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of yesterday's scene in this Ouse of Commoñs without showing the true dignity and manliness of Mr Lansbury's conduct. Under such circumstances the disgrace is with those who can sit still. The story of how cultured and intellectual women are tortured to the point of insanity and death is evidently funny to these British gentlemen who are entrusted with the affairs of the nation, and it is left to a Labour member to do and say what the occasion demands. These women are in prison because of their principles. As Mr Asquith so naively told the House, they have only to promise to do as they are told and they would be free women. How many of the "honourable members" (!) would show the same courage and faithfulness to their cause-whatever that might be? I have hitherto been a peaceful and law-abiding woman. I have preached patience and constitutional methods. But to-day I see that the constitution offers no help to women. We have no direct constitutional methods, and the limit of our patience has been reached.
The days of the thumbsorew and the stake are here again, and we are driven to use the only means of protest left to us. As a nurse I know something of artificial feeding., It is bad enough when done with the patient's consent, but when done forcibly, and therefore more or less brutally, its horrors are increased tenfold. Mrs Pankhurst-now almost an old woman-and the Pethick Lawrences faced that ordeal after some days' starvation as a protest against their followers still being treated as criminals. They themselves had been accorded the rights of political prisoners. When the prison doctors dare go no further these two ladies are released and removed in ambulances. But the others are still being tortured. What has happened to the men of our country that these things are tolerated for a single , day? And there was "laughter in the House" over the attempted suicide at Holloway of Miss Davison!-I am, eto.

Sir,-I am indeed glad to see, in the light of Mr Lansbury's outburst of indignation in the House of Commons, that we have at least one brave man in that Assembly-one man who understands what real chivalry meansnot a show of sickly sentimental deference towards a weaker (inferior) sex, but a championship of women's interests by both word and deed.
Mr Asquith had the (possibly unconscious) effrontery to suggest that the imprisoned suffragists might gain their freedom by betraying the cause for which they went there-by promising to ooase fighting an unjust and tyrannical Government. of course Mr Lansbury was filled with indignation at this insult to womanhood, and vented his just anger upof the author of it. When women political offenders (as the jury at the conspiracy trial admitted them to $\mathrm{be}_{\mathrm{e}}$ ) are thrown into jail, and treated as common criminals, it is time to protest and not to mince matters

Mr Lansbury realises that these noble women are suffering vioariously; they have adopted the hunger-strike protest on behalf of their fellow-prisoners who are not receiving first division treatment. In so doing the leaders have shown the real Christ spirit, careless of personal pain if freedom can be won for the oppressed. No wonder Mr Lansbury is seething with resentment against those who treat our best women with such blind brutality. The wonder is that some of the other 600 odd members have not caught some of his noble rage and joined in his protest in spite of rules and red tape. But they have chosen to maintain a dishonouring silence, and more shame to them, whether suffragists or not. Had the Government dealt with woman suffrage in a statesmanlike way, with woman suffrage in a statesmanlike way,

done, there would have been no window-breaking, no violence of any kind, and no need for Mr Lansbury to risk expulsion by his brave and chivalrous conduct. -1 am, eto.,
