REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

THE work of your Committee during the past year has been carried on with unremitting diligence, and they have every reason to feel assured that the question of the enfranchisement of women has received increased consideration and favour from all classes of society. The unexpected termination of the Parliamentary debate has, however, occasioned the loss of the usual means of testing the Parliamentary strength of the cause by a division, for which the friends of the measure were fully prepared.

The Bill was introduced in the House of Commons on February 9th, and the second reading fixed for June 6th. The names on the Bill were those of Mr. Jacob Bright, Sir Robert Anstruther, the Right Hon. Russell Gurney, and the Right Hon. James Stansfeld. On June 6th, the second reading was formally moved by Mr. Jacob Bright, who reserved his speech for reply. The rejection of the measure was moved by Mr. Hanbury, seconded by Mr. Cartwright (Oxfordshire), and the Bill was also opposed by The O'Donoghue, Sir W. Barttelot, Mr. Balfour, Mr. Beresford Hope, and Mr. Butt. The Bill was supported by Mr. Forsyth, Mr. Hopwood, Mr. M'Laren, Sir J. M'Kenna, Mr. Henley, Mr. Jacob Bright, and Mr. Courtney. The last-named gentleman rose at a quarter-past five to reply to the arguments of Mr. Butt, when the opponents of the measure burst into a tumultuous uproar and effectually prevented his utterances being heard. When it became apparent to the speaker that the opponents of the Bill would not listen to the arguments in reply, the purpose was formed of preventing a vote. Your Committee hereby express their firm conviction, that, although the Bill might possibly have been rejected by a larger majority than that of last year, the numbers of votes recorded for it would have shown no diminution, and that the unreasoning clamour by which the mechanical majority strove to put it down would have exercised no adverse influence on the division list.

The friends of the measure had received promises of support from new and unexpected quarters, and had no reason to suppose that any of their former supporters would desert them. They would have accepted the larger numbers of the opposition if such had been forthcoming as a testimony to the growing strength of the movement, and they had every reason to believe that had a division been taken more votes would have been recorded for the Bill than it received last year.

In the absence of the crucial test of a division list, your Committee have no means of arriving at a complete estimate of their present strength in the House of Commons, since many changes have taken place in its composition since the division of 1876. The following list of constituencies whose members are favourable to the measure is corrected up to the present date, so far as their information enables your Committee to do so. Those members are counted as supporters who have either voted for the Bill or expressed themselves in favour of its principle:—

On this basis six of the three-cornered constituencies—namely, Birmingham, Buckinghamshire, Glasgow, Leeds, Liverpool, and Manchester—give either their full vote, or each a majority of their vote, in support of the Bill. Thirty-four constituencies, as against twenty-four in the last Parliament, give their full vote of two each in favour of the Bill,

Thirty-eight constituencies have given one vote for and one against the Bill, being twenty-eight on each side:—

Thus 118 constituencies, as against 94 last Parliament, give clear and full votes for the Bill; and 32 clear, though not full, votes for it. Therefore 151 constituencies appear as clearly ranged in favour of the Bill.

During the Session of 1877 there were presented to the House of Commons 820 petitions signed by 266,263 persons in favour of the Women's Disabilities Bill. This greatly

exceeds the number of petitioners for any other object during the Session. No petitions were presented against the Bill.

The petitions sent through the efforts of members and friends of the Manchester Society were 165, with 74,024 signatures. The petitions from Manchester received 17,764 and from Salford 13,463 signatures. Your Committee desire to urge upon their friends the extreme importance of keeping up the number of the general petitions so long as the Bill remains before the House of Commons.

During the past year, your Committee's Agent, Mrs. M'Cormick, has visited the following places: - Burnley, Southport, Durham, Sunderland, Stalybridge, Huddersfield, Preston, Ashton, Honley, Blackburn, Darwen, Derby, Lichfield, Burton-on-Trent, Hanley, Burslem, Stafford, Leek, Macclesfield, Scarborough, Liverpool, Wigan, Wolverhampton, Walsall, Dudley, Kidderminster, Kendal, Colne, Darlington, Middlesborough, West Hartlepool, Northallerton, Ripon, Thirsk, Hull, Grimsby (three times), Stockport, Worksop, Congleton, Peterborough, and Wellingborough. Mrs. M'Cormick arranged and attended the seven public meetings organised by your Committee; accompanied Mrs. Oliver Scatcherd to Grimsby and North Northamptonshire at the Parliamentary elections, and attended deputations to candidates; and devoted 156 days to office and other work in Manchester. Your Agent also collected subscriptions for the Birmingham Committee in April, and assisted the Central Committee (London) in arranging meetings in May.

Meetings have been held during the past financial year at the following places:—Sunderland, Durham, Halifax, Leek, Macclesfield, Stockport, Scarborough, Maryport, and Grimsby. The meetings have been remarkably well attended and successful. Your Committee desire to acknowledge with thanks the courtesy of the Mayor of Durham, in granting the use of the Town Hall for the meeting on December 12th, and of the Mayor of Grimsby for a similar act of courtesy with regard to the Town Hall on the occasion of the meeting on the 23rd of October.

The meetings have been followed up by other work, through which the Society has received a considerable increase in members and subscribers to the *Journal*.

At most of these meetings, your Secretary and Mrs. Oliver Scatcherd have attended as a deputation, and Miss Becker has also spoken at meetings organised by the Central Committee at Tower Hamlets; Kensington; Greenwich; Memorial Hall, City of London; and St. James' Hall, Piccadilly. Miss Becker and Mrs. Scatcherd also attended a drawing-room meeting, to discuss the speeches delivered during the debate, assembled at Langton House, by invitation from Lady Anna Gore-Langton.

In addition to these meetings, your Committee have also to report that Miss Becker was invited by the Council of the Social Science Association to read a paper on women's suffrage at the Congress held in Aberdeen in September, and that she attended the Congress on behalf of your Committee, and read a paper on "Some Social Aspects of the Women Suffrage Question," which was very well received by a crowded and influential assemblage.

On June 5th a deputation, at which your Committee was represented, waited on the Chancellor of the Exchequer in his official residence in Downing-street, to state their views with regard to the Bill which was to be discussed next day in the House of Commons. The deputation was introduced by Mr. Forsyth, Q.C., M.P., and was accompanied by Mr. Cowan, M.P., Mr. G. E. Browne, M.P., Sir Wilfrid Lawson, Bart., M.P., and Mr. Pateshall, M.P. Many other members of Parliament would have been present but for the unavoidable short notice that could be given of the hour appointed. The ladies composing the deputation included Lady Anna Gore-Langton, Mrs. Ashford, Miss Ashworth, Miss Lilias S. Ashworth, Mrs. Maurice Brooks, Lady Bowring, Miss Becker, Miss Tod, Mrs. Thos. Taylor, Mrs. Oliver Scatcherd, Miss Caroline A. Biggs, Miss Helen Blackburn, and Mrs. Scholefield, representatives from the metropolis, the West of England, Manchester, Belfast, Birmingham, Dublin, Exeter, Oxfordshire, Leeds, and Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

Mr. Forsyth having introduced the deputation, and several of the ladies having spoken,

The Chancellor of the Exchequer, in reply to their request that he would give his support to the Bill to be discussed next day in the House of Commons, said:-He thought that the ground taken by Miss Ashworth was one which was quite sound and proper, and if the question of the franchise was merely to be looked upon as one to be decided upon the ground that everyone who is not unfit to exercise it has a right to exercise it, then in a very large number of cases the case of the women was an unanswerable one. He thought they had the same right which men have to exercise any right which is to be treated as a right belonging to the English people. But then we came to the question whether that is exactly the view to be taken of the Parliamentary franchise. Now undoubtedly that is a doctrine which the advocates of extreme views on the subject of Parliamentary representation have always put forward. They argue, for instance, in favour of an extension of the county franchise, on the ground that a man who lives in a country town has as good a right to exercise the franchise as a man who lives in a borough town. People who take that ground have no cause whatever for resisting women's suffrage. The view he had taken of the Parliamentary franchise was that it is an artificial arrangement in the constitution of the country for the purpose of producing the best possible, or at least the best attainable, constituency for the election of a governing body like our Parliament, and therefore he should be slow to admit the mere plea that either this man or woman has as good a right to vote as that man or woman. He must consider, first, whether the alteration would be beneficial, and, secondly, whether it is at any given moment sensible and proper to make a considerable electoral change. He quite admitted, and he cordially agreed to this extent,

that where you have the case of women who are householders paying taxes, it is on the face of it very unequal, and in argument and principle an indefensible ground to take to say that because they are of a different sex from the men they are to be excluded from voting, while they are liable to all the incidence of taxation, and so forth, which falls upon the latter. But the Bill would raise the question of the lodger franchise, and that is a serious one. You must bear in mind at the time the last Reform Bill was passed serious questions were raised and long discussions took place as to whether lodgers were or were not entitled to the franchise, and it was finally decided that upon the whole they were to have it. Many considerations might be urged against at once admitting women lodgers to the same right as is given to men in all cases. Many curious questions might be raised with regard to the operation of such a change in the case of the lodger franchise and others. He had also to consider what the effect of admitting such a doctrine as that might be upon other changes that might be proposed in the electoral system. If he admitted they have the right to claim this upon the ground that a woman has a right to vote with a man, he did not quite see how he was to answer any claims which might be put forward that the inhabitants of particular districts or small towns and so forth, which are not now "borough towns," have as good a right to vote as householders in Bath or Bristol, or elsewhere. It resolved itself with him into a question of time and expediency, and he was bound to say, speaking quite frankly, that he did not think the present a particularly desirable time for re-opening the great electoral question. If he found himself unable to vote for the Bill to-morrow, it would be upon that ground, and not from any of the hesitation of mind which is indicated by many of those opposed to the Bill. He dissented altogether from the views of those who oppose the Bill because women are not qualified to vote; but, on the other hand, he had considerable doubts that so large and sweeping a change as is now proposed is one that ought to be adopted without great

consideration. He had also a doubt, if you adopted it, that you would not introduce greater changes in the electoral system than he was prepared to assent to.

The reply of the Chancellor of the Exchequer is so far satisfactory that it seems to carry an intimation that he would be prepared to support the grant of the franchise to women householders, in case of any future amendment of the laws regulating the representation of the people.

The forthcoming season is one which will demand earnest and energetic work and persistent pressing of the question on the attention of the country. The proposed extension of the principle of household suffrage to the counties is rapidly rising to the front; and from the attitude assumed towards it by the leaders of the Liberal party, we may regard the introduction of a new Reform Bill as an event that may occur at no very distant date, and for which it behoves the supporters of women suffrage to be prepared. The moment when the doors of the constitution are being opened to admit a new class of voters would be a favourable one for pressing the claims of any excluded class; and should the Women's Disabilities Removal Bill not have become law before the introduction of a more general measure of Parliamentary reform, the opportunity should be taken of urging the claims of the women, as well as of the county householders, on the attention of those responsible for the introduction of such a Bill, and on the Legislature itself.

Meantime, it is the duty of all who are convinced of the justice of the cause to support the efforts of those who are engaged in promoting the movement, and to strengthen the hands of the Parliamentary leaders by a renewal and increase of petitions, public meetings, and all other recognised modes of influencing and manifesting public opinion.

Your Committee ask for a renewal of their trust with the earnest determination to spare no pains in carrying out its object, and with the confident belief that the fruits of the ten years' agitation of the question are beginning to appear in increased strength of opinion in its favour.

MANCHESTER NATIONAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

RULES.

I. The object of the Society is, to obtain for Women the right of voting for Members of Parliament on the same conditions as it is, or may be, granted to men.

II. Approval of the object of the Society, and an annual subscription of any amount shall constitute membership.

III. The subscriptions are due on the first day of January for the current year.

IV. An Executive Committee shall be appointed at an Annual General Meeting, which committee shall have power to add to its number.

V. The Committee, at its first meeting subsequent to the Annual Meeting, shall appoint a secretary and a treasurer.

VI. A General Meeting of the Society shall be held once a year, to receive the report, the statement of accounts, to appoint the committee, and transact any other business which may arise.

VII. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the committee; and, at the written request of twenty-five Members, the secretary shall call a Special Meeting. At such meeting no subjects shall be discussed but those mentioned in the notice summoning the members.

VIII. No General Meeting of the Society shall be called without eight days' public notice of such meeting.

IX. These rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting; and no rule shall be altered at any meeting unless a month's notice of such proposed alteration has been given to the committee.

MANCHESTER NATIONAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

Members of the Society and others are earnestly requested to aid the movement for procuring the passing of the Bill to remove the electoral disabilities of women.

1. By collecting signatures to the petition, forms of which may be obtained from the Secretary.

II. By bringing the question under the notice of Members of Parliament, whenever they appear before their constituents.

III. Should notice of any motion, friendly or hostile, be given in the House of Commons—by writing letters, asking the local Members to support the principle of Women's Suffrage.

IV. In case of an election, by calling on every candidate to declare whether he will, if returned, vote for the Bill to remove the electoral disabilities of women.

V. By trying to procure insertions of facts and arguments bearing on the question in the local press.

VI. By communicating to the Secretary any information likely to be useful to the Society, and the names of such persons as may be disposed to assist the cause.

VII. Where there are three or four members in the same place, by uniting to form a local committee.

VIII. Byendeavouring to increase the number of members.

IX. Bypromoting the circulation of the Women's Suffrage Journal.

X. By extending the organisation of the Society through the medium of corresponding members or local committees. All persons willing to render such assistance are earnestly requested to communicate with the Secretary.

Further information will be willingly afforded to all who may desire it.

REPORT, 1877.



THE last Annual Report of this Society was presented at a meeting which took place in the Victoria Rooms, Clifton, on the 8th of March last. Lady Anna Gore Langton occupied the chair, and the meeting was one of the largest ever held in this district. Your Committee look back with a sense of satisfaction to the fact that among those who took part in the proceedings they may record the name of Mary Carpenter. This was probably one of the last, if not the last, great meeting she ever addressed. In moving a vote of thanks to the President, she said "she very warmly sympathised in the principles of the Society and wished it success." She was one of the Vice-Presidents of the Society, and one of its most distinguished members, and your Committee deeply deplore the loss the cause of Women's Suffrage, in common with so many other important movements in the direction of human progress, has sustained in her death.

Although rather less than a year has elapsed since the issue of their last Report, your Committee consider that they have a satisfactory amount of work to record. A large meeting was held in the spring at Exeter, addressed by Lady Bowring, Mrs. Bright Clark and Miss Tod. Meetings also were held by the friends and members of this Society at Cheltenham, Worcester and Frome. During the autumn there were two meetings in the rooms

of the Society, in Park Street, and a public meeting at Bedminster. Drawing-room meetings have been held at Stoke House, by invitation from Mrs. Budgett, and at Redland Hall, by invitation from the Misses Venning. In the former Miss Francis Power Cobbe took part, and over the latter Lady Anna Gore Langton presided. Both drawing-rooms were crowded, and the meetings were characterised by animated discussions of the question. The Committee desire to express their strong sense of the importance of these social meetings, and to mark their obligations to the ladies who have so kindly granted the use of their drawing-rooms. They would also express their acknowledgments of the valuable services rendered by many ladies and gentlemen of the neighbourhood who by their speeches have so largely contributed to the success of these meetings.

An influential conference of the members of the National Society for Women's Suffrage was held at Birmingham, in May, which was attended by delegates sent from this society.

On the 5th of June, the day before that fixed for the second reading of the Women's Disabilities Bill, a deputation, consisting of delegates from different parts of the country, waited upon the Chancellor of the Exchequer (Sir Stafford Northcote) at his official residence. The deputation was accompanied by several members of Parliament, and was introduced by Mr. Forsyth, Q.C., M.P. A full report of the proceedings will be found in the Women's Suffrage Journal for July. Sir Stafford Northcote has voted on several occasions in favour of the measure, and his support, from his character not less than from his position, is esteemed of great value by the promoters of this reform. The Women's Disabilities Bill was introduced in the House of Commons on 9th February, and the second

reading was moved by Mr. Jacob Bright. The rejection of the measure was moved by Mr. Hanbury, and seconded by Mr. Cartwright (Oxfordshire). The following members spoke in support of the Bill:—Mr. Forsyth, Mr. Hopwood, Mr. M'Laren, Sir J. M'Kenna, Right Hon. J. W. Henley, Mr. Jacob Bright and Mr. Leonard Courtney. The O'Donoghue, Sir W. Barttelot, Mr. Balfour, Mr. Beresford Hope and Mr. Butt represented the opposition. Mr. Courtney, who rose in reply to Mr. Butt, was interrupted by loud cries and persistent uproar until the time was passed for taking a division, and the debate, in consequence, stood adjourned.

During the session of 1877 there were more petitioners in support of the Women's Disabilities Bill than for any other measure brought before Parliament. In all, 820 petitions were presented, signed by 266,263 persons; of these, 140 were sent through the friends and members of this Society, signed by 31,538 persons, including 24 petitions, signed by 5,637 persons, sent through the Bath centre of the Society. No petitions were presented against the Bill.

In the present session of Parliament Mr. Leonard Courtney, in the regretted absence from ill-health of Mr. Jacob Bright, has introduced the Women's Disabilities Bill. It was read a first time on 19th of this month. The second reading is fixed for the 19th June, and the Committee trust that the interval thus afforded will be made the means of valuable moral support to Mr. Courtney, in the shape of numerous petitions and meetings, and by obtaining pledges of support from Parliamentary candidates at any elections which may arise. They would also remind those interested in the work of the Society of the absolute necessity of increased material assistance in order to carry that work forward to a successful issue.

The accounts for the year show a balance against the Treasurer of £44 10s. 9d., and to clear this deficit, as well as to provide for renewed and energetic action in promoting their enterprise, the Committee ask for the liberal help of all who have that enterprise at heart.

The Committee record with regret the resignation of their late Secretary, Mrs. Turner, who in the summer left to join her family in Australia; and in so doing would express their appreciation of the unremitting services rendered by her to the work and aims of the Society.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

CENTRAL COMMITTEE

OF THE

National Society for Momen's Suffrage.

Presented to the General Meeting, June 21st, 1877.

In once more laying before you the Report of the work they have effected during the past year, your Committee have to record the happily unusual conclusion to which the debate on the Bill to Remove the Electoral Disabilities of Women was brought in the House of Commons.

The Bill was introduced and read a first time on the 9th of February, and the second reading was fixed for Wednesday the 6th of June. Notice of opposition was given by Mr. Hanbury, member for Tamworth. On the 6th of June, Mr. Jacob Bright moved formally the second reading of the Bill. The opponents of Women's Suffrage summoned, as was reported, by a specially urgent whip, mustered in large numbers. Mr. Hanbury moved an amendment, which Mr. Cartwright seconded, that the Bill be read that day three months. The Bill was supported by Mr. Forsyth, Mr. Hopwood, Mr. McLaren, Sir J. McKenna, Right Hon. J. W. Henley, Mr. Jacob Bright, and Mr. Leonard Courtney; and was opposed by The O'Donoghue, Sir. W. Barttelot, Mr. Balfour, Mr. Beresford Hope, and Mr Butt.

Mr. Courtney, rising to support the Bill, in reply to Mr. Butt, who was the last speaker against the Bill, was interrupted by loud cries of "Divide!" The clamour increased as Mr. Courtney persisted in his right to speak, and it soon became evident that the opponents were determined not to give him a fair hearing. Notwithstanding, he continued his address until the hour arrived for the adjournment of the debate, when no division could be taken. Mr. Courtney, in a letter to the Times, written next day, stated that, "as it was believed by some members of the House of Commons that he rose for the purpose of talking out the Bill, he begged to be allowed to say that there was no foundation for the supposition. His desire was simply to reply to Mr. Butt's argument, and twenty minutes would have exhausted what he had to say, after which a division could have been taken. It was not until it became apparent that the opponents of the Bill would not listen to the arguments that the purpose was formed of preventing a vote."

Your Committee have to report that during the past Session there were presented to the House of Commons 799 Petitions, signed by 265,826 persons, in favour of the Bill. Amongst these Petitions were 17 sent from the following Corporations:—Birmingham, Dumbarton, Dewsbury, Denbigh, Edinburgh, Forfar, Falmouth, Girvan, Hartlepool, Jedburgh, Kirkcaldy, Lincoln, Southampton, Selkirk, Stafford, Tamworth, Wigton. Of these 799 Petitions, 191, with a total of 86,371 signatures, were sent by members and friends of the Central Committee. No Petitions were presented against the Bill.

The following public meetings have been held in London during the past season:—in the Vestry Hall, Kensington, Mr. Arthur Arnold, chairman; in the Beaumont Hall, Tower Hamlets, The Rev. Septimus Hansard, chairman; at the Lecture Hall, Greenwich, Dr. W. Bennett, chairman; in the Memorial Hall, Farringdon Street, Sir Andrew Lusk, M.P., chairman; and in St. James's Hall, Lord Houghton, chairman. Meetings have also been held in Deal, Dover, and Southampton. These Meetings represent but a part of the general work which has been carried on throughout the United Kingdom by other sections of the National Society for Women's Suffrage. Reports of their proceedings will be found in the "Women's Suffrage Journal."

Your Committee have to thank numerous friends for their kindness in lending their drawing-rooms during the past season, for the purpose of discussing the question of Women's Suffrage, and they would earnestly recommend such meetings as a valuable mode of action.

Your Committee have much pleasure in reporting that on the day previous to the second reading of the Bill, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, Sir Stafford Northcote, consented to receive a deputation of ladies interested in the measure, for the purpose of requesting his support to the Women's Suffrage Bill. The deputation was introduced by Mr. W. Forsyth, Q.C., M.P., and was accompanied by Sir Wilfrid Lawson, Bart., M.P., Mr. G. E. Browne, M.P., Mr. James Cowan, M.P., and Mr. Pateshall, M.P. Many other members of Parliament would have been present but for the unavoidably short notice that could be given of the appointed hour. The deputation was favourably received by the Chancellor of the Exchequer, who expressed his approval of the principles of the Bill, but doubted the expediency from a Ministerial point of view of re-opening the great electoral question at the present moment.

Your Committee have to deplore the loss of one of the earliest and staunchest members of the Women's Suffrage Society, Mrs. Harriet Martineau, whose death occurred during the summer. She was an earnest supporter of every movement tending to improve the social and political condition of women, and the effect of her labours will continue to be felt throughout the kingdom.

Within the last few days another distinguished member of the Society has been suddenly removed by death. Miss Mary Carpenter was one of those eminent philanthropists, whose exertions for the social elevation of various sections of the people have led them to become strong supporters of the Women's Suffrage movement, and her loss will be felt in regard to it throughout a wide circle.

Amongst the steps which have been taken to advance the work, your Committee desire to call your attention to the declaration from Women Householders, which is intended to form a record of a permanent kind of the demand of women to exercise the parliamentary franchise. Your Committee report with satisfaction that the declaration has already been signed by some most distinguished ladies, and

they hope that friends will help the cause by bringing the declaration under the notice of duly qualified women and obtaining additional signatures.

Your Committee desire also to make known that they are forming a collection of books and pamphlets relating to the legal and social position of women. Such a collection will be useful to the Members of the Society for reference, and they will be grateful for contributions of English and Foreign literature connected with the subject.

Your Committee feel that the interest in and sympathy with the cause, together with the disapproval of the tactics adopted by its opponents in Parliament, which is widely expressed both in society and in the Press, is of good omen for the future, and they earnestly request their friends to follow up these advantages by renewed exertions during the coming year.

By holding public meetings in support of the Women's Disabilities Removal Bill.

By the publication of pamphlets, leaflets, and other literature bearing upon the question.

RULES

Passed at the General Meeting of the Central Committee and Subscribers to its Funds, held July 17th, 1872.

- 1. The Central Committee shall consist of the present members, and such others as the Executive Committee may, from time to time, elect.
- 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of Members of the Central Committee, to be elected at the Annual General Meeting, and of single delegates, the same being Members of Local Committees, appointed by Local Associations to represent them; the Executive Committee having power to add to the number of the Central Committee, and to its own number, and to appoint the officers.
- 3. A subscription of any amount constitutes membership of the National Society.
- 4. A General Meeting of the Central Committee shall be held once a year, to appoint the Executive Committee, to receive the Annual Report and the Financial Statement, and to transact any other business which may arise.

- 5. The Executive Committee shall, at its first meeting, appoint the Officers.
- 6. A Special General Meeting may be called by the Executive Committee at any time; or, at the written request of not less than twenty-five members of the Central Committee, the Secretary or Secretaries shall call a Special General Meeting, to discuss such matters only as are mentioned in the notice of such meeting.
- 7. Eight days' public notice shall be given of all General Meetings.
- 8. The above Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting, after fourteen days' notice of the proposed alteration, given to the Executive Committee.

EDINBURGH NATIONAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

ANNUAL MEETING.

THE Tenth Annual Business Meeting of the above Society was held on 15th March, in the Bible Society's Rooms, 5 St Andrew Square, Edinburgh. Mr David Dickson, Master of the Merchant Company, occupied the chair.

Miss Wigham, in submitting the annual report, said the meeting had been delayed this year beyond the usual time. Through the early assembling of Parliament their arrangements had been somewhat altered, and this cause had also prevented their having their President, Mrs M'Laren, with them, and had deprived them of the presence of many of their Parliamentary friends who had rendered valuable service to the cause. She said apologies for absence had been received from Professors Masson, Calderwood, Hodgson, and Æneas Mackay; Mr Macfie of Dreghorn, Mr Trayner, advocate, and others.

"In presenting our Annual Report to our friends, we feel that there is necessarily a sameness in the statement of work done for the Women's Suffrage question, because the operations from year to year are similar, and the methods adopted do not greatly vary in character; yet it is expedient to report these operations, and to mention that these methods have been complied with; for like stroke on stroke which eventually overthrows the largest forest tree, so these strokes, dealt week by week and year by year, will eventually overthrow all opposition to the accomplishment of the just object we have in view.

"The *Petitioning work* has not been neglected during the past year. 183 petitions were sent from Scotland in support of Mr Jacob Bright's Bill. These were signed by 18,503 persons. Among these were one from fourteen members of the Faculty of Advocates, residing in Edinburgh; one from fifty-two physicians, surgeons, and medical practi-

tioners of Edinburgh; one from thirty-five ministers of various denominations; one from fourteen publishers and printers of Edinburgh; one from 189 rectors, head-masters, schoolmasters, and teachers in Edinburgh; two from 1012 women householders and ratepayers, residing in Edinburgh, 100 of whom were ladies residing in the principal streets, and paying rates, on the valuation of from £30 to £200 rental; nineteen from drawing-room meetings held in Edinburgh and various parts of the country; one from 600 women householders and ratepayers, residing in Aberdeen; eleven from town councils; eighty-seven from country towns; and fourteen from public meetings.

"Petitions have a two-fold operation—on the one hand, they help to educate public opinion, and on the other, to represent *that* opinion in Parliament with a view to influence the members there.

"The first of these objects has also been kept in view, and advanced by holding meetings throughout Scotland of a more or less public character. The most important of the latter have been drawing-room meetings, of which nineteen have been held, and many of these have been remarkably effective, as regards the numbers attending, and the position and influence of those who took part in them. Among these we may mention those held in Aberdeenshire, Fifeshire, Brechin, and in Edinburgh, and some of its suburbs, where the results were seen in the petitioning of large numbers of women householders.

"On the 6th of June 1877, Mr Jacob Bright brought forward his Bill in Parliament with his wonted ability and earnestness. He was met by very strong opposition, but by no logical argument, the sound reasoning being, as heretofore, on the side of justice in advocacy of the Bill

"Conscious of the great advance the question is making throughout the country, quite as much by men's minds becoming familiarised with the justice of our claim, as by the continued agitation in its favour, unusual efforts were made by the opponents of the measure in the House of Commons to prevent its chief advocates from being heard. This disgraceful conduct so roused the spirit of our friends that they prevented a vote being taken by speaking until it was time for the 'House' to rise.

"We have the satisfaction of knowing that our own friends remained true to us, and that some who were lukewarm were so heartily ashamed of the conduct displayed on that occasion as to be brought into nearer sympathy with us.

"While thus on no occasion has the measure met with such intense opposition as it did last session, on the other hand, it has never been more loyally supported. This opposition is not to be regarded as discouragement, because in all instances where increased interest in a question is recognised hostility becomes the more bitter; and we feel

that our cause loses nothing of its righteousness because it has not been accepted by the present House of Commons.

"We have reason to believe that the petitions from Scotland, many of which were presented on the day of debate, produced a highly favourable impression on both friends and opponents. Nor need this be doubted; for, as will be seen by their headings, they represent not only the precise class of women which the Bill was intended to benefit, but also other classes of men and women selected from among the most enlightened and influential of the community.

"We have to express our great regret that Mr Jacob Bright, whose health has recently suffered from a pressure of work, declined to bring in the Bill again during this Parliament; though, with the assurance that if it were thought best to introduce it again this year, he would give it all the help he could, as his interest in the question is unabated. We shall thus retain his valuable and faithful support to the Bill which has been taken up with much spirit by Mr Leonard Courtenay, M.P. for Liskeard, and which will be introduced to the House on the 20th of June, backed by the Hon. J. Stansfeld, Mr Russell Gurney, and Mr Jacob Bright. We claim in his support the help of all who love liberty and equal laws, who desire that the country shall have a real representation, and not as now a representation of the minority of the people of Great Britain. We wish to have petitions from all classes, and especially from women householders, to whom the Bill would give the right to exercise the vote. And during the short time that must elapse before the introduction of the Bill, we wish industriously to direct our efforts to secure such petitions.

"Although we cannot record that progress has been made in Parliament last year, we rejoice that there have been many manifestations of the recognition of the equal value of women as workers in the various walks of life—for example, their admission into the London Hospitals; their eligibility for degrees by the London University; their election as Poor-law Guardians in the city of London in larger numbers than at any previous election; their important position in the Social Science Congress, the Trades' Union Congress, and the great International Congress on the subject of morality, held recently at Geneva.

"In the United States the number of women who have entered the medical profession is reckoned by hundreds, and there is in Wyoming a very satisfactory argument in favour of giving the electoral franchise to women. We quote an impartial testimony to the good influence of women being recognised as electors:—'That never was there such order at the polls in any previous election as since the franchise was accorded to women and they went forward to record their vote.'

"During the past as in previous years we have to note that death has thinned our ranks. One of our own Committee has died, and among the friends we have lost, who invariably supported our cause, we may

mention the names of Mr William M'Crie and Mr Arthur Trevelyan. Outside of our immediate circle the names of Miss Mary Carpenter, Mrs Caroline Chisholm, and Mrs Nassau, sen., are present to remembrance, as those of noble women who have left their 'footprints on the sands of time.'

"While we lament the loss of these faithful workers, we feel that through it comes a fresh cause to us who remain to continue steadfast in principle and diligent in effort for the attainment of our object, in the unfaltering belief that the cause of justice and equity must ultimately triumph."

The Chairman expressed the pleasure it gave him to preside at this meeting, as he firmly believed that Women's Suffrage as now desired was just in principle, and would prove most beneficial in practice. The principle was now admitted by the Legislature and the country, as it had been introduced into the municipal franchise in England, and into the Parochial and School Boards franchise in Scotland, where it had worked most usefully. The adoption of women's suffrage in all departments of their electoral system was therefore a mere question of time. The principle of self-government was now universally recognised, and had become a constitutional axiom. But in order to make it work well they required to have purity of election and purity and intelligence of electors. As to the first, improvements had in recent years been made by the ballot and other changes. Their elections were now very orderly and quiet, and as they all knew they were quite secret. But it was more difficult to ensure the purity of electors and their intelligence. All who like himself had had to do with elections of various kinds, must have been surprised and grieved at the apathy and indifference shewn by a great number of electors in the exercise of their suffrage. They seemed to think it was a favour they were conferring on the persons for whom they voted, instead of a responsible duty which they had to discharge conscientiously and intelligently. He believed it would greatly tend to the purifying and elevating of their electoral system if they had women's suffrage introduced into all departments of it. He believed it would be generally used, and used conscientiously and intelligently. There was, he had always observed, an appreciation in women of the moral aspects of questions, which was often deficient in the other sex; and as they all knew, many of the public questions of the present day involved moral considerations of the most important kind. This was one reason among others which led him to think that women's suffrage would be most useful to the community.

The Chairman concluded by moving the adoption of the Report, and the re-election of the office-bearers and committee.

Mr Downing seconded the motion. He thought that the Report, taken as a whole, was encouraging, and that the cause was making quiet progress.

The motion was unanimously adopted by the meeting.

Mr Brown-Douglas, in rising to move the second resolution, said he had been surprised that claims to the electoral franchise on behalf of those women who possessed the qualification, should not have been at once acknowledged and conceded. There was no doubt of the influence which women exercised in political matters, and there was as little doubt of their ability to use that influence well. They saw it in different forms. He did not know whether there was as much lady canvassing as in former days, but it was one manner in which ladies had exercised their influence. Some also might remember how a few years ago the question of the ladies of the Queen's household remaining about the court, became the turning-point which prevented Sir Robert Peel forming an administration. In the debate which occurred last year one of the opponents of the measure said that ladies had not the opportunity of making themselves acquainted with political matters. He differed from that opinion, for surely they had the same opportunity of reading all the newspapers, and getting information on different subjects, that men had, while they naturally took the greatest interest in the elections, especially in their own districts. There were just two objections that he had seen to this very reasonable and just claim. The first was, that it took women out of their sphere to record their votes at a Parliamentary election. Women, however, could judge pretty well of what their own sphere was, and that was an objection that ought not to come from the opposite sex. He was afraid of the argument going too far. Our gracious Queen did not go out of her sphere because she took a natural interest, as the sovereign of a country must do, in political matters; and, on the same principle, no one could say that the female subjects of the Queen went out of their sphere when they took a like interest in political questions. The other argument

was, that women were easily led, and very easily misled. That argument, if allowed to have its due weight, would have an enormous influence in diminishing the electoral roll of this country, for most of those who voted on the opposite side from ourselves were "easily led, and very easily misled." (Laughter.) It did not take a woman out of her sphere to be charged with her share of the taxation of the country. The Chancellor of the Exchequer would be surprised at such an argument being adduced against a woman paying taxes, and so it could not take a woman out of her sphere to record her vote. The resolution which he had to submit was as follows:-" That, seeing taxation in this country is the basis of representation, it is a manifest inconsistency to exclude from the Parliamentary franchise a large number of ratepayers, who are duly qualified to be electors in every other respect, simply because they are women; that this exclusion is unjust to them, and acts injuriously on the community at large; therefore it is resolved that this meeting is of opinion that the Parliamentary vote should be given to women on the same conditions as it is granted to men; and further, that a petition to this effect be prepared to be adopted by this meeting, and signed by the chairman on its behalf, praying the House of Commons to pass Mr Leonard Courtney's bill 'to remove the electoral disabilities of women."

Mrs Nichol seconded the resolution, which, on being put to the meeting, was unanimously adopted.

On the motion of Miss Agnes Craig, a vote of thanks was given to the chairman, after which the meeting separated.

NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

Birmingham Society for Momen's Zuffrage.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, APRIL 16th, 1878.

Your Committee have this year only a short Report to lay before you. The overwhelming importance of foreign affairs has prevented the public from taking their usual interest in home questions and the work of your Committee has been limited to the circulation of pamphlets and the collection of signatures to petitions in favour of the Bill to remove the Electoral Disabilities of Women which will come before the House for its second reading on the 19th June. Your Committee deeply regret that, through ill health, Mr. Jacob Bright felt unable to continue to take charge of the Bill which has been so long indebted to his untiring advocacy. It is now introduced in the House of Commons by Mr. Leonard Courtney, M.P. for Liskeard, one of the earliest supporters of our movement.

As at the last Parliamentary Division the Bill was talked out we have not the usual method of estimating our gain or loss by the Division list. Promises of support however were received from new and unexpected quarters and it is a marked fact that we have so far never yet lost ground in the House of Commons. The numbers of the opposition have varied much, but each year the numbers voting in favour of the Bill have been equal or superior to the numbers in the preceding year.

The Town Council of Birmingham petitioned in favour of the Bill to remove the Electoral Disabilities of Women and just prior to the last Parliamentary Debate the Chancellor of the Exchequer received a deputation of ladies and gave courteous attention to their statement. Mrs. Ashford represented your Committee on this occasion.

By the retirement of Mr. Henley we lose a well known friend from the House of Commons but his help and counsel will still be at the service of the Society. The death of Miss Carpenter, whose life-long work in the cause of education is so well known, deprives our movement of an active sympathiser and in our own Committee we have to lament the death of Miss Bailey, whose clear judgment and ever ready help were invaluable to all who had the privilege of working with her. Although under the present Government little progress has been made in political reform, outside the House of Commons, your Committee have every reason to believe that there is a steady though quiet growth of public opinion in favour of the claim of Women householders to the exercise of the franchise and that the help they need towards carrying the question to a successful issue will not long be withheld.

REPORT, 1878.

It is under a deep and sorrowful sense of their own as well as of a great public loss that the Committee this year present their report to the members of this Society. The Lady Anna Gore Langton, the President of this Society, died on the 3rd of February, and in her death the Committee have to deplore the loss of a true and earnest counsellor, a courageous advocate as well as friend. To use the words spoken in her own parish church of Newton, "Her indefatigable energy in doing what she believed to be her duty, her kindness of word and manner to the humblest of her sisters, her love of truth and straightforward dealing, her warmth of affection as wife and mother, her constancy of friendship, were matters which were well known to everyone." A meeting held at Clifton a little more than a year ago was the last one over which her health permitted her to preside. Whenever she was asked why she supported the enfranchisement of women her invariable answer was, "I feel the demand is just, and that is why I am its advocate." Her name and generous help is associated with almost every work of the time having for its object the improvement of the faculties and position of women, and it is in common with the workers engaged in these kindred aims that this Society has suffered the irreparable oss which it is the painful duty of your Committee to record. Your Committee have already passed a resolution, and have forwarded it to her ladyship's bereaved family.

Since the last report was issued a large and influential

public meeting has been held by the friends of this Society at Hereford, and another public meeting has been held at Marlborough. At Sidcot, Westbury and Weston-super-Mare, ladies have kindly given their drawing-rooms for the discussion of the question, and very interesting meetings have taken place. A large public meeting was held at the Victoria Rooms, Clifton, on the 23rd January, under the presidency of the Rev. Dr. Caldicott. This meeting was addressed by Mr. Courtney, M.P., in a speech of great power and ability, also by Mrs. Bright Clark and other ladies and gentlemen. Mr. Lewis Fry, the newly elected member for Bristol, was unable to be present, but sent a letter announcing his intention to support the question in Parliament. On the following day a conference was held under the presidency of Mr. W. Killigrew Wait, M.P., and was attended by delegates from Scotland, Ireland, and from various branches of the Suffrage Society in England. Valuable papers were contributed by Professor Masson, the Rev. J. B. Spring, Miss Le Geyt, Miss Becker, Mrs. Sheldon Amos, Mr. A. W. Bennett and Mrs. Hallett, after the reading of which discussions followed on the various points raised. The Committee desire to cordially acknowledge the services rendered to the Society by the writers of these papers, and at the same time to express their sense of the great importance of such conferences, affording as they do the means of an interchange of thought and idea, as well as an opportunity for social intercourse between distant workers engaged in the same cause.

During the past session 84 petitions, signed by 15,781 persons, were forwarded by the friends of this Branch of the Society to members for presentation to Parliament. Besides these 20 petitions were sent from Bath and its neighbourhood, making a total of 104 petitions, signed by 18,288 persons, from the West of England.

The Bill was introduced last year into the House of

Commons by Mr. Courtney, M.P. The discussion took place upon the motion for second reading on the 19th June, and the speeches in its support were among the finest which have been delivered. The speakers and speeches upon the opposition side were almost the same as we have been accustomed to hear in past sessions. On a division there were-For the Bill, 140 votes; against it, 219; majority against the Bill, 79. In the previous session of 1876 the majority against the Bill was 87. Mr. Courtney has announced this session that instead of bringing forward the Bill again in this Parliament he will proceed by resolution, the discussion of which will take place on the 7th March. Your Committee trust that efforts will be used by their friends in each constituency in the district to secure the attendance and support of members in the House of Commons on that date.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

CENTRAL COMMITTEE

OF THE

National Society for Women's Suffrage.

Presented to the General Meeting, July 1st, 1878.



Your Committee, in submitting to you the Report of the work done during the past session, desire to express their regret that, owing to ill-health and consequent absence from England, Mr. Jacob Bright felt it necessary to resign the conduct of the Bill to remove the Electoral Disabilities of Women. During the winter, therefore, negociations were opened with Mr. Leonard Courtney, M.P., and in November last delegates from the various Women Suffrage Societies waited on him for the purpose of inviting him to take charge of the Bill, and your Committee have pleasure in informing you that he was good enough to accede to their request. Previously, however, your Committee had ascertained, by means of a private conference held at the Westminster Palace Hotel, at which Mr. Hibbert, M.P. presided, the opinion of the most influential supporters of the movement in Parliament as to the advisability of bringing the measure before the House of Commons this session. As the majority of those present were in favour of the re-introduction of the Bill, your Committee felt no hesitation in requesting Mr. Courtney to take the necessary steps to secure an early day for the second reading.

It is with a feeling of great satisfaction that your Committee record the amalgamation of the two Societies for Women's Suffrage previously organized in London—an amalgamation which they regard as a means of strengthening and advancing the cause which they have so much at heart.

Your Committee have to record with the most profound regret the deaths of Mr. Sharman Crawford, M.P., Sir Francis Goldsmid, M.P., and Mr. Russell Gurney, M.P. These three gentlemen have been for many years warm supporters of all questions that have affected the condition or interests of women, and to each may be given the title, which, it is said, Mr. Russell Gurney was proud to bear, "the Friend of Women." Your Committee have also to deplore the loss of Mr. Edward Spender, on whose sympathy and ready assistance they could always rely, and whose good work for the cause of women is too well known to require recapitulation here.

The work organized by your Committee during the past session is as follows:—Public Meetings both in London and the provinces; Lectures delivered by members of this Society, and other ladies and gentlemen; Drawing-room meetings; and At Homes held in the office for the purpose of discussing, with those interested, the best means of forwarding the movement.

The Public Meetings held in London have been at the Camberwell Hall, Mr. William Rabbits (chairman); Belmont Hall, Clapham, Mr. W. Martin Smith (chairman); Shoreditch Town Hall, Sir Charles Reed, of the London School Board (chairman); and at St. George's Hall, Mr. Hibbert, M.P. (chairman). The country Meetings were held at Oxford, Prof. Thorold Rogers (chairman); Leicester, Mr. Fred. Mott (chairman); High Wycombe, Mr. John Wyeth (chairman); and Reading, Mr. Silver, Mayor (chairman).

The Lectures were delivered at the Collier Memorial School, Peckham; the Tower Hamlets Conservative Club; the Westminster Democratic Club; the Progressive Club, Notting Hill; at the rooms of the Women's Provident League; the Lecture Hall, Borough Road; the South London Secular Club; at the Clayton Memorial School, and at the College for Working Men and Women.

Your Committee wish to take this opportunity of thanking Miss Blackburn, Mrs. T. de la Cour Carroll, and Mrs. Glover; Mrs. Harrison, Mrs. Macdonell, and Mrs. Imray of Beckenham; Mrs. Hale of Eton College, the Misses Davenport Hill, Mrs. Newton of Lee, and Mrs. Thomas Taylor, who have kindly held meetings in their drawing-rooms for the purpose of discussing the question of Women's Suffrage. Your Committee earnestly hope that in the ensuing session further meetings of this kind may be organized, as they consider them the most valuable means of educating public opinion on the subject.

The Bill to remove the Electoral Disabilities of Women was ordered to be read a first time on the 18th January, and the second reading was fixed for Wednesday, June 19th. Notice of opposition was again this year, as in 1877, given by Mr. Hanbury, now M.P. for North Staffordshire. On the day appointed, Mr. Courtney, in a very able speech, moved the second reading of the Bill, to which Mr. Hanbury moved as an amendment that it be read that day three months. Mr. George Palmer, the new Liberal M.P. for Reading, in his maiden speech, seconded Mr. Courtney's motion, and was followed on the same side by Mr. Serjeant Sherlock, Mr. Blennerhassett, Mr. Gorst, Mr. Hibbert, and Sir Henry Jackson. The opponents were Mr. Smollett, Mr. Ferguson, Mr. Beresford-Hope, Mr. Greene, Mr. Assheton, and Mr. Newdegate. The debate was conducted in a more courteous manner this year than last, and was one of the most earnest discussions which has yet taken place in support of the measure. At 5.30 a division was taken, and the following result was announced:

For the Bill 140
Against 219

Majority 79

But this result has been since officially corrected, and it appears that 220 voted against the Bill, thus making the adverse majority 80.

The last division taken was after the debate of 1876, when the votes were 152 for and 239 against. The following table shows the comparative numbers:

Of the 155 members who thus recorded their support of the Bill this year, 23 were Scotch, 26 Irish, and 106 English and Welsh. Of those opposed to it, 19 were from Scotland, 29 from Ireland, and 187 from England and Wales.

The number of Petitions presented in favour of the Bill this session has been 710, containing 172,711 signatures. Of these 223, with 76,681 signatures, have been obtained through the efforts of your Committee,* who desire to point out the important character of some of these Petitions. Those namely, from the Town Councils and Corporations of Aberdeen, Crewe, Dewsbury, Dumfries, Edinburgh, Falmouth, Forfar, Kendal, Kidderminster, Kirkcaldy, Leeds, Middlesboro', Neath, Northampton, Paisley, Peebles, Scarborough, Stockton - on - Tees, Stromness, Sunderland, and Walsall; twentyseven separate Petitions from Women Householders from various parts of the Kingdom, most of which were numerously signed, and among which may be noticed the names of Mrs. Grote, Miss Florence Nightingale, Miss Helen Taylor, Miss Buss, Mrs. William Grey, th Countess of Buchan, and the Hon. Mrs. Liddell; a Petition from Clergymen of the Church of England, and another signed by 64 Masters, Professors, Fellows and Tutors of Cambridge. Amon

the Edinburgh Petitions were the following:—From Ministers of various Denominations; from 216 heads of Banking and Mercantile Firms; from 43 Physicians, Surgeons and Medical Practitioners; from 105 Members of the Faculty of Advocates and Writers to the Signet; and from 185 Rectors, Headmasters, Schoolmasters, and Teachers.

The Declaration from Women Householders which was inaugurated last year by your Committee, and which is intended to form a record of a permanent kind of the demand of women to exercise the parliamentary franchise, has since received many valuable signatures of women, whose names are well known in the world of art, science, and literature.

It is with satisfaction that your Committee report that many interesting and important contributions have been made to the library during the past year; and that the object for which it was established, viz., to serve for reference to members of the Society, has been attained. Your Committee gladly avail themselves of this opportunity to thank those friends who have kindly assisted them in carrying out this project by presentations of books and pamphlets.

In closing their Report your Committee desire to express their satisfaction with the progress which the enfranchisement of women is now making in every class of society. Although the division list on the Second Reading of the Bill was on neither side so large as in previous years, yet there is reason to believe that the measure has not lost ground in the House of Commons, while there is ample evidence to show that the measure has gained considerably in the country. There never was a time when signatures to Petitions were more easily obtained, or when the workers of the Society met with so cordial a reception from the public. In order that this satisfactory progress may be continued your Committee earnestly appeal to all who are interested in the object of this Society to assist to the best of their power in carrying on the work. They have already set forth the various means which they have adopted for advancing the movement, and they would welcome suggestions of new methods and increased co-operation in the labours of the next year.

RULES

PASSED AT THE GENERAL MEETING OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE AND SUBSCRIBERS TO ITS FUNDS, HELD JULY 17TH, 1872.

- 1. The Central Committee shall consist of the present members, and such others as the Executive Committee may, from time to time, elect.
- 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of members of the Central Committee, to be elected at the Annual General Meeting, and of single delegates, the same being members of Local Committees, appointed by Local Associations to represent them; the Executive Committee having power to add to the number of the Central Committee, and to its own number, and to appoint the officers.
- 3. A subscription of any amount constitutes membership of the National Society.
- 4. A General Meeting of the Central Committee shall be held once a year, to appoint the Executive Committee, to receive the Annual Report and the Financial Statement, and to transact any other business which may arise.
- 5. The Executive Committee shall at its first meeting appoint the officers.
- 6. A Special General Meeting may be called by the Executive Committee at any time; or, at the written request of not less than twenty-five members of the Central Committee, the Secretary or Secretaries shall call a Special General Meeting, to discuss such matters only as are mentioned in the notice of such Meeting.
- 7. Eight days' public notice shall be given of all General Meetings.

8. The above Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting, after fourteen days' notice of the proposed alteration, given to the Executive Committee.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

THEFT LIMITAL INTERNAL

In presenting their Eleventh Annual Report, your Committee are able to congratulate their friends on the result of a year's steady and persistent work, and on the general condition and progress of the movement.

After it became known in the autumn of last year that Mr. Jacob Bright would be unable to continue the charge of the Bill in the House of Commons, a deputation of members of the various societies for women's suffrage waited on Mr. Leonard Courtney, M.P. for Liskeard, to convey to him their request that he would introduce the measure. Mr. Courtney consented to do so.

The Bill was brought in and read a first time on January 18th, and the second reading fixed for the 19th of June. The names on the Bill were those of Mr. Courtney, the Right Hon. Russell Gurney, the Right Hon. James Stansfeld, and Mr. Jacob Bright. On June 19th Mr. Courtney moved the second reading of the Bill in an able and exhaustive speech; and the measure was supported by Mr. George Palmer in a maiden speech, Mr. Serjeant Sherlock, Mr. Blennerhasset, Mr. Gorst, Mr. Hibbert, and Sir Henry Jackson. Mr. Hanbury moved the rejection of the measure, and was followed by Mr. Smollett, Mr. Fergusson, Mr. Beresford Hope, Mr. Greene, Mr. Assheton, Mr. Newdegate. The Bill was lost by 140 votes to 219; majority against the Bill, 79, according to the tellers. The division list gave the number of the adverse votes as 220.

In the division of 1876 the numbers were—for the Bill, 152; against, 239; majority against the Bill, 87. It appears therefore that the numbers of the supporters of the Bill were diminished by twelve and of the opponents by nineteen, although

a systematic and organised canvas against the Bill had been carried on in the lobbies of the House of Commons, by the members of the Committee which has been organised, under the presidency of Mr. Bouverie, "for maintaining the integrity of the franchise in opposition to the claims for the extension of the parliamentary suffrage to women."

The efforts of this Committee did not succeed in drawing into their ranks any of the supporters of the Bill, while one or two who had formerly voted against it followed Mr. Courtney into the lobby.

The result of the division is the more satisfactory considering the remarkable disproportion between the numbers of friends and opponents who have been removed from the House of Commons since the division of 1876. Of the 259 who then voted against the Bill, all but five remained members when the recent division was taken; but of the 152 supporters of the Bill in 1876, seventeen had disappeared from the House of Commons in 1878.

Of these we have to deplore the loss by death of five, namely, Mr. Cawley, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Sharman Crawford, Sir Francis Goldsmid, and Mr. Russell Gurney, Recorder of the City of London.

Mr. Russell Gurney's name will always be associated with the women's suffrage movement. He was teller with Mr. Mill in the first division that took place in the House of Commons, and since 1874 his name has been on the back of the Women's Suffrage Bill. Your Committee desire to place on record their deep sense of the loss which the cause of women's suffrage, and of all questions of justice to women, have sustained by his death, and to offer to his memory a tribute of profound admiration of his high qualities and of deep sorrow for his loss.

Of the members who have been removed otherwise than by death, six have been transferred to the House of Lords, namely Mr. Bathurst, now Earl Bathurst; Lord E. Bruce, now Marquis of Ailesbury; Mr. Disraeli, now Earl of Beaconsfield; Lord Eslington, now Earl of Ravensworth; Mr. Gordon, now Lord Gordon; and the Hon. A. Kinnaird, now

Lord Kinnaird. Six have resigned their seats: Mr. Carter, Mr. Deakin, Mr. Dixon, Mr. Henley, Mr. Neville Grenville, and Mr. Pateshall.

Thus 117 constituencies, as against 94 last Parliament, give clear and full votes for the Bill; and 19 clear, though not full, votes for it. Therefore 136 constituencies appear as clearly ranged in favour of the Bill.

During the Session of 1877 there were presented to the House of Commons 722 petitions signed by 173,521 persons in favour of the Women's Disabilities Bill. No petitions were presented against the Bill.

The petitions sent through the efforts of members and friends of the Manchester Society were 197, with 53,289 signatures. The petitions from Manchester received 14,397, and from Salford 6,836 signatures. Your Committee desire to urge upon their friends the extreme importance of keeping up the number of the general petitions so long as the Bill remains before the House of Commons.

Meetings have been held during the past financial year at the following places:—South Shields, Morpeth, Failsworth, Colne, Bishop Auckland, Stockton-on-Tees, West Hartlepool, Boston, Retford, Newark, Chesterfield, Pendleton, Bury. Your Secretary has attended at all these meetings, and in most of them has been accompanied by Mrs. Oliver Scatcherd. Miss Caroline Ashurst Biggs has also rendered valuable assistance at some of them. These meetings have all been very well attended, in many cases the rooms have been crowded to excess: while hundreds have been turned away from the doors for want of room to accommodate them. The petitions for the Bill have always passed either without dissent, or have been carried by overwhelming majorities.

The meetings that have been held have been followed up in each town by a systematic effort to enlist new members of the Society. This mode of action has been attended with very satisfactory results. The members so enrolled keep up their interest in the Society year after year; and your Committee have found by practical experience, since they organised the work under present arrangements, that the meetings have not only been productive of good political results, but have proved a highly profitable investment of funds, returning a handsome interest for the outlay in the form of a subscription list.

Meetings organised independently of your Committee, but partially aided by them, have been held in the following places:—

Batley, Beverley, Bridlington Quay, Cranswick, Dewsbury, Driffield, Nafferton, Lazenby, Eston, Eston Mines, Heckmondwike (3), Howarth (2), Middlesboro', Redcar, Marskeby-the-Sea, Oakworth, Mexbro', Denholme, Dent, Skelton-in-Cleveland, Brotton-in-Cleveland, Ripon, Thirsk, Holbeck, Ashton-under-Lyne (4), Taunton (Lan.), Heywood, Bury (6), Ramsbottom, Elton, Gigg, Castleton, Rochdale (2), Rawtenstall (2), Radcliffe Bridge, Middleton, Kirkby Stephen, Winton, Northampton, Green Norton, Hook Norton, Towcester, Banbury. Petitions have been adopted at all these meetings.

The Summer Lectures have been to some extent resumed this season, but your Committee were unable to undertake much of this work, as the funds at their disposal at the time when the lectures could have been arranged did not justify them in incurring the outlay. The only lectures given were delivered by Miss Becker at Harrogate and at Ilkley, and were highly successful. The audiences at these and similar places are select, and are composed of ladies and gentlemen from all parts of the country, who, when they disperse, carry away to their own localities the information they have gained. Thus a much wider range of influence is obtained by these lectures than by any meeting of a merely local character. The lectures are given at a season when ordinary public

meetings cannot be held with advantage; they are, therefore, the means of using time and opportunities for extending the work which would otherwise be lost. For these among other reasons your Committee strongly recommend the continuance of this mode of agitation, and, as the season approaches next year, they would suggest that a special effort should be made to raise funds for the purpose.

The municipal elections offer an occasion for the exercise of women's suffrage, of which advantage should be taken in agitating for the extension of this right to parliamentary elections. A meeting of women electors of St. Luke's Ward, Manchester, was convened by your Committee, which was attended by both the candidates in the November elections, and, after an address from Miss Becker, both candidates pledged themselves, if returned to the City Council, to vote in favour of a petition for extending the parliamentary franchise to women householders. Similar meetings have been held by Mrs. Oliver Scatcherd in Leeds.

In addition to addressing meetings organised by this Society, Miss Becker has attended meetings for the Central Committee at Oxford and London, and for the Bristol Committee at Hereford.

Members of debating societies in the following towns have applied to your Committee for papers and information for use in discussions on women suffrage: -Airdrie, Barrow-in-Furness, Batley, Belfast, Birkenhead, Birmingham, Bishop Auckland, Blackburn, Bolton, Bradford, Broughton, Bury (Lancashire), Bury St. Edmunds, Cambridge, Canterbury, Cardiff, Cheetham Hill, Chester, Coventry, Crumpsall, Darlington, Douglas, Dublin, Durham, Ellesmere, Exeter, Glasgow, Grimsby, Hornby, Huddersfield, Hurworth-on-Tees, Inverarie, Inverness, Lancaster, Leeds, Liverpool, Llandaff, London, Malton, Manchester, Mansfield, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Newport (Mon.), Newtown, Northampton, Norwich, Nottingham, Oldham, Ormskirk, Ossett, Oswestry, Owens College Union, Parsonstown, Preston, Rotherham, St. Helens, Salford, Saltburn, Scarborough, Sheffield, Shrewsbury, Southampton, Swinton, Wigan, Wray. Packets containing the Parliamentary debates and other literature have been forwarded to each of the applicants.

During the past year, your Committee's Agent, Mrs. M'Cormick, has visited the following places:-Burnley, Southport, Durham, Sunderland, Huddersfield, Preston, Ashton, Honley, Blackburn, Darwen, Derby, Lichfield, Hanley, Burslem, Stafford, Leek, Macclesfield, Scarborough, Liverpool, Wigan, Wolverhampton, Walsall, Dudley, Kidderminster, Kendal, Colne, Darlington, Middlesborough, West Hartlepool, Northallerton, Ripon, Thirsk, Hull, Grimsby, Morpeth, South Shields, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Bishop Auckland, Stockton-on-Tees, Chesterfield, Newark, Retford, Boston, Grantham, Harrogate, Ilkley, Bury, Failsworth, Nottingham, Flint, Holywell, Mold, Newcastle-under-Lyme, and Norwich. Mrs. M'Cormick arranged and attended the twelve public meetings organised by your Committee; accompanied Mrs. Oliver Scatcherd to Tamworth and Newcastle-on-Tyne at the Parliamentary elections; attended deputations to candidates; and devoted 133 days to office and other work in Manchester.

Your Committee deemed it desirable in beginning their financial year to open a separate banking account for the Women's Suffrage Journal. Since the 1st of November, 1877, all expenses of printing and production of the Journal have been paid out of moneys received by the treasurer of the Journal account for advertisements and for copies sold. Your Committee have paid into the Journal account the same price for the copies distributed by them as is charged to the Central and other Committees. Publishers and booksellers have been supplied at trade prices. Your Committee have the gratification of finding that the expectations they formed when making this arrangement have been fulfilled, and that on this footing the Journal has been thus far self-supporting. They would ask their friends to continue their support of the Journal, and to use every effort to promote its circulation.

Your Committee desire to offer copies of the Journal, presented monthly, to free and other libraries, literary institutions,

mechanics' institutions, political and other clubs, co-operative stores, debating societies, and reading and news-rooms of all descriptions. They have already received from a large number of such institutions an intimation that their offer is accepted, and that the *Journal* will be placed in their reading-rooms for the use of their members. They would be glad to receive applications from the managers of news-rooms and libraries which have not yet obtained the *Journal*, and they will present it regularly for the future to those who desire to receive it.

Your Committee congratulate the Society on the financial results of the year. Notwithstanding the general depression of trade in these districts the ordinary subscriptions have rather increased than diminished. In addition to this, a sum of £50 was offered on condition that a certain amount should be subscribed by others, and in response to this appeal many generous friends gave special donations. Through this liberality your Committee were enabled not only to complete their season's work without serious embarrassment, but also to pay off arrears of debt amounting to £206 for printing informer years. They have now the satisfaction of feeling that, though they end their financial year with a smaller balance in hand than they had at the beginning, they have no outstanding liabilities, and all funds that may be entrusted to them next year will be devoted to carrying on and extending their work.

In presenting themselves for a renewal of the trust reposed in them, your Committee pledge themselves to devote their best energies to the work before them, and they earnestly hope that in re-imposing it on them, their friends will continue and increase the moral and material support necessary to carry it on to a successful issue.
