If this be not passed, Mr. Ward will move:

"That in the case of resolutions of a highly controversial character, it shall be possible for not less than five branches & five affiliated

of veto on their adoption  
by the National Council,  
this veto to mean that they  
may be discussed, but  
not voted upon. Notice  
of the exercise of this power  
must be given not less  
than one month before  
the meeting of the  
National Council. "
