On thinking over the proposal of the National Union Committee yesterday afternoon, that the London Society should undertake the organisation of a joint demonstration of the National Union and other Women's Suffrage societies, I perceive that it is not possible for me to reply on behalf of my Committee.

As far as the organisation of a demonstration was concerned I could readily accept the responsibility of agreeing on their behalf, and the more so as at a meeting on Friday last they passed a resolution urging this course upon the Council, but I feel that the present suggestion may appear to involve a question of policy.

I very much regret that I did not call attention to this point at the moment, but it was not till after I had left that I realise that it was not merely a question of carrying out a piece of work for the National Union Executive Committee

In these circumstances I have summoned my Committee in order to lay the National Union's proposal before them, and will communicate their reply to the N. U. without delay.

I have consulted Mrs. Fawcett who approves and I am sending this letter also to
