Because of EU funding worth £3.2million, Nottingham was able to expand its tramway system.

But did you know that the EU also invested £1.1million in the Corby Enterprise Centre business hub, £9million to protect moorlands in the Peak District and the South Pennines and £3.3million in Leicester Food Park, which hosts businesses of different

sizes and to support growth in a key area for local job creation?

The EU works with our local communities so we can channel these funds where we need them most, building projects that create jobs, bring in more money and create opportunities for young people in our region. As well as giving us direct investment in the East Midlands, being in the

EU means more local jobs, support for our businesses, a boost for tourism, lower prices for everyday goods and a more secure future for our families.

The East Midlands will benefit from £770million in EU funding over the next five years. This could all be lost if Britain leaves Europe.
