Dear Hannibal

Sophia undertook
to inform you of our pleasant journey
& safe arrival on Monday Evening - they
bore the exertion of travelling so very well
that we took a Chaise at Leeds for Hare-
gate & arrived here soon after 8 o'clock &
thus accomplished our object in one day -
which is far preferable - cheaper & less
troublesome than the Sociable would have been.

Your letter of the 20 Sept. only reached
me this morning - It most likely
did not leave Manchester till Wed.
morning. I am glad that the Owners of
the large Import. of Boin. will not take
to - there is not much fear of any low
prices - There are Holders of Boin. at
Leid. who will not let it go to the
Consumers so very cheap - Both Cannals
& Hardwaremen would sooner buy it themselves
than let this Lot go at any
With regard to the Bl. Powder - let

Ediel take 14 more Mangrove & 14
more O.V. not weaker than 146 to 148
& 3 - of same as before - I am aware
that the Pt. Powder sent Mangrove was
not quite so strong as Swindels, but
I thought it so near that it might be
sentured - It is possible enough that
Swindels may have fed the Man
who works the Powder - Tell Ediel
he must continue to do his Best
I hope to hear that the Ediel at Madras
is set - Do not go near Wright about
the Land - we must wait with patience,
I think it will be best to get the Ediel
at Ghale Map soon - I mean the
Meadow only - As for the other Land
it may remain as it serve as Manure,
But if you can get 29 - let it go either
to Wade or the other Partner, ^{either} I would
give Wade the Preference & allow him
to pay for completing the Marling - Or
I would take 28 from Wade provided he
will give 4 - for the Ediel - He demands
5 - for the Marling from which the 4 for

the Ediel might be deducted so that only
1 would have to be deducted from the risk
Rent - I entertain but little hope of seeing
a good acct. about poor Charles - he is
mentally dead & I fear past recovery
The letter from his Sister contains pleasant
news - about his Pt. in Law having been pro-
moted & his Income increased - He recom-
mends him to be married as he might at
last be happier in the married State
He had however not written to them since
Feb^r last - It is very proper to take an
Invent^r of his Effects - The Warrigate
Waters has a good effect on your Mother &
I feel much refreshed by the change &
I think the Waters do, but not in such
quantity as your Mother - I am not yet
accustomed to this idle life - but can tell
better in a few days - at present I think
of staying a week from this time -
We have pleasant Society - your Mother &
Mr. Alexander from Halifax seem very
sociable & happy together - & Sophia & Eliza
very well - Do not be more away from
York^r & Mr. Valt^r than you can help - If Mr. W.
Lowe calls - let him have what money he wants
for Manure - Love to all
