REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 1924.

In presenting the twenty-first Annual Report, the Committee have to record a year of consolidation of work undertaken in the past, the initiation of further activities, and the continued co-operation with institutions, both Iewish and general, which aim at the social, economic, religious and educational advancement of women and children.

The Union has sustained a further loss this year in the death of Lady Magnus, a Vice-President since its inception. Her great literary talents were dedicated to the cause of Judaism, to which she was a devoted adherent, and her writings on the history, literature and religion of her people will be an enduring monument to her memory. It is with great sorrow that the death of Mrs. Kaye is recorded, for many years the valued Correspondent in Southend.

Affiliated Societies and Members.

Correspondents, Branches, The Committee note with satisfaction a considerable increase under all these headings. It is gratifying

to welcome new Correspondents in Amsterdam, Belfast, Cork, Durban, Glasgow, Harrogate, Lausanne, Leicester, Middlesbrough, Newcastle, Oxford and Westcliff. A vigorous branch has been formed in Belfast under Mrs. Samuel Freeman. Hull, the largest branch of the Union, with Mrs. B. S. Jacobs as President, and Mrs. Miller as Honorary Secretary, is a valuable factor in the communal life. The Girls' Club has been re-organised and is proving very successful. Under the energetic guidance of Mrs. Stone, the branch in Sheffield continues to do excellent work. During the year the Executive have been brought into touch with Correspondents who seek for advice and information in dealing with cases of special difficulty, and it is gratifying to record many instances of help in the solution of these problems.

Every year among the list of subscribers there is an inevitable loss of valued members through death. In London the loss has been more than compensated by a considerable access of membership.

Two additional Societies have acquired affiliation, viz., Bristol Hebrew Ladies' Benevolent Society, and South London Ladies' Lodge No. 49 of the Order Achei B'rith.

New Activities (1) Re-issue This work was undertaken of the Union of Jewish Women's "List of Institutions."

early in the year in response to representations made by various bodies, and especially by the Hospital Visitation

Committee of the United Synagogue, who have defrayed part of the expenses. The second edition published in 1915 had become obsolete and the whole publication required recasting. A special Committee was appointed, on which Miss H. Hyam, Chairman of the Ladies' Branch of the Hospital Visitation Committee was co-opted, which worked for several weeks at securing and tabulating the necessary information. Warm thanks are rendered to secretaries of institutions for particulars which were readily supplied

(2) British Empire In response to an invitation to co-Exhibition. operate with other women's organisations in extending a welcome to overseas visitors the Union appointed a Special Sub-Committee, of which Mrs. C. Waley Cohen was Honorary Secretary. A leaflet was drawn up and distributed to Ministers, Correspondents and the Jewish Press throughout the Overseas Dominions, placing the offices and services of the Union at the disposal of Jewish visitors. A certain number of Jewish visitors were brought into contact with the Union, visits to Communal Institutions were arranged and

other services endered. Mrs. C. Waley Cohen represented the Union on the Women's Section of the British Empire Exhibition, and a rota of Jewish ladies attended regularly at the Women's Pavilion every week. The machinery thus organised will be readily available in the forthcoming year for intending visitors to the Exhibition.

The Committee continues to function. Hospitality for Overseas Students. Every student known to the Committee was given an opportunity of hospitality for the first evening of Passover, and all those who desired it were given invitations. Fewer students are now arriving from the Dominions, but all new students brought to the notice of the Committee during the year have been entertained. Letters of thanks have been received from several students showing that the hospitality and welcome extended to them is appreciated.

Confirmation There is a steady growth of interest in this movement and it is gratifying to record for Girls. that periods of preparation followed by a Consecration Service have been held at Hampstead, East London and Higher Broughton (Manchester) Synagogues. Special classes are in progress at Bayswater, Brixton, Brondesbury, Hampstead, Stepney, Walthamstow, Cardiff, Hull and Higher Broughton, and other classes are in contemplation in the near future. The pamphlet issued by the Chief Rabbi which embodies a code of instruction and which eloquently advocates the cause of religious education for girls has aroused communities to this pressing need. The testimony, however, of those Ministers who have carried the curriculum to a successful conclusion and seen the spiritual benefit which has resulted from it, is the most hopeful means of gaining adherents to the movement.

The Annual General Meeting was held Annual General Meeting. on Monday, February 18th, 1924, at 29, Park Crescent (by kind invitation of Lady Tuck). The President gave a resumé of the year's

work. Mrs. E. Lesser, the retiring Treasurer, gave a financial statement and introduced her successor, Mrs. A. H. Levy, and Mrs. C. Q. Henriques, the Loan Fund Treasurer. presented a report of the funds.

The Hon. Mrs. Franklin gave a very interesting address on her recent visit to America, with impressions of Tewish Institutions which she had visited, and some account of the triennial Convention of the Council of Jewish Women at St. Louis. Mrs. Franklin laid special emphasis on the attitude of the Convention towards the Jewish Women's Congress in Vienna, and the loss to the meeting owing to the absence of Mrs. Kohut, through illness. Mrs. Franklin succeeded in bringing home to her hearers the magnitude of resources both in personnel and in material which American Jewry is able to command.

Council (I) A Council Meeting was held on April 7th. Meetings. at 29, Cambridge Square (by kind invitation of Mrs. M. A. Spielman) when Miss S. I. Warner, O.B.E., a lecturer of the League of Nations Union. delivered an address on "The Humanitarian and Industrial Activities of the League of Nations." She dealt especially with legislation designed to safeguard the woman and child worker, and with measures taken to prevent the spread of disease, notably in regard to the epidemic of typhus in Poland, and the suppression of the opium traffic with its attendant evils. Four corporate associateships were formed and several new members enrolled as the result of this meeting.

(2) A Council Meeting and Garden Party was held on June 16th at "The Poplars," 20, Avenue Road (by kind invitation of Mrs. Hillier Holt). The meeting was designed especially to give an opportunity to meet provincial and overseas visitors. A warm welcome and brief address, on the Union's activities was given by the President, and Miss Landau, O.B.E., responded, conveying on behalf of the women of Palestine a message of hope and gratitude to the Jewish women of England. The business proceedings were followed by a very enjoyable garden party.

(3) A Council Meeting was held on Monday, November 24th, at 37, Cornwall Gardens (by kind invitation of Lady Nathan) when an able address on "Pensions for Civilian

Widows with Dependent Children," was given by Mrs. Hubbuck, Parliamentary Secretary to the National Union of Societies for Equal Citizenship. The lucid exposition by Mrs. Hubbuck of the hardships and humiliation which this defenceless class of women suffer under the inadequacy of the Poor Law system, and the benefit which would accrue under a State Pension Scheme evoked a strong expression of opinion in favour of the latter.

Gatherings. At Home to friends and workers at the Office of the Union in March and November. These informal gatherings afford an opportunity of welcoming old friends and of promoting a sense of fellowship between the members and those who come to the Union for advice, employment or training.

Loan Fund. The Loan Funds have this year assisted seven trainees with either new loans or instalments of loans already granted. There are at present twenty-eight names on the list, of whom all who have completed their training are in work, and are sending regular repayments, while three loans have been fully repaid. The amount of loans granted this year is £325 178.8d. and the repayments received were £174 14s. 11d. It is interesting to note that the Union of Jewish Women fund was originally allocated to the Union in 1906, the income being £80 IIs. od. per annum. Owing to careful administration and the regular repayment of loans, the fund has been able to invest £851 5s. Iod. This sum accrued for the most part during the war years when only a small number of loans were granted, as at that time even the untrained were able to find employment at a high salary. This year floo of War Bonds have been sold to meet present demands involved by the higher cost of training. This accounts for the larger sums disbursed, although the number of loans granted is less. The whole of the yearly income of the fund can be accounted for, and with the outstanding loans and the interest on investments, the amount standing to the credit of the Loan Fund is about one and three quarter times as great as the

original amount of $f_{2,000}$, which remains under the control of the Charity Commissioners. This proves how satisfactory the Loan Fund is and how few are the bad debts incurred, and above all how wise is the choice of careers of the trainees.

The Union also administers a small supplementary fund, the Louisa, Lady Goldsmid Bequest Fund, details of which will be found in the balance sheet. This fund stands at the original sum of £200.

Information Bureau. for employment and advice, besides many re-applications, and 63 new applicants have been dealt with, in some cases more than once in various ways. The majority required posts, and for these twenty-seven were found—a somewhat depressing figure—but the fact must be borne in mind that many of the applicants belong to that sad class who have been brought up in affluence, but whose circumstances have changed and though willing and anxious to work, are no longer young. Every effort is made to find occupation for these ladies, to whom all sympathy should be extended.

In the case of the younger applicants it is gratifying to state that some young students who have passed through a course of applied art, were able, through an introduction of one of the Committee, to obtain excellent employment. The fully trained, well equipped girl is seldom out of work for any length of time. The need for Matrons and Assistant Matrons in Jewish Institutions and for Jewish Nurses is very insistent, and it is much to be regretted that so few Jewish girls or women feel a vocation for these careers which necessitate some self-sacrifice, but which are compensated for by security of tenure and by the appreciation which such service calls forth.

The Union is in a position to recommend many competent women as secretaries, teachers of Hebrew and religion and of foreign languages and as daily governesses.

Necessitous The Executive Committee have in the past Ladies' Fund. year continued their care of many ladies who, by reason of old age and ill health and impoverished circumstances are unable to support

themselves, and who would be subjected to severe suffering were it not for the help which the Union is able to organise on their behalf. The interest on the Fund entrusted to the Union by Mr. Hahn in memory of his wife enables grants to be made which are utilised for the following purposes:—
(I) General Maintenance; (2) The Provision of Medical and nursing requirements in cases of chronic illness; (3) The giving of holidays for recreation or recuperation after illness. The Committee co-operate with other Jewish relief organisations and in some instances act as almoners for sums of money entrusted to them on behalf of individuals. The Union of Jewish Women wish to thank the kind friends who have assisted the Necessitous Ladies' and Students' Benevolent Funds.

Grateful thanks are accorded to the Grocery Relief Fund; to the Passover Relief Fund; to the Society for the Distribution of Bread, Meat and Coal Tickets; to the London Needlework Guild and to many friends for gifts of clothing, all of which are warmly appreciated by the recipients. Woven underwear, coats, dresses, boots and shoes, etc., are always much needed and the supply does not meet the demand.

Honorary The Committee regret to record the resignation Solicitor. of the Honorary Solicitor, Mr. Harry M. Cohen, and tender him warm thanks for the services he has rendered to the Union in the past, notably in drawing up the revised constitution in 1922. The Union is fortunate in securing the services of Major H. L. Nathan, who has already rendered great assistance in regard to the tenure of this Office.

Honorary Warm thanks are tendered to the Medical Officers. honorary medical officers, Dr. Haldin Davis, Mr. A. H. Levy and Dr. Liba Zarchi, who at all times are ready to benefit protegées of the Union who are specially recommended through their skilled knowledge and attention.

Office. The Committee wish to testify to the devoted and loyal service which has been given to the interests of the Union in every branch of its activities by Miss Gilbey and her assistant, Miss Van Noorden. Miss Gilbey is now fully acquainted will all branches of the work and her sympathy and earnestness make her a worthy successor to Miss Halford. The Committee have granted Miss Van Noorden leave of absence for six months for study in France, during which period her post has been ably filled by Miss Olive Herz.

Volunteers. The work of the Office is much facilitated, and expenses are reduced by the excellent band of voluntary workers who attend regularly and help in many directions. Miss Ruth Barnett keeps the accounts of the Necessitous Ladies' Fund, and Mrs. H. Lyons, the Misses Herz, Ena Kahn and Rekah Keyzor give valuable clerical assistance.

The representation on the bodies of other committees has been regularly maintained by the representatives mentioned on page 4.

Finance. The Union may congratulate themselves on their good fortune in securing the services of Mrs. A. H. Levy as Treasurer, who throughout the year has taken wise care of its resources and devised methods to augment them. It is to be regretted, however, that the finances of the Union still give cause for anxiety. It is true that this year ends with a small surplus, but this is entirely due to the fact that in the years 1921-1922, 1922-1923, and 1923-1924, relatively large sums were raised for the Union by entertainments given by friends. In the two preceding years about £220 had been raised, and last year by the great kindness of Lady Instone, who gave a Bridge Tea for this purpose, £70 accrued to the funds. By these means and by the exercise of strict economy—an economy so rigid as sometimes to hamper expansion—all obligations have been met, but the fact remains that the regular income of the Union is not sufficient for its relatively small expenditure. It is felt that if the many-sided aspects of the work of the Union were more widely known and better understood, there would be few Jewish women who would withhold the modest annual subscription for membership and those who are already members and genuinely interested in the Union are asked to help it forward by enlisting the active co-operation of their friends.

The Honorary Officers and Executive are happy to think that as future Chairman of the Executive they will continue to enjoy the benefit of Mrs. Eichholz' guidance and active co-operation.
