Dear Mr. Matheson,

I shall be very glad to see you here on either Monday or Tuesday morning next week, if you care to come at 12 O'clock. But I confess I am not very sympathetic about the kind of question you bring before me, nor have I any time myself to give to it. My feeling is that we are too apt to think too much of machinery and too little of the actual doing of things. But I daresay I am quite wrong. At any rate I shall be glad to see you and hear what is intended. I am really far more anxious to make the Settlement a school of social experiment than I am to make it a school of social research. Such an experiment, for instance, as trying to supply St. Pancras with School Clinics would ~~be~~ have my entire sympathy, and would, I think, be much more useful for the Settlement and for the neighbourhood.
