liberals!

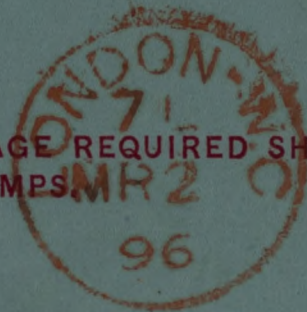
Why does John Morley rob his own
