It's not all physical, and people need to remember that. This isn't just a feminist movement and that's what gives it its hope. This pledge is not life changing for me, but it could be others" "all issues that affect women negatively affect men too, thus it is just as much men's responsibility to speak out as it is women's. All genders, colours and creeds should unite to end one of the most despicable and yet commonly ignored forms of terror and suffering in the world." "I grew up in a house where my dad was violent against my mom and I was lucky that I still have a mom. A couple of times there was real risk of him killing my mom and I would have grown up with a murderer for a father and no mother. The very fact that he ever laid a violent hand against her shows that he isn't a real man because real men do not dominate the women they love or threaten them with violence or act violently towards them." "I believe both men and women are dehumanized by a society where rape, domestic violence and abuse against women are so commonplace." "I have two daughters and I want to make sure this never happens to them. It has happened to too many of my friends and it needs to stop." "I want to help end men's violence against women because it is a vital step toward true equality." "I care about justice and understand the effect victimisation and abuse has on all members of society" "I was once a victim and hid it for a long time. It was only with the braveness of myself and with the help of my best friend that I went to seek help with Lighthouse. Please pledge on behalf of myself and the many women and men alike, being abused both physically and mentally." "There are widespread instances of violence against women by men. Its degree of prevalence would not be tolerated against any other group. The more people who speak out against it the harder it will become for men to be violent against women" "No personal violence is ever right" "it is a crucial aspect of moving forward towards a less gendered, more equal world. Because everyone has a right not to be a victim of violence" "Domestic Violence is still a taboo subject in many families, communities, educational institutions and workplaces. We each need to take it upon ourselves to change this. "I am a child survivor and I know what it can be like to have a mum who is a victim, a father who is a perp but does not have the skills to change, and I know what it is like to be a child who is powerless to stop the violence, abuse and control." "it is an inexcusable crime" "there is simply no reason for it to ever happen. Everyone makes their own decisions in life and an act of violence, against anyone or anything, is a conscious decision." "far too many women are killed by their partner and the effect on their children is heartbreaking if we stop the violence more lives would be saved..."
