Sixteenth Annual Report, 1939-40

THE COMMITTEE is glad to report that in spite of the manifold difficulties created by the war, the Clinic has been able to carry on its work, at least to the extent of the decreased demand.

As was to be expected there has been a considerable decrease in the number of attendances at North Kensington owing to the inability of many of the patients to travel long distances. On the other hand attendances at the branch clinics at Edgware, Hayes, and Hounslow, which are situated near the patients' work or homes, have been well maintained.

Subscribers will notice from the accounts that the liquid assets of the Clinic during the year under review have been increased by about f_{200} . The Committee is confident that subscribers will regard this fact, not as an occasion for reducing their subscriptions, but as an encouragement to continue them. If after the outbreak of war the Committee had continued to run the clinic on the pre-war scale and had thereby seriously diminished the clinic's resources, subscribers might well feel that the clinic was being ruined by the war and that the sooner they discontinued their subscriptions the better. Fortunately, however, the Committee has been able to arrange things otherwise. Expenditure has been reduced without involving any failure to meet the demands which are made upon the clinic by its patients. These demands are fewer as a result of evacuation and the black-out. The Committee, moreover, is carefully considering a new form of expenditure designed to meet the special war situation. Details of the scheme have not yet been worked out; but it involves bringing the Clinic's services to those who in normal times might be its patients but being in distant reception areas are unable to obtain the gynæcological treatment which they need.
