Herewith the promised memorandum on militant Suffrage policy. I do hope it will not be troublesome to wade through or difficult to use in this form. You will note one or two points where your information is not quite in agreement with mine.

I have used <u>Woman's Effort</u> by A.E. Metcalfe (Blackwell, 1917) to confirm and refresh my memory. Do you know this book? - it is to my mind by far the most accurate and complete history of the militant movement in existence.

What I particularly want to emphasize is the fact that there was a certain quite definite order in all our disorders.
