Dear Sir,

You will no doubt have read in "Votes for Women" that the W.S.P.U. are holding a Mass Meeting in the Albert Hall, London, on Thursday November 16th. and that Mrs Pethick Lawrence, their Treasurer, will be in the chair.

It is the hope of my Committee that the M.F.U. will make a substantial donation towards the collection on that night, and that this gift should be subscribed by members and men friends only.
