BRITANNIA'S WARNINGS TO THE BRITISH PEOPLE

For months ERITANNIA has been warning the country aginst the peril of Germanism in office and especially in the Foreign Office. We urged at the same time that the diplomatic military and naval policy of the Allies should be thorou co-ordinated and a common centre established.

Practical steps have now been taken by the Allies to realise the last named of these necessities. Sin Edward Grey and Lord Robert Cecil too, are now regarded and are openly declared by an increasing number of the Eritiish people to be unfit for the positions they hold. An increasing number of people are also beginning to realise the price we are having to pay for harbouring in our Forcign Office the nephew of Admiral von Holtzendorff, not to speak of others, who by birth' marriage or inclination are more or less (and often more) inclined towards Germany Auctria, or (what is the same thing in practical effect) towards Bulgaria. TO BOILING POINT:

The attempt to suppress ERITANNIA came; as we repeat; as no surprise to us especially as in our issue of December 10th. we revealed the fact that Sir Edward Grey has in so many words expressed the opinion that Serbia ought to be annexed by Austria. We had, weeks bofore that, revealed to the public his treacherous oppositi to giving military help to Serbia. The publication of the Howel letter implicating, a it does prominent military and political personages, brought the desire to suppress ERITANNIA to boiling point!
