The body of Miss Emily Wilding Davison will be taken across London on Saturday from Victoria to King's Cross.

Your Society will probably feel it an honour to take part in the procession, and in this way to testify to their reverence of this woman who has laid down her life for the Cause we all have at heart.

The procession will form up at 1 o'clock on the north side of Buckingham Palace Road opposite Victoria Station, and will start at 2 o'clock punctually for St. George's, Hart Street, Bloomsbury, where a service will be held at 4 o'clock. Should your Society wish to attend, your place will be in Section I.

The prevailing colour of the procession will be purple, and you are invited to veil your banner with that colour. Any wreathes brought should be carried by your representatives. White purple or black should be worn, and a black band on the left arm two inches in depth.

The admission to the church will be by ticket for which application must be made.

The route of the procession will be through Grosvenor Place, Piccadilly and Shaftesbury Avenue.

During the service the processionists for whom there is no accomodation in the church, will pass into Russell Square, and wait till the procession is over for the procession to move on to King's Cross, where the bedy will be entrained for Horpeth, Northumberland.
