

In 21<sup>st</sup> Richard 2<sup>nd</sup> there was a  
"Confirmation of Liberties" of which  
C VI runs thus "The King hath  
ordained . . . . that the issue male  
of such persons as are attainted  
shall not come to the Parliaments,  
nor to the Councils of the King,  
nor of his heirs; saving always  
that the issue female of the  
said persons attainted & their  
issue, who have change fathers,  
shall not be indamaged by  
this Statute .

"Change fathers" means not in  
lineal descent - from the traitor.  
There is no reference to "female"  
in margin or in Index.
