I will be phoning you either later this week or early next week. I wish to bring back the three volumes of "The Sheild "which I have. At the same time as doing this, I want to see any material which you have that could be used for my book (which is now in the final stages of redrafting). My publisher is prepared to have from 12 to 14 illustrations. What I had in mind were not so much the usual photos of the leaders (if we have some of lesser known people like Jessie Craigen, that would be very nice) but of leaflets, pamphlets and 'action photos. However I will phone you a couple of days before so that we can make a proper arrangement. I will keep the copies of the Vote which I have. I would like to collect every scrap of material you have on the Women's Freedom League. I want to do the same sort of job on this as I have tried to do on the Suffragist and Suffragette movements, which is to draw the evidence for my conclusions from the 'raw materials' of the Movement itself.
