## Third Annual Report.

The first and second annual reports of this Association date from April, 1921-22 and 1922-23. In 1923 the date of the Annual Meeting was postponed from May till November, and it was decided to hold it in future on the Saturday nearest to St. Andrew's Day (November 30th), and to end the financial year at Michaelmas. The third report, therefore, covers a period of eighteen months from April, 1923, to September, 1924, and in considering the funds raised it must be borne in mind that some subscribers have paid two subscriptions during that period.

### President:

Your Committee have been honoured by the gracious consent of H.R.H. the Duchess of York to become President of the Scottish Women's Hospitals' Association. Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of York paid an informal visit to the Hospital on November 29th, 1923, and were also present the same evening at the Annual Ball in aid of the funds of the Scottish Women's Hospitals' Association.

### Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary:

Other appointments were that of the Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary. The Lady Moira Combe and Miss Dorothy Hunter respectively, have kindly undertaken these offices. Miss Hunter is organising the needlework and knitting in connection with the Association. Anyone wishing to help in this way should write to her at 28, Bramham Gardens, S.W.5. Babies' garments are always needed.

### Members of Committee:

Your Committee have pleasure in reporting that several new members of Committee have been elected, and that there has been an extension in the circle of subscribers and donors.



### Junior S.W.H.A.

A subsidiary branch of the S.W.H.A. was started to encourage small subscribers of 5s. and under. Miss Audrey Seldon most kindly undertook to be Hon. Treasurer, and by her own unaided efforts has been able to hand over £12 14s. 6d. to the funds. This sum is a most satisfactory and encouraging beginning.

### "B.M.E.F. Bed."

The endowment of the "British Macedonian Expeditionary Force Bed" was complete by November, 1923, and the brass plate commemorating this endowment was handed to the Hospital by General Sir George Milne, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., on the occasion of the last Annual Meeting. There is no public memorial to the British Macedonian Expeditionary Force in England, and many former members of the Force expressed their deep appreciation of the S.W.H.A. memorial.

### Other Beds.

The funds for the other Beds have been increased by those especially interested in them, and as soon as the endowment of the "B.M.E.F. Bed" was finished, your Committee decided to concentrate on the "Elsie Inglis Bed." One of your Committee, Mrs. Arthur, most generously offered to make a donation of £300 to complete the endowment if £700 could be obtained in a limited time. Owing to the kindness of Lord Riddell in giving £100, this sum was obtained. Your Committee are now concentrating their efforts on work for the endowment of the third Bed, namely, the "London Units of the Scottish Women's Hospitals." *At the Annual Meeting the name was changed to "Evelina Flowerfield"*

### St. Andrew's Eve Ball.

*Bed*

The main source of income of the Association is the St. Andrew's Eve Ball held annually. In 1923 this took place at Claridge's Hotel on November 30th. Tickets were £2 2s. each, and owing to the exceptional efforts made by the Ball Committee, the result was £250 more than in 1922, although the General Election had prevented a number of people from taking tickets. After paying all expenses, the sum of £605 was realised.

### Autumn Lectures:

An interesting series of three lectures was given in the autumn, through the kindness of the following lecturers: Mrs. Beauchamp Tufnell, Mr. W. De La Mare, and Mr. John Slater, F.R.I.B.A.

### Other Activities:

The Association also profited by the proceeds from their stall at the Garden Fête held in Lord Leverhulme's garden in June, 1923, and from the Waterlow Court Pageant in July, 1923. The entire stock of the stall at the Garden Fête was given by Lady Ossulston. The tenants of Waterlow Court, Hampstead Garden Suburb, desired the proceeds of their Pageant to be given wholly to the "Macedonian Bed Fund."

Further additions to the funds of the S.W.H.A. were obtained from a Jumble Sale, Concert, and two small Dances held respectively at the Shoreditch Town Hall and the Imperial Hotel, Russell Square, W.C.1.

**Conversion of S.W.H.A. Beds to Maternity Beds.**

Many changes are taking place this year in the Hospital buildings, owing to the falling in of the lease of the Marlborough Maternity Home. The Home, which was in Endsleigh Street, contained 33 beds, for which provision had to be made, as they were essential to the work of the

Gynaecological and Obstretic Unit. The Hospital had a considerable piece of ground and funds for building at its disposal, and, therefore, a readjustment of wards has been made, in addition to the building of a new Home for Nurses.

The four S.W.H. Memorial Beds have now become Maternity Beds, and the Association have the satisfaction of knowing that the Maternity Committee of the American Women's Club provide all the clothes for the Mothers and infants while in Hospital.
