UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN

REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th NOVEMBER, 1936

The following report gives some account of the work of the Union during the past year.

The scope of the activities of the Union falls into two main categories. In the first place, it co-operates with other Jewish and non-Jewish bodies, by means of representation on those Committees which have for their object the promotion of the interests of girls and women. Contact is also maintained with societies where women can be of service in furthering humanitarian, educational and peace ideals. Secondly the Union devotes itself especially to the welfare of Jewish gentlewomen. By means of the loan fund, they are enabled to train for professional careers; another fund provides holidays and convalescent treatment; and a small special fund affords financial help.

German Jewish Members of the Executive Committee are co-operating in this work and are still serving on the German Jewish Refugee Committee,

the Schools and Girl's Technical Training Committee, and the Women's Appeal Committee.

Committee Mrs. H. L. Nathan, J.P., has resigned from the Executive Committee owing to pressure of other work. She has, however, consented to remain a member of the Loan Funds Committee, who are glad to retain her interest and her services.

The Committee would like to take this opportunity of thanking Mrs. Harry Myers (Dundee), Mrs. Hersch (Cambridge), Mrs. C. Levy (Middlesbrough) and Mrs. Haldinstein (Norwich), who are no longer able to represent the Union in their localities.

The Committee record with regret the death of Frl. Berta Pappenheim, for many years their correspondent in Frankfurtam-Main. Frl. Pappenheim was an outstanding personality of great spiritual force and a social worker of wide experience, who had not only vision but also the driving force to achieve her aims.

The Committee also record with sorrow the death of Mrs. W. Sebag-Montefiore, for many years their correspondent in Montreal. They are glad to know that Miss Daphne Sebag-Montefiore will act in her mother's place and so continue the long connection of her family with the Union.

The Committee regret that Mrs. Melchoir is no longer able to act as correspondent in Copenhagen, but they welcome in her stead Miss Helga C. Melchoir, whose services in the cause of social work in Denmark are well known.

Meetings The Annual General Meeting was held on the 24th February, 1936, at 50, Porchester Terrace by kind invitation of the Hon. Mrs. Ernest Franklin. The President spoke briefly of the work undertaken by the Union and Mr. Leonard G. Montefiore, O.B.E., gave a most interesting account of the situation of the Jews in Germany under the title "Judaism in the days of Humiliation." The address gave rise to an animated discussion.

As a result of the interest aroused at the meeting addressed by Dr. Moodie, Medical Director of the London Child Guidance Clinic in October, 1935, a visit to the Clinic was arranged for members and friends of the Union on the 14th January, 1936. After a very interesting demonstration members were shewn over the building.

A Meeting was held on the 26th October, 1936, in the Rose Hertz Hall, Woburn House, when Mrs. Model, M.B.E., presided and Mrs. Norman Bentwich spoke on "The Position of the Jews in Many Lands," illustrating her remarks from her own experiences in some of the countries mentioned. The able treatment of a subject of paramount importance was followed with close attention and evoked many pertinent comments.

Social Gathering for A delightful evening party for friends and Friends and Workers workers of the Union was generously of the Union given by Mrs. George G. Jacob, at 129, Hamilton Terrace, N.W.8, on July 8th,

1936. An original and charming selection of songs by the One Act Opera Company added to the attractions of the evening and the friendly atmosphere created by the hostess resulted in many helpful contacts being made.

Loan Funds These Funds consist of :

THE UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN'S LOAN FUND and THE LOUISA, LADY GOLDSMID FUND.

The Funds are available for loans to enable educated Jewish women and girls to train for professional and other careers. Loans are granted to cover fees, maintenance and expenses incidental to training.

There are at present thirty-eight loans outstanding, amounting to $f_{1,430}$ 14s. 9d. During the year five new loans were granted and four additional loans to trainees already assisted by the Funds, amounting to f_{424} 1s. 0d. This necessitated the sale of investments, thus carrying out the policy of the Committee to utilize the Funds to the utmost extent possible.

Repayments during the year amounted to £195 9s. 0d,. including the completion of the repayment of the following four loans :---

(1) Loan of £200 granted 1925/28 for Teacher's Training

(2) Loan of £4 granted 1930 for Secretarial Training.

(3) Loan of £4 granted 1935 for Secretarial Training.

(4). Loan of £10 10s. granted 1936 for Montessori Training.

During the year twelve students have completed their training, most of whom have found posts. A large number of trainees, including those who have started work during this year, have sent repayments with regularity, which has enabled the funds to be used for new cases.

During the past year the Committee have joined the scheme initiated by the Women's Employment Federation, under which it has entered into co-operation with the following Loan Fund Societies: Women's Service, the Society for Promoting the Training of Women, the Soroptimist Club of Greater London and the Women's Employment Federation.

The Committee are constantly in touch with girls in receipt of Loans both during and after their training, and they are frequently asked to advise on the many problems which arise in connection with training and work. They will be greateful to employers who give them the opportunity of filling vacancies for trained workers. The following letters selected from many received from trainees show their appreciation of the help they have received :---

"I should be grateful if you would express to the Committee my very deep gratitude for their generous help and constant forbearance in the ten years it has taken me to repay the loans so kindly made. It would give me great pleasure to be more closely associated with the work of the Union, if that were possible, as so far I have only enjoyed the fruits of other people's work and contributed nothing."

" If I may say so, quite apart from the financial assistance, without which, of course, I could not have continued, I have felt a very definite interest in my work on the part of the Union which has been of enormous help to me during the last

eighteen months. I think you will understand what I mean when I say that these things which are impossible to estimate by figures mean very much more than can ever be repaid. This course will enable me to fulfil an ambition I have had for many years, to try and be of some small assistance to people and more particularly to my own people."

The Committee would again like to emphasise the importance of applications for loans being made some time before the applicants desire to start their training, so as to ensure, as far as possible, that the career chosen is one for which the trainee is really fitted and one in which she will find openings for work when qualified.

Fund and Hahn Bequest

Necessitous Ladies' The calls on this Fund continue to be numerous. There is little prospect of amelioration in the condition of those already on our list and their needs are

bound to increase as they advance in years. The numbers of middle-aged women thrown out of work through the present trend to employ only the young or, at any rate, those under thirty-five years of age, swells the ranks of those who need assistance. These women show the greatest courage in facing life on a tiny income which leaves no margin for anything but the bare necessities of life, and they are quite unable to meet any unexpected call on their resources. It is then that the Union can help by means of these funds to tide them over temporary difficulties and thus enable them to carry on again.

Helen Lucas It is due to the generous legacy of the late Mr. Frederick Louis Lucas that the Trustees are able Bequest

to make grants for holidays or convalescence to gentlewomen and professional women, whose means do not permit them to enjoy a much-needed rest. The scheme has the great advantage of elasticity, enabling the recipients to make their own arrangements. It is just this freedom of choice that appeals so much to those for whom the Trust is intended and that greatly enhances the benefits derived from rest and change of air.

During the past year, sixty-two grants have been made forty-three for holidays and nineteen for convalescence. Several of the recipients had not enjoyed a holiday for many years, and in other cases ladies were enabled to have that additional convalescence which made all the difference between temporary and lasting benefit.

Flatlets, In accordance with the decision announced in Petherton House last year's Report, the Union has terminated its lease of Petherton House and the Union of Jewish Women's Homes Association, Ltd., is being wound up. This property is now being administered by the owners, the United Women's Homes Association, Ltd. The Jewish tenants in residence at the time when the Union's lease came to an end are continuing their tenancy and it is anticipated that Petherton House will continue to provide a home for Jewish ladies as originally intended.

The Union records its grateful thanks to Sir Robert Waley Cohen, Lady Nathan, Miss Halford, Lady Spielman, Miss O. de Pass, Mrs. Daniel Barnard and Mrs. Alexander Cohen for having generously given their Loan Stock to the Association and also to those who generously made donations in 1927 to enable the Union to initiate the scheme.

It is with regret that the Union records the close of its direct connection with Petherton House, but it will always be mindful of the interests of the tenants and assist them as far as it can in any difficulty that may arise.

Employment In common with all agencies trying to find posts
 Bureau for women, the Employment Bureau is faced with great difficulty in placing women over thirty-five years of age. Reluctance to employ older women has increased very noticeably during the year, and though the revival in industry generally has created a great demand for the young worker, no corresponding openings have been found for older women workers especially when they are untrained.

The Committee would be grateful if employers would inform them of vacancies, especially those for which older women might be considered. **Overseas** The Committee have been glad to welcome a number of visitors from overseas and to be able to put them

in touch with the various activities in which they were interested. They are always glad to have the opportunity of hearing at first hand what women are doing in other countries.

Mrs. Hoster's Several applications have been received for the scholarship which Mrs. Hoster generously grants on the recommendation of the Union for secretarial training at her college and a student is now training.

Applications for this scholarship are considered by the Committee up to the end of May each year. The training starts at the end of August and finishes in the following April. The scholarship does not carry a grant for maintenance but covers all the college fees and books.

Finance The Union takes this opportunity of thanking Mrs.

Adolph Tanburn for her kindness in lending her house for a Bridge Tournament which realised £205 12s. 6d. This result was largely owing to Mrs. Tanburn's personal efforts and, at her especial desire, £75 of the amount raised was allocated to the Necessitous Ladies' Fund and the balance to the funds of the Union. The Treasurer and the Committee acknowledge with gratitude the receipt of legacies from Miss Ella Mocatta of $\pounds 50$, Miss S. Abrahams of $\pounds 20$, Mrs. C. Q. Henriques, J.P., of $\pounds 25$ to the General Funds and David A. Romain, Esq. of $\pounds 18$ for the Necessitous Ladies' Fund.

In order adequately to carry on the work, a larger regular income is needed. It is hoped that new subscribers will come forward so that the Union may be made more representative and its finances placed on a more satisfactory basis.


