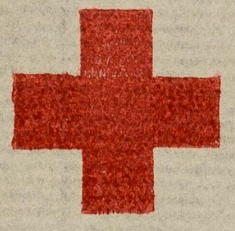

partly because of an unusual influx of visitors
all the after noon & evening & partly as the result
of a long night spent unsuccessfully with a
poor French man whose arm had amputated
for gangrene. He suffered so in his mind & I
he died in spite of every thing that we did. These
long nights in the wards are experiences which one will
never forget. I think all the time of the women at
home. We try & write to them & always write when
the patients are really ill or dead - long letters
telling them as much as we can. I hope it helps
them a little to know that the men they love came
into our hands & that we did our best for them.
The French temperament ^{introduces an} entirely different factor
& I haven't mastered it yet. They seem to have much
less recuperative power than our men & they are
tormented by fear of the Germans & the thought that their
homes & their country are in danger. I have no
time to write a proper letter so I enclose some notes of
my expedition to Braime a few days ago. Please write to me
