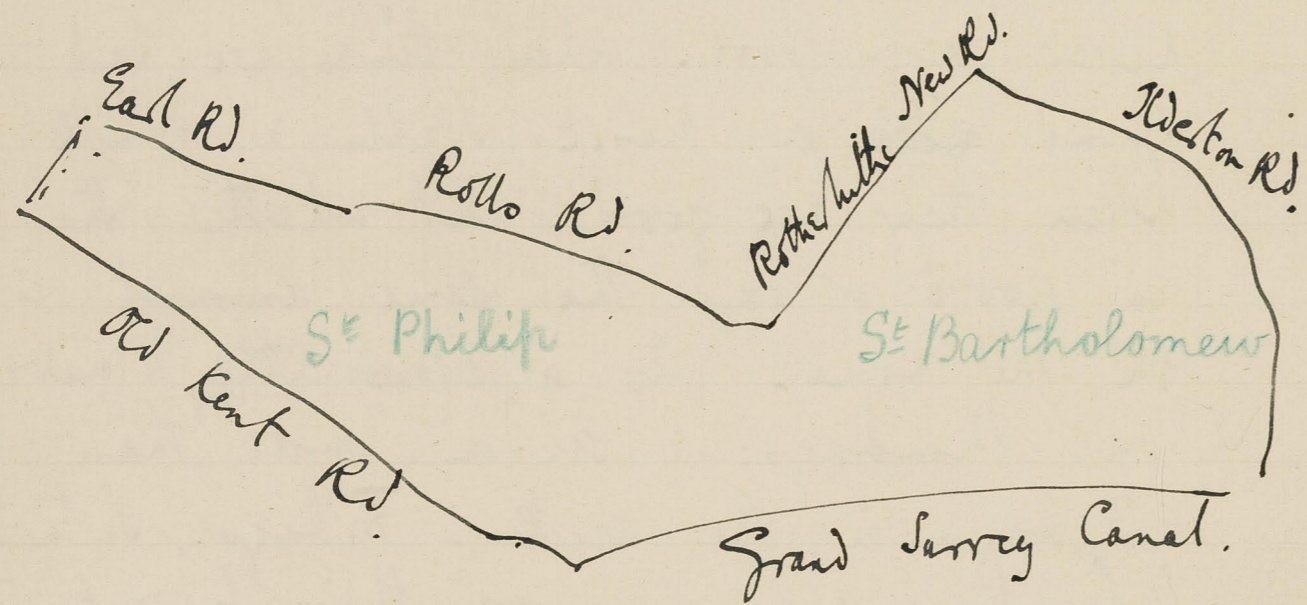
Everyone is better behaved: but juvenile crime seems to be increasing & more serious than that he thinks is the increase of women's drunkenness & woman's gambling. Betting among women is an invention as far as he has seen it, of the last two years: he thinks it is quite common now. 'It comes of their greater freedom & greater earning power.' They keep what they earn & try to spend it as men spend their spare cash. Just because of this tendency to drink he wd not encourage their fetching their own beer by forbidding the children to go for it. He has never seen a child drunk & sees no harm come to the children by running in an out with an empty & full jug^{to} from the public house. If it were possible to do without drink altogether he would stop the children; but as it is not possible the fetching & carrying of the children prevents a greater evil for the women he knows wd many of them go with the jug & remain to drink. The class that is most characteristic of Walworth

are the costermongers. As far as he can see they are just as poor in their appearance & homes whether the year is good or bad for trade. They are never very poor. When times are bad they spend ~~more~~^{less} on music stalls & drink than when they are good. But whether the season is good or bad the same amount is spent on the home. As a class they never work on Mondays: & seldom more than two or 3 days in the week - Fridays, Saturdays & Sunday mornings are their busiest times. Times was when they only sold apples & vegetables ~~only~~^{now} they sell any material thing. Some of the roughest go in for fish. Others linoleum, cooking clothes, iron, beds & bedding & any rubbish you can think of. Linoleum & Iron beds were a good line two years ago but he hears there is not much to be done in them now.

Bread was steady at 3¹/₂^d for 4lb loaf in most shops though there were always a few ~~at~~^{asking} 4¹/₂^d: & coal at 1/3 the cost - during the whole time I was in Walworth.

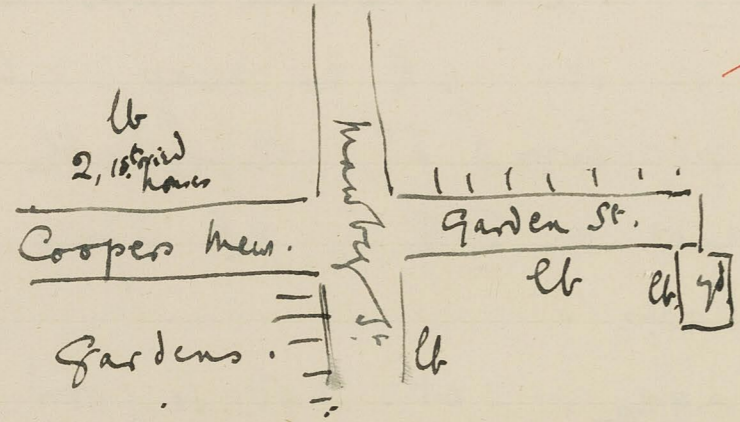

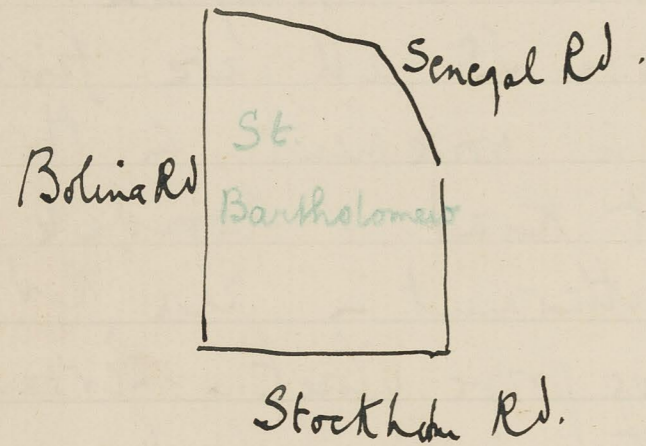

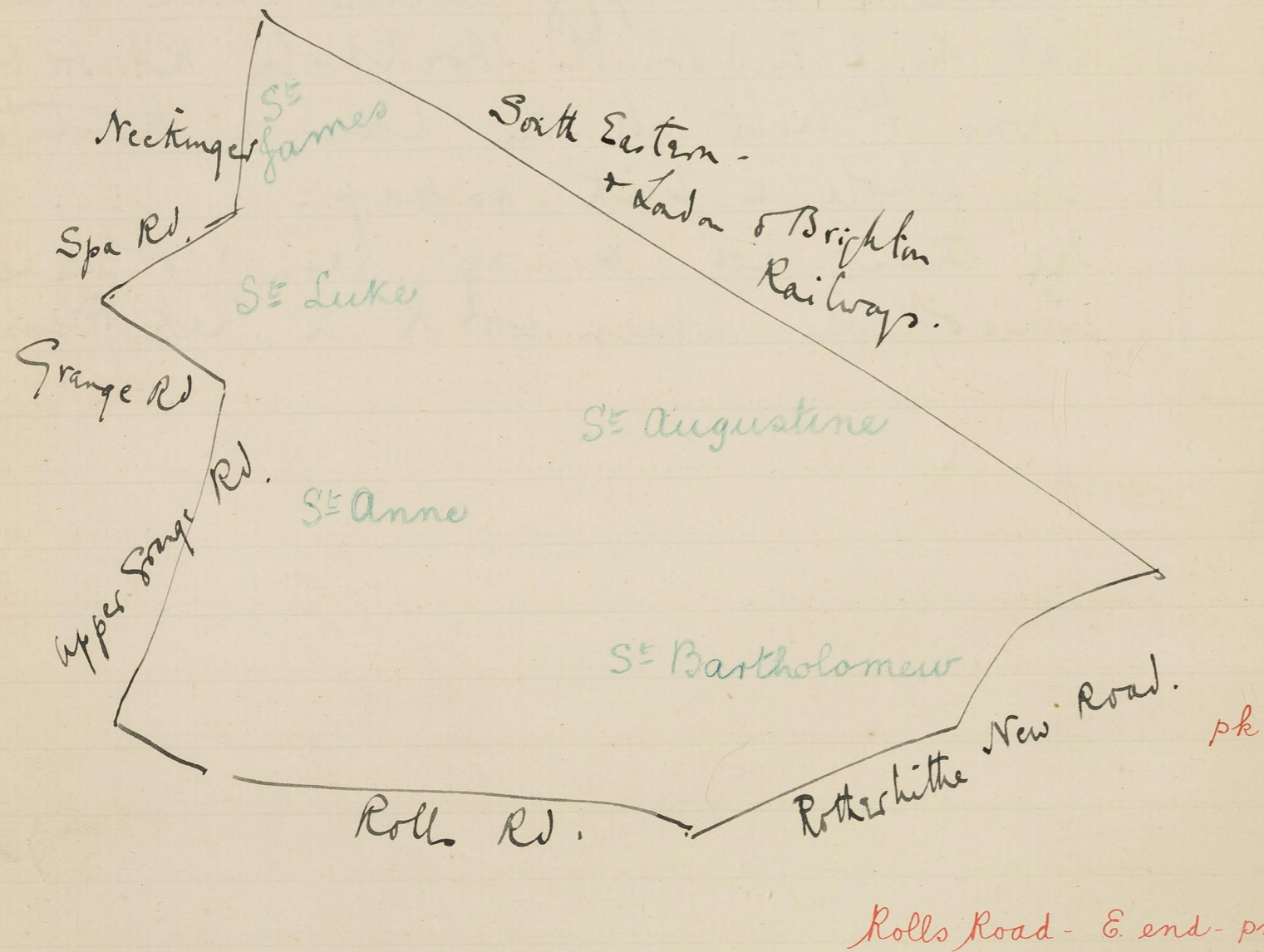

I. Einleitung.

Schon bei dem Abschlusse der am 1. Februar 1892 in Kraft getretenen Handels- und Zollverträge mit Oesterreich-Ungarn, Italien, Belgien und der Schweiz durfte von der Erwartung ausgegangen werden, daß diese Verträge zugleich den geeigneten Anknüpfungspunkt für die wünschenswerthe vertragsmäßige Sicherstellung unserer Handelsbeziehungen auch zu anderen Staaten bilden würden. In diesem Sinne ist seiner Zeit mit Serbien, Spanien und Rumänien in Verhandlungen eingetreten worden, welche zum Abschlusse der nunmehr vorliegenden Verträge geführt haben.

Alle drei genannten Länder hatten im Laufe der letzten Jahre durch den Ablauf ihrer früheren, umfangreiche Tariffestsetzungen enthaltenden Verträge ihre volle Zollautonomie wiedererlangt und, von dem Bestreben geleitet, sowohl ihre finanziellen Einnahmen zu heben, als auch ihren aufstrebenden Industrien den bis dahin nicht durchweg in ausreichendem Maße zugestandenen Zollschutz gegen die Konkurrenz des wirthschaftlich vorgeschritteneren Auslandes zu gewähren, nach dem Beispiele anderer Länder, die ihnen darin vorangegangen waren, ihre verhältnißmäßig niedrigen Zolltarife wesentlich erhöht.

Unter solchen Umständen konnten wir diesen Ländern die Begünstigungen unseres durch die Eingangs genannten Verträge ermäßigten Zolltarifs ohne entsprechende Gegenleistungen auf die Dauer nicht gewähren.

Außer vielen anderen Vortheilen waren es Spanien gegenüber namentlich unsere ermäßigten Zölle auf Wein und Südfrüchte, und Serbien sowie Rumänien gegenüber unsere ermäßigten Getreidezölle, welche als geeignete Aequivalente bei der vertragsmäßigen Regelung unserer Handelsbeziehungen zu diesen Ländern verwerthet werden konnten.

Thatsächlich ist es denn auch gelungen, innerhalb der durch die Schutzbedürftigkeit der einheimischen Erwerbszweige der mehrgenannten Staaten gezogenen Schranken, angemessene Vortheile für unseren Güteraustausch mit denselben zu erlangen, ohne unsererseits im Wesentlichen über die in den Verträgen mit Oesterreich-Ungarn, Italien, Belgien und der Schweiz bereits gemachten Tariffkonzessionen hinauszugehen.
