Dear Madam,

I write to inform you of the decision arrived at by the Executive Committee of the London Society on the subject of your request to be supplied at cost price with 20,000 copies of a pamphlet entitled "Some Objections to W.S. considered". The Committee will be very happy to sell the pamphlet to the N. Union at cost price on the understanding that they are to be used for electioneering purposes only and are not to be sold to other constituent societies within the Union, nor to other persons.

3,000 copies of the pamphlet were sent to Miss Palliser at Hull, and 500 have since been sent to Devonshire, so that we still have 16,500 copies to deliver. These shall be sent to the Offices of the N.U. as soon as I hear from you that your Committee agrees to the terms proposed. The price of the 20,000 copies will be £4.17.5. which is the sum we pay for them.
