Dear Madam

Some little time ago there
was issued from your Office a prin-
ted form asking for a statement
from members as to whether they
were willing or able ~~to~~ or willing
& able to resist the payment
of Rates & Taxes.

I replied I was "willing & able"
& I understand there were 11
or so others who made the same
reply.

I think it most probable
that Suffragist bodies will ap-
ply to you for the names & ad-
resses of these 12 or so, who

replied in the affirmative.

In case any one representing
any body of Supremacists,
whether at 4 Clements Lane (Mr.
Pambour's section) or at
18 Buckingham St. (Mr. Dupard
section) or the Men's League
or any other private or official
person whatsoever enquires of
your officials staff or members
for the names of those who are
"killing & able", I must ask
you on no account to reveal
my name, which I give in
solely for your own use, & to
treat my statement to you as
entirely private & confidential.
If a list of the 12 "killing & able"
has become common property

at your Office (which it no doubt
very properly & naturally has done
as I sent at the time no cau-
tioning board) I will ask you to
caution those from staff or
members who have seen the
list, not to give my name to
anyone calling or writing for
information.

As I think it probable you
may at any moment be asked
for this information I will ask
you to be kind enough to take
immediate steps on receipt
of this to fore warn any of your
members or officials who may
be approached by outsiders.
I repeat extremely giving you

all this trouble, but quite unfore-
seen circumstances have arisen
which oblige me to take these
precautions for the present at
least.

I address this to both your Offices
in Victoria S. (the Nat. Union of S.S.)
& the Central Suff. S.) as I do
not remember from which the
forms were issued. I thought &
think it an excellent measure
for you to have initiated, & that
it would be a splendid piece of
policy if well carried out, & I hope
you may be able to elicit a fuller
response ere long from women
ratepayers.

I shall be glad in giving a line in ack-
nowledgment to know whether possibly
my name has already with others been
shown to any outside person or Body - & if
so to whom?
