You must forgive me for not being certain which, but although my home address is at the head of this paper I shall not be at home for a few days, and cannot refer to the paper kindly sent me. We are rejoicing over another Women's Victory here, the return of Mrs Wintringham for Louth. I hear excellent accounts of her and I am confident she will help Lady Astor very efficiently in her efforts to improve the laws relating to the protection of young people of both sexes, and the setting up of an equal moral standard for men and women.
