Dear Miss Phillips,

I beg to forward to you the two following Amendments to the Resolution to be proposed by the Executive Committee at the Special Council Meeting on December 6th.

1. After the words "only question submitted" to omit "Will you do everything in your power to press upon your party leaders the urgency of the enfranchisement of women" and to substitute "Will you in your election address declare yourself to be a supporter of the enfranchisement of women".

(N.B. If this amendment were carried the question to Candidates would run "Will you in your election address declare yourself to be a supporter of the enfranchisement of women and will you oppose the enactment of any measure for extending the franchise to men which does not include women."

2. After the words "include women" to omit all words to the end to substitute "And that further the Executive be instructed to run Woman Suffrage candidates for ^{parliament} ~~election~~."
