

CONSTITUTION.

TITLE.

THE EDINBURGH NATIONAL SOCIETY FOR WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE.

OBJECT.

To obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.

METHODS.

The adoption of all legal and constitutional means to advance the Object:—

- (a) By acting as a centre for collection and diffusion of information with regard to the progress of the movement in all parts of the country.
- (b) By holding Public Meetings.
- (c) By the distribution of Pamphlets, Leaflets, and other literature bearing on the subject.
- (d) By the formation of Women's Suffrage Societies.
- (e) By working at Elections and By-Elections according to the policy of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies.
- (f) By getting up petitions in favour of the Reform.

MEMBERS.

Men and women in favour of the "Object" shall be eligible as members.

SUBSCRIPTION.

The Minimum Annual Subscription shall be One Shilling.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

- (a) The Executive Committee shall consist of not more than twenty-one members, that is to say, of the President, two Vice-Presidents, the Secretary and the Treasurer, and sixteen ordinary members.
- (b) The Office-bearers and the ordinary members of the Executive Committee shall be elected by the members of the Society at the Annual Business Meeting.
- (c) The Members of the Executive Committee shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election: vacancies during the year to be filled by co-option.

- (d) Nominations for members of Executive Committee shall be in the hands of the Secretary by the 15th of January.
- (e) Election shall be by ballot.
- (f) No one shall be eligible as a member of the Executive Committee who is a member of (a) any Political Party Organisation or (b) any Militant Suffrage Society.
- (g) The Executive Committee shall meet at least once a month. Five members shall form a quorum.
- (h) The Executive Committee shall have the right to appoint Sub-Committees, of not less than three members, one of whom must be a member of the Executive Committee; the others may be ordinary members of the Society.

THE PRESIDENT.

The President shall convene all meetings which shall be called by the Secretary.

The Chairman shall have a deliberative and a casting vote.

FINANCE.

The Financial year shall close on the 31st of December.

The Treasurer shall submit a Balance-Sheet at the Annual

The Accounts shall be audited annually by an auditor appointed by the Society.

MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY.

The Annual Business Meeting shall be held in February.

Other business meetings shall be arranged by the Executive Committee

Extra-ordinary business meetings shall be called on the written requisition of four members of the Executive Committee, or of twelve ordinary members of the Society.

Seven days' notice shall be given of all business meetings, and the business to be transacted shall be intimated on the cards summoning the meeting.

Fifteen members shall form a quorum.

ALTERATION OF CONSTITUTION.

The Constitution of the Society can be altered at the Annual Business Meeting or at any General Business Meeting, if, after the statutory notice has been given, two-thirds of the members, present and voting, vote for the alteration.

(i) The Office-bearers and the ordinary members of the Executive Committee shall be elected by the members of the Society at the Annual Business Meeting.

(c) The Members of the Executive Committee shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election: vacancies during the year to be filled by co-option.

THE Executive Committee of the Edinburgh National Society for Woman's Suffrage have the honour to present their Report for the year 1912.

The outstanding feature of the year, as far as the Society is concerned, was the Midlothian by-election, a three-cornered contest, which resulted in the loss of a safe seat by the Government, a win for the Unionists by the narrow majority of 32 votes, and the polling of 2,400 votes, for the first time of asking, by the Labour candidate, Provost Brown of Dalkeith.

The detailed report of the campaign will be given elsewhere, but the Executive Committee take this opportunity of recording their high appreciation of the work of their Organisers. The workers sent down from the headquarters of the National Union expressed the highest admiration of the patient and thorough preparation of the constituency by Miss Alice Low and Miss Lisa Gordon, without which success would have been impossible.

Public Meetings.

The Annual Meeting of the Society took place on 8th February in the Oak Hall of the Edinburgh Café, Miss Mair presiding. The Report was presented by the Honorary Secretary, and its adoption was moved by Mrs Abbott in a fine speech. There was a large attendance of members, and over £20 was raised in donations and promises for the Albert Hall Meeting on 23rd February.

The chief Public Meeting organised under the auspices of the E.N.S. was that held in the Music Hall on 26th March in favour of the Conciliation Bill, which was to come up two days later for its second reading.

Miss Chrystal Macmillan presided over a large and enthusiastic audience, and Lord Robert Cecil, in a magnificent speech, moved the

resolution:—"That this Meeting calls upon the Members of Parliament for the City, the Leith Burghs, and Midlothian to be present in the House of Commons on 28th March, and to vote for the second reading of the Concilation Bill."

Mrs Snowden, in a moving and eloquent address, seconded the resolution, which was carried unanimously.

The Edinburgh Society also gave valuable help to the Scottish Federation in connection with the great meeting in St. Andrew's Halls, Glasgow, on 9th December, at which Lord Lytton and Miss A. Maude Royden were the speakers. The meeting, which was organised under the joint auspices of the Scottish Federation, the Glasgow Society, and the C.U.W.F.A., was intended as a counterblast to the Anti-Suffrage Demonstration held five weeks previously in the same Hall, at which Lord Curzon was the chief speaker. The counterblast was entirely successful.

A special train from Edinburgh carried close on 200 people to the demonstration.

Minor Public Meetings.—Minor public meetings have been held at Broxburn, Bo'ness, Loanhead, Gorebridge, Portobello, Penicuik, Mid-Calder, Linlithgow, Bathgate, Livingstone, West Calder, East Calder, Oakbank, Bonnyrigg, Dalkeith, Armadale, and Musselburgh.

Jumble Sale.—A Jumble Sale, by which we raised over £,18, and cleared over £13, was held on Saturday, 27th April, in the Buccleuch Street Hall.

Miss A. L. Balfour took charge, assisted by Mrs White, Mrs Knott, and Mrs Nicol; and Messrs C. Scott Moncrieff and Holmes acted as door-keepers.

Drawing-Room Meetings.—A number of successful drawing-room meetings were held during the year. The thanks of the Society are due to Miss Begbie, Mrs Freeland Barbour, Mrs Inglis Clark, the Misses Pott, Mrs Cumming Craig, The Misses Kemp, Miss Lamont, Mrs Hugh Rose and Miss Sutherland, who kindly lent their drawing-rooms.

During the summer three most enjoyable suffrage parties were given by Councillor and Mrs Matthew White; Mrs Mapleton and Miss E. J. Scott Moncrieff; and the Misses Watson, Blackness House.

These parties resulted in a considerable increase, both to the membership of the Society and to its funds.

By-Elections.—During 1912 the Edinburgh Society had two by-elections in its area, namely, East Edinburgh and Midlothian.

The year began with the by-election in East Edinburgh. The three weeks that elapsed between 11th January, the date of the

nominations, and 2nd February, which was polling day, were days—and nights—of hard and almost incessant work for the organisers and their helpers.

Following the policy of the National Union, which supports the best friend of Women's Suffrage, the Society worked for Mr J. M. Hogge, Radical, the Unionist Candidate, Mr J. Gordon Jamieson, being, if not an avowed Anti-Suffragist, at least unsatisfactory from the suffrage point of view.

Mr Hogge was returned by a majority of 915.

A large number of meetings were held throughout the constituency, many of them at night, and in the open air. No praise is too great for the devoted labours of the organisers, and of those who helped them by speaking, canvassing, keeping committee rooms, distributing bills, &c.

We wish particularly to thank Mr William Lowson, who spoke for us several times, and helped in many other ways; Mrs and Mr J. Dan Easson, the Rev. John Glasse, Dr Elsie Inglis, Miss Hilliard, Miss Kirby, Miss Moody, Mrs Wilson, Miss Bury of the North-Eastern Federation, who was with us three weeks, Miss Beauchamp of the Peebles Society, and many others whom we are unable to mention individually for lack of space. We must again thank Miss C. M. Gordon, of the Northern-Eastern Federation, who gave up part of her holiday in order to come and speak for us.

Midlothian By-Election.—This by-election, caused by the resignation of the Master of Elibank, chief Government Whip, could hardly have come at a more inconvenient time, beginning as it did in the middle of August, the holiday month, and continuing till 10th September.

The candidates were the Hon. A. Shaw, Liberal; Major Hope, Unionist: and Provost Brown, Labour.

Following the development of the National Union policy decided on at the General Council Meeting held in London in May, the Society supported Provost Brown.

The National Union sent down organisers and helpers from headquarters and other branches, while Miss Margaret Robertson took command of the work for the Election Fighting Fund Committee of the N.U.W.S.S.

Members of the E.N.S.W.S., and the Society's Organisers played a prominent part in the campaign. Miss Low, hurriedly recalled from her holiday, began work on 12th August. She interviewed all three candidates without loss of time.

Mr Shaw (L.) would give no promise except with regard to adult suffrage.

Major Hope (U.), while approving the principle of the Conciliation Bill, would give no promise of any kind, while Provost Brown

was willing to support each form of Women's Suffrage in turn, when amendments to the Reform Bill came to be voted on.

Provost Brown being himself so good a suffragist, and as a member of the only political party which has made Women's Suffrage a plank in its platform, received the full support of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies.

Committee rooms were opened—one at Dalkeith, in charge of Miss Mary Henderson (Dundee) and of Mrs Aldersley; the other at West Calder, in charge of Miss Emily Foggo (S.F.W.S.S.) and Mrs Townley.

The county was roughly divided into two districts, under the captaincy of Miss Alice Low and Miss Lisa Gordon, while the Central Committee rooms, at 40 Shandwick Place Edinburgh, was under the able supervision of Miss Edith Kirby (S.F.W.S.S.).

There are over fifty towns and villages in Midlothian, and openair meetings were held in every place, while in the larger towns meetings were very numerous, amounting to from 100 to 150 in all. An open-air demonstration, in which no less than ten speakers took part, was held at Dalkeith one Saturday afternoon, a deeply interested audience remaining for over three hours.

A magnificent meeting took place in the Forrester's Hall, Dalkeith, on 3rd September, when Mrs Philip Snowden and Mrs Anott Robinson delighted the audience with their brilliant speeches.

At West Calder Miss Margaret Robertson addressed a Labour meeting for nearly an hour, while awaiting Mr Ramsay Macdonald's arrival, and at Dalkeith she was the favourite speaker at a great Labour demonstration on the Saturday before polling day. At that demonstration eleven dozen suffrage badges were sold.

The largest and most striking open-air meetings were held at Newtongrange, where the whole village turned out on three occasions to hear our speakers, and where the audience lined up to cheer us as we drove away.

We wish to express our thanks to the following members of the Society who gave us help during the election campaign:—Miss E. M. Loudon, Mrs Guyer, Mrs Dickson, Miss K. Scott Moncrieff, Dr Inglis, Dr and Mrs Taylor, Mrs Turnbull, Miss A. H. Begbie, Mrs Philips, Miss Fanny Braid (Livingstone), Miss Elizabeth Moody, and many others. Miss Moody gave up a large part of her holiday, and was indefatigable as Secretary and seller of the *Common Cause*, of which more than 2,000 copies were sold during the campaign.

Towards the close of the campaign Miss S. E. S. Mair came down to Dalkeith for the express purpose of holding a tea-party for the workers.

We also wish to thank the North-Eastern Federation for lending two of their organisers—Miss Bury and Miss Beaver. Numbers of "Friends" were enrolled in the various centres, and these have since proved themselves willing and able to give good support to the cause.

On the eve of the poll, all our speakers were requisitioned to address our candidate's meetings on the question of Woman's Suffrage. The Labour candidate being in this way enabled to hold more meetings than those held by any other candidate—56 in all.

The E.N.S.W.S. wishes to publish this record of its appreciation of the speakers and helpers sent by the N.U.W.S.S., and by the Scottish Federation for the election.

Chief among speakers may be mentioned—Miss Margaret Robertson, Mrs Anott Robinson, Miss Muriel Matters, Mrs Chew, Mrs Earp, and Miss Alice Crompton.

Special thanks are also due to Muriel, Lady de la Warr, for frequently lending her motor cars both during the campaign and on polling day, and to Councillor Margaret Ashton, who sent her car all the way from Manchester to convey voters to the poll.

Everyone combined to make the election work go smoothly, and all the workers faced hardship and fatigue with undiminished zeal and unruffled temper.

Sales.—Owing to the great success of the Fancy Fair in 1911, it was resolved to hold another in the autumn of 1912. It took

place in St Cuthbert's Hall, King's Stables Road, on Saturday, 26th October, and proved most successful.

Mr Charles Price, M.P. for Central Edinburgh, opened the bazaar with an excellent speech, and gave a donation of $\pounds 5$. The Chair was occupied by Mr Laurence Irving, whose company was playing in Edinburgh at the time, and who is as charming a speaker as he is an actor. Miss S. E. S. Mair gave expression to the feelings of the Society by returning its heartfelt thanks to both gentlemen, who, in spite of countless other engagements, found time to show their sympathy with the cause in so practical a manner.

The sum realised during the day, including donations, amounted to £188. It is impossible to thank individually all the members who worked so indefatigably for the bazaar, but special thanks are due to Mrs Purves, Organising Secretary and Convener of the Bazaar Committee. Mrs Purves and her Committee worked untiringly for weeks beforehand, and it was largely owing to her admirable management that everything went so smoothly, and that the expenses were kept down to the astonishingly small sum of £25.

Suffrage Calendar.—In connection with the Sale, the Literature Stall brought out a Suffrage Calendar, having on the front page the figure of the bugler in the colours, and inside twelve pages, each page being dedicated to a famous woman. The Calendar was greatly admired, and 1,100 copies were ordered from the printers. Several societies availed themselves of the offer to buy 100 copies at cost price—the retail price was 1s.; and it was stocked by the National Union, so that the whole issue was soon disposed of.

Supplementary Sales.—A Supplementary Sale, to dispose of the goods left over from the Fancy Fair, was held in the Office, 40 Shandwick Place, on Tuesday, 11th December. It was opened by the Lady Frances Balfour in a delightful speech. In the afternoon a most enjoyable concert was given by Mrs Young, Miss Brotchie, Mrs Nesbit, Miss Denne Parker, and Mrs Pillans.

The Society thanks these ladies most heartily, and also Miss Fowler, who told fortunes, and added greatly to the interest of the afternoon.

The Sale realised about £18.

Council Meetings.—It is a source of satisfaction to the Committee that the Society have sent its full number of delegates to the Council Meetings of the National Union, and to the Annual Meeting of the Scottish Federation.

OUR BRANCHES.

Bo'ness.—A branch of the Society was formed this year in Bo'ness, which has now a membership of forty-four.

This satisfactory result is due to the untiring efforts of Miss Kate Andrew, and other members of the local Committee.

Miss Borthwick was responsible for the organising of a successful public meeting in Linlithgow in December, which was addressed by Mrs Guyer and Miss Alice Low.

The Bo'ness Branch helped to organise several of the meetings, of which mention has already been made.

In addition, the branch took a stall at the Fancy Fair held in Edinburgh on 26th October, and made over £20

Dalkeith.—Mrs Charles Somerville, Hon. Secretary of the Dalkeith Branch collected a splendid contribution from the Dalkeith members, and herself assisted at the Sale on 26th October.

Reception.—A reception in honour of the Delegates to the Annual Meeting of the Scottish Federation was held at 40 Shandwick Place on 29th March, when the following ladies acted as hostesses:—Miss Macmillan, Miss Simson, Dr. Elsie Inglis, and Miss Loudon.

The Reception was held on the day following the defeat of the Concilation Bill, and Miss Maude Royden cheered the spirits of all present by an eloquent and forcible speech. Miss Brotchie gave some delightful recitations, which were greatly appreciated.

Miss Florence Raeburn acted as Convenor of the Hostess' Committee, and Mrs Wilson gave most valuable help.

Miss Royden's Week.—The Society was fortunate enough to secure the services of Miss Maude Royden for the week beginning Monday, 11th November.

Miss Royden addressed public meetings in Morningside, Bo'ness, Bathgate, and Musselburgh, and a Drawing-room Meeting kindly given by Miss Sutherland.

Miss Royden also spoke at the weekly "At Home" at the Office,

when she gave a spirited defence of the election policy of the National Union.

Her singular charm as a speaker is well-known to those who have had the privilege of hearing her. The large audiences and the great number of converts obtained at her meetings are the best testimony that could possibly be given to her eloquent and convincing speeches.

The Society hopes that it may have the great pleasure of again welcoming her to Edinburgh next year.

Weekly Meetings.—It is a matter of satisfaction to the Executive Committee that the weekly meetings have increased enormously in popularity during this last year. The audiences have grown in numbers, and the questions and discussions which invariably ensue, are a proof in themselves of the good use of these gatherings.

Press Work.—In the early part of 1911 the Executive decided, at the suggestion of Dr Inglis, that as mis-statements with regard to Women's Suffrage so constantly occurred in the Press, it was desirable that the papers should be carefully watched, and mistakes rectified whenever possible. A sub-committee was therefore appointed to deal with the matter.

In the Spring of this year, owing to the great increase of work, it was thought desirable to enlarge this Committee, the question of Women's Suffrage having become of such immense importance and occupying so large a place in the public eye. The following members of the Society consented to act:—Mrs Guyer (Convener and Secretary), Miss Scott Moncrieff, Miss Kilgour, Miss Lindsay Jardine, Miss Kate Andrew, Mrs Philips, Miss Crum, Miss Maud Morin, and Mrs Eddington.

The Society feels that to the untiring work and perseverance of the Press Committee is largely due the much more friendly attitude of many of the papers in its area.

We are in particular much indebted to the *Evening News* for innumerable acts of assistance and friendliness, and its ready willingness to insert letters and communications.

A column entitled "Woman's Outlook" has been started in the Weekly Scotsman, and has proved of the greatest interest and use to suffragists.

Through their work, the members of the Press Committee have come into personal contact with the Editors of the different papers, and the result has been a clearing away in many cases of misunderstanding and prejudice: greater prominence has also been given in the Press to the spade work of the N.U.W.S.S.

No words can express the deep gratitude of this Society to Mrs Guyer for her able direction of the Press Committee.

Friends of Women's Suffrage.—The Friends of Women's Suffrage are all those who believe that it is just and desirable that women should vote for Members of Parliament, but who do not wish to become *members* of the Suffrage Society.

The Friends of Women's Suffrage scheme is a scheme for enrolling and organising all those sympathisers, whether they are men or women, and to whatever class they belong.

This scheme was inaugurated at the Council Meeting in London last May, and was adopted by our Society in August. Many "friends" were enrolled in the campaign in Midlothian, numbering in all about 300. Besides these, nearly 200 people have been enrolled in Edinburgh.

This scheme involves a considerable amount of additional work, the bulk of which has fallen on our devoted Hon. Secretary of "Friends," Miss Rachel Jeffrey. We should like also to thank those who helped Miss Jeffrey in her arduous task. The Misses Evelyn and May Simson, Miss Winifred Nicolson, Miss Doris Forsyth, Miss Hilliard, Mrs Docherty, Mrs Haig, Miss Mary Gilchrist, Miss J. M. Brown, and Miss Whalley.

In Midlothian we have received most valuable help from Miss Wallace, Mrs Dickson, Miss Lucy Bruce, and Miss Fraser.

Our President.—The Society again offers its loyal and devoted homage to Miss S. E. S. Mair, who is the recognised leader of the Suffrage Movement (non-militant) in Scotland, being the President of the Scottish Federation as well as of the Edinburgh National Society.

Our Vice-Presidents. - Miss Frances Simson, M.A., by her wise counsel, has safely guided the Society through times of uncertainty and stress.

Miss Chrystal Macmillan, M.A., B.Sc., is an invaluable member of the Central Committee of the N.U.W.S.S. She ably represents the Scottish point of view on that Committee, and interviews the Scottish Members of Parliament when any crisis in the political situation occurs.

Our Hon. Auditor.—We wish to record the grateful thanks of the Society to Mr George Dall, our Hon. Auditor, who ungrudgingly gives us his services, although our annual receipts and expenditure have increased to such an extent that the work is more than doubled.

Our Hon. Treasurer.—The Society deeply regrets the resignation of Miss Hilda Cotterill, who for more than three years has filled the anxious and often harassing post of Hon. Treasurer. The Society owes a deep debt of gratitude to Miss Cotterill, not only for the excellent work she gave in her own department, but also for the valuable services she has rendered both as worker and speaker. As will be seen elsewhere, Miss Cotterill during this year addressed five meetings outside the Society's area, and four within it—no small addition to the already heavy work of Hon. Treasurer. Her place has been filled by Mrs Wilson, who for long has done admirable service on the Finance Committee. The Society is very fortunate in being able to place this important branch of its work in such capable hands.

Our Hon. Secretary. - The Society wishes to record its appreciation of the services of its Hon. Secretary, Miss K. M. Loudon, whose services, willingly given on all occasions, have been of great value during the past year.

Our "Common Cause" Secretaries.—Miss Moody and Mrs Philips, who have undertaken all work in connection with the selling and distribution of "The Common Cause," have thereby relieved the office of a great amount of clerical work. Under their able supervision the sales of the paper have greatly increased.

Our Organisers.—The Committee takes this opportunity of expressing its high appreciation of its organisers, Miss Low and Miss Lisa Gordon. Part of their work has already been alluded to, but it is quite impossible to recognise it adequately. Both organisers habitually do so much more than "it is their duty to do," and in times of stress such as by-elections, public meetings, etc., they willingly give. up their leisure, and work hours' overtime. Miss Low is an eloquent and convincing speaker, and her services are in constant request. Miss Gordon is also an excellent speaker, and in addition to her office work she gives the Society valuable service by frequently taking meetings in all parts of its area.

Help given in the Office.

The report of the year's work would be incomplete without recognition of the constant help given by many members of the Society.—We particularly wish to mention:—Mrs Easterbrook, Mrs Eddington, Mr and Mrs J. Dan. Easson, Miss A. L. Balfour, the Misses Gilchrist, Mrs Turnbull, Mrs Bartholomew, Miss Jamieson and many others. We are also greatly indebted to Mrs Inverarity, who on several occasions has kindly lent her motor car. The results of the Society's labours up to 31st December 1912 may be analysed as follows:—

> Membership, 904; increase of 200. Income, £962. 9s. 3d.; increase of £117. 14s. 9d. Public Meetings held, 8o. Election meetings indoor and outdoor, 172; other outdoor meetings, 30—Total, 282.

The advance has necessitated an addition to our office staff in the person of Miss Maud Abbott, whose unselfishness and devotion are beyond praise.

We face the year 1913 with courage and determination. In the words of Mrs Fawcett, President of the Union, "He who runs may read the signs of the times. Everything points to the growing volume and force of the Woman's Movement. Even if victory should be delayed it cannot be delayed long. The suffragists ought to be the happiest of mankind, if happiness has been correctly defined as the perpetual striving for an object of supreme excellence and constantly making a nearer approach to it,"
