

Fellows

Council exercised the powers allotted to them under the Articles of Association to elect 26 Ordinary Members to be Fellows of the Society. The agreed procedure for the election of Fellows is that any application of a suitable member is to be supported by four Fellows. The Council in exercising its powers as above has now created a body of Fellows who will be able to support further applications for Fellowship.

Legal Advice

The Society continues to be greatly indebted to Mr. Parker Morris for his valued assistance in legal questions affecting the Society and its members and for his kind guidance and interest in many ways.

Annual General Meeting.

The Statutory Meeting (First General Meeting) of the Society of Women Housing Managers (Incorporated) was held at the London School of Economics, London, W.C.2, on 6th November, 1937, there being 101 Ordinary Members, Honorary Members and Associates present. In addition to business matters the meeting discussed questions relating to training and to the expansion of the Society's work abroad. At a discussion meeting held later in the evening, at which students of the Society were also present, a debate took place on the motion "that housing matters should be outside politics, and that a Central Board should be set up to deal with the development and administration of all housing matters."

Annual **Provincial**

The Annual Provincial Conference, which was held at Granville Court, Hornsea, during the week-end, 21st and 22nd May, was a successful experiment in combining a business conference with a seaside week-end. No lecture or visit to housing estates was arranged on this occasion, and the two meetings were confined to business matters and the discussion of questions of general interest to members.

Housing of One-Person Families

The Society has continued to assist in the movement to provide suitable housing accommodation for the one-person family, particularly for the poorly paid woman worker living alone, by co-operating in the work of the Over Thirty Housing Association and in other ways. The Association hopes shortly to begin building a block of 18 flats, on a site provided by the Lambeth Housing Movement, for women whose income does not exceed £2 weekly. The Society also sponsored a resolution on the subject of "Housing the One-Person Family" at the Representative Council Meeting of the National Council of Women.

Propaganda.

Endeavours have been made during the year to remove misconceptions concerning Octavia Hill work and also to bring that work to the notice of municipal authorities who have not adopted Octavia Hill management. In dealing with the first point letters were sent to the principal women's organisations, drawing their attention to the distinction between the work of women housing visitors and that of housing managers trained on Octavia Hill lines. As a result, several useful meetings have been arranged and the subject is receiving valuable publicity. About 400 local authorities were sent a copy of the revised

pamphlet "Housing Estate Management by Women", together with a letter laying before them the principles of Octavia Hill management.

This has been a highly successful year as regards appointments, Appointments. the total number of which amounted to 46, including 17 new appointments. The corresponding figures for last year were 30 and 11 respectively. Seven additional local authorities and two additional housing associations appointed Octavia Hill managers during the year. It is of special interest to note that two of the additional municipal appointments were in South Africa and one in Scotland, thus affording welcome evidence of the expansion of Octavia Hill work in new areas.

Overseas

This year has seen a welcome extension of Octavia Hill work in South Africa. In Capetown Miss Hurst was succeeded by Miss Crickmay and new appointments in East London and Johannesburg were taken up by Miss Gold and Miss Miskin respectively. Detailed enquiries have continued to be received from Australia and Miss Ratcliffe's visit to that country will, it is hoped, prove of value both to the organisations there who are interested in housing and to the Society. Visitors from abroad continue to be numerous, especially during the summer months and the thanks of the Society are due to the managers both in London and in the provinces who afforded these visitors facilities for the discussion of Octavia Hill methods and for seeing the work of their estates.

This year has again seen an unusually small number of students coming forward for training and the result has been a considerable reduction of income in that respect. It is hoped that in the coming year the Society will have a much larger number of students and that in this way the deficit on this year's balance sheet may be adjusted. Until the Society's membership is considerably increased and the income from subscriptions constitutes a much larger proportion of the Society's income, the annual fluctuation in training fees is bound to have a disturbing effect. In this connection it is encouraging to note that this year for the first time the income from subscriptions exceeds the income from training fees and that during the six years of the Society's existence subscriptions have risen from £233 to £436.

The total sum received from members towards Incorporation was £101. 18. 6 and the expenses amounted to £92. 15. 2. It is satisfactory to be able to report that the whole cost of Incorporation was thus met out of the special levy and at the Annual Provincial Conference at Hornsea it was decided to hand over the balance of £9. 3. 4 to the Society's general funds. Now that the Society is incorporated, it is possible for securities to be held in the Society's own name and during the year all necessary transfers of securities have been made. Our grateful thanks are due to those who have acted as Trustees for the Society in the past.

The addition of a third room to the Society's office has necessitated a further expenditure of £11. 1. 4 on office equipment. This figure would have been higher, had not an anonymous and very welcome gift of furniture been made by one of our members, whom we take this opportunity of thanking. A sum of £6. 9. 6 has been spent on the Students' Library.

The Society's thanks are again due to many members who have foregone all or part of their travelling or postal expenses. Many of these members incur very heavy expenses in attending Council and Committee meetings and their generosity in foregoing them is much appreciated. The Society has again received a number of welcome donations and takes this opportunity of expressing its gratitude to the following:—
