MEMORIAL LOAN TRAINING FUNDS.

THROUGH the help of the Memorial Loan Training Funds, under the administration of the Committee of the Society for Promoting the Employment of Women, 701 educated girls and women have been able to procure systematic professional or technical training during the last twenty-eight years.

^{*} The interest on £1,000 of Miss Harker Smith's legacy to the Society of £3,000 was awarded by the Committee to this Fund, until owing to the falling off of the subscriptions during the war they were obliged to reclaim that interest for general expenses.

BY-LAWS OR RULES.

- 1. The Society is formed for promoting the Training of Women, and their employment in industrial pursuits.
- 2. Every person who pays an Annual Subscription of Ten Shillings, or a Donation of Five Pounds, is a Member of the Society. The Annual Subscription is due after the 31st of March in each year.
- 3. Subscriptions and Donations in aid of Special Objects undertaken by the Society are received.
- 4. The Society has a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and a Secretary.
- 5. The Society is governed by a General Committee, consisting of not less than fifteen nor more than thirty ladies and gentlemen, elected annually by the Members at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Society.
 - 6. The Committee meet bi-monthly.
- 7. The General Committee appoint from their Members such Sub-Committees as they think fit for the conduct of the business of the Society. No one can be elected a Member of a Sub-Committee who has not attended at least one Meeting of the General Committee.
- 8. The Funds of the Society are kept in the name of the Society at a bank, all sums are paid into the bank, and all cheques are drawn by order of the Committee, and are signed by the Treasurer and one Member of the Committee, or by two Members of the Committee, and in either case countersigned by the Secretary.
- 9. The accounts of the Society are made up to the 31st of March in each year, and, after being duly audited, are appended to the Annual Report of the General Committee.
- 10. At all meetings of the General Committee or Sub-Committee the Chairman has a vote, and if the votes be equal he has also a casting vote.
- 11. For Meetings of the General Committee five Members, and for Sub-Committees three Members, to form a quorum.

BY-LAWS OR RULES

ANNUAL REPORT.

Society's moting the Employment of Women have pleasure in presenting a brief report of the work done by the Society during the year ending March 31, 1922.

There has been a great increase in the number of applications for loans, both for training fees, and maintenance whilst training. Parents and daughters alike realize more keenly than ever the absolute necessity of specialized training, and the Committee desire to repeat what they have said in a former report—their work could be very greatly extended if they had larger funds at their disposal. Once more they appeal for donations and subscriptions to their Loan Training Funds.

*Society's times during the year. Forty-two applications have been received and considered; eight of these were either unsuitable, or the applicants subsequently withdrew. Thirty-four applications were granted for the following trainings:—

The grantees from all the Funds are included in this list. The loans granted from the Loan Training Funds have amounted to £829 19s. 4d. Nineteen grantees have completed their repayments, amounting to £716 3s. 6d.

The War Fund has been of inestimable value in meeting the claims of applicants affected by the War. From this Fund the Committee have been able to make gifts and loans amounting to £850 12s., and in the majority of cases maintenance help has been included. The repayments of grantees from this Fund amount to £56 4s. 5d.

Letters received from the grantees when the final instalment of the loan is sent show how much the help is appreciated. The Committee think the following are worth quoting:—

(a) (Dentist): "I wish to thank your Committee very sincerely for the great assistance this loan was to me at a time when my prospects were jeopardized, and particularly for the generous facilities allowed me to repay

it." (This grantee gave a donation of £10 to the Society.)

- (b) (Teacher of Shorthand, &c., in South Africa): "I must thank you again for the help you have given me. I think the Loan Fund institution an excellent one, and I am sure there are many like myself who have cause to be grateful that it exists."
- (c) (Nurse): "I should like again to express my most sincere thanks and gratitude for your great kindness during the last few years, and also my regrets that it has been so long a period." (The writer served in Serbia during the war, and was for a long time afterwards in bad health.)
- (d) (Dispenser): "I wanted to express my sincere thanks to your Committee for the kind help given me when I was in difficulties. I am working here as a dispenser, and have been with the doctor nearly three years; . . . if you had not helped me I could not have finished my studies and taken the examination."
- (e) (Nursery Nurse): "I am very, very grateful to your Committee for the help which enabled me to take the course of training at the Nursery Training School, and, I hope, will enable me one day to realize my ambition, which is to take up some public work in connection with the welfare of little children."
- (f) (Elementary School Teacher): I herewith enclose the last instalment of the loan together with £1 as a gift to the funds of the Society. I thank the Committee very much for all their help."

The Committee would like to draw attention to the fact that the donations this year to the Society's funds are from three of their former Grantees!

The Committee are pleased to report that Lady

Barbara Seymour and Mrs. Charles Booth have joined them during the year.

Owing to circumstances at present exist-Society's ing which have affected the financial position Financial Position. of many societies, and in which this Society must also be included—the Committee regret to state that the annual subscriptions have fallen off considerably, showing a reduction over last year of £53. New subscribers are needed, and the Committee would like to feel that a wider and more tangible interest was taken in the useful work done by the Society. They would also like to point out that the Society was the pioneer in starting the Loan Training Funds for women in London, and for that reason alone deserves a larger measure of support.
