Re arrest of Mark Wilks for Wife's Income Tax.

Dear Madam,

On Tuesday Sept. 10th., the Sheriff's Officers called, but finding Mr. Wilks in bed with a bad cold, retired.

I am advised by telegram today that he has been arrested this morning.

I wired you at 11 a.m. as follows.

"To Wospolu London. Just heard Mark Wilks arrested, letter follows, am helping here and Nottingham Taylor. From Organizer."

I am doing what I can here, and in Nottingham, with the help of your W.S.P.U., Organizers, to make a stir.

I am also getting the facts of the case reported in the Local Press.

I am asking several of my men friends here, and in Nottingham, to at once forward the letter (copy enclosed) to our local representatives
